Striking mountains, bright blue icebergs breaking off from glaciers and golden grasslands (pampas) that are home to unique wildlife make Patagonia a special place to visit: travel to the end of the world to experience a destination that is unfamiliar, unparalleled and exceptional.

Start your trip in Santiago. The capital of Chile is nestled next to the Andes Mountains and offers old-fashioned neighbourhoods where Spanish Colonial influences mix with indigenous flavours, boasting unique flavours and welcoming culture.

Fly into quaint Puerto Natales, the hub for those exploring the famed Torres del Paine National Park, in Chile's Patagonia region. Some of its most iconic sites are the three granite towers from which the park takes its name and the horn-shaped peaks called Cuernos del Paine. You may see condors, rheas, pumas, guanacos, red foxes and other Patagonian wildlife. Next head to Argentina by land to El Calafate village, home to the massive Perito Moreno Glacier, whose ever-shifting icy landscape is one of the most visited glaciers in the world. Standing before its 70-m high electric blue face and watching 100-tonne blocks of ice crumble and crash into the waters below is humbling. The Perito Moreno

Glacier is more than 30 km long and 5 km wide at the face. From Perito Moreno, cross the Boca del Diablo to the Upsala Canal and navigate between large icebergs that emerge from the front of the Upsala Glacier.



Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Santiago de Chile

Today you'll depart from Australia (or New Zealand) for Santiago de Chile. Bienvenido (welcome) to Chile! Upon arrival in Santiago, you'll meet your tour representative and be transferred to the hotel.

Santiago is the capital and largest city of Chile. The city combines colonial and European architecture with a distinctive style that invites thousands of visitors to explore its streets full of museums, stores, and world-class restaurants. Santiago is one of the most vibrant and cosmopolitan cities in Latin America.

Please note: Due to flight scheduling and availability, some departures may occur on day 0. Affected customers must be at the airport the night before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation which you will receive 4-6 weeks prior to departure.

Day 2 Santiago de Chile City Tour & Tasting

This morning, after breakfast, embark on a tour of Santiago, discovering the city's past and present. Heading to one of the city's most famous landmarks, San Cristobal Hill by cable car, you will be rewarded with panoramic views of the city. From here, you'll be able to distinguish the different areas and character of its neighbourhoods. Afterwards, venture to the core of the city, visiting the historical district, once the site of indigenous ancestors to Spanish conquerors and now a bustling centre.

Then it's onto Santiago's most historic and traditional neighbourhood, Yungay, often described as one of the most attractive neighbourhoods in the world, with its preserved architecture of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. We'll also explore the neighbourhood of Lastarria, which is fast becoming one of Santiago's trendiest neighbourhoods with top restaurants, bars, cafes, boutiques and parks. During this tour you will have the opportunity to sample traditional Chilean food and drinks along the way, including the quintessential spirit - pisco. Salud! (Cheers!)

Day 3 Santiago de Chile Free Day

Today you'll have the day at leisure to explore this vibrant city or alternatively, you can choose to participate in an optional tour.

Optional Tour: Maipo Valley Wine Tour

You will depart from your hotel in Santiago and head to the historic Cousiño Macul vineyard, founded in 1856 and still owned by the founding family. During your visit, you will explore the vineyards and the centuries-old wineries where wine was processed in the early 19th century. The tour includes a visit to the cellars where their most prestigious wines are produced and an overview of the vineyard's new sustainable practices. The guided tour lasts for 1 hour and concludes with a tasting of three wines.

Next, you will visit Santa Rita Vineyard, established in 1880 by Domingo Fernández Concha, who introduced fine French vines that helped build the vineyard's global reputation. The classic tour includes a guided visit through the variety garden, vineyards, and the facilities where the wine production, ageing, and bottling processes take place. You'll also explore the historic "Bodega de los 120 Patriotas" and hear the compelling story behind its name. This tour lasts 1 hour and includes a tasting of one reserve wine and two grand reserve wines, along with a cut glass as a souvenir.

After the vineyard visits and wine tastings, you will return to your hotel. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 4 Santiago de Chile - Puerto Natales

Today, at the appropriate time, you will be transferred to the airport in preparation for your flight to Puerto Natales. Once arrived in Puerto Natales you will be met by a tour representative and transferred to the hotel where you will enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Puerto Natales is a city in Chilean Patagonia, located 247 kilometres northwest of Punta Arenas and the primary transit point for travellers heading to Torres del Paine National Park. Originally it was inhabited by the Kawésqar and the Tehuelche tribes, followed by European settlements and later by Chilean people, all attracted by the sheep farming industry. Nowadays it is an important tourism hub and known for its world-class gastronomy.

Day 5 Torres del Paine National Park

Today's activity is a full-day trek to explore the stunning landscapes of Torres del Paine National Park including the Milodón Cave, wildlife, waterfalls and icebergs over Grey Lake. As an alternative, you have the opportunity to participate in a full-day trek to Las Torres Base. Select this alternative option at checkout to get a close-up view of the three iconic granite towers and the milky-green lake at the base.

Activity: Full-Day Trekking to Milodón Cave and the Torres del Paine National Park

Tour Duration: 10 hours

Walking Distance: Approximately 300 metres (most of the walking of this tour is done at Grey Lake sector)

Walking Difficulty: Low

This morning set off on a full-day tour to discover Milodón Cave and the Torres del Paine National Park. First visit Cueva del Milodón, the monument is situated along the flanks of Cerro Benitez. It comprises several caves and a rock formation called Silla del Diablo (Devil's Chair). The monument includes a cave which is notable for the discovery in 1895 of skin, bones and other parts of a ground sloth called Mylodon darwinii, from which the cave takes its name.

Continuing on the Torres del Paine through the Laguna Amarga section, on route you can observe the beautiful landscape featuring lagoons and mountain ranges including the Nordenskjold and Pehoé Lakes. Keep an eye out for guanacos, which is a non-domesticated alpaca, and rheas which is similar to an African ostrich and are native to the area. Stop at Salto Grande waterfall, the largest waterfall in the Torres del Paine, before continuing to the Pehoé section for a buffet lunch, consisting of soup, salad, main course, dessert and natural juice. After lunch the tour continues towards the Grey Glacier sector, where there will be a stop of approximately 45 minutes to enjoy some soft trekking between a Lenga forest and getting to see some icebergs over the Grey Lake. On the return trip, leave the park through Laguna Amarga or Serrano sector. Red foxes and condors usually accompany the beautiful panoramic views of the Paine massif.

Arrival back in Puerto Natales is expected around 19:00.

Torres del Paine National Park, in Chilean Patagonia, is known for its spectacular hiking trails, but the most iconic hike is to Mirador las Torres, a lookout at the base of the park's three distinctive granite peaks. Known as Torres del Paine, or the "blue towers", these rocky peaks overlook a dazzling turquoise lake nestled in a mountainous valley. Leave Puerto Natales and head north towards the Torres del Paine National Park. There is a 2-hour trip to reach the starting point of the hike, on the way keep a look out for guanacos, grey foxes, rheas, flamingos and condors. First, your guide will give a short presentation, and then you will begin with a gentle trek on the trail that will take you to an old bridge that crosses the Asencio River. Walking through dense beech forests, stop to admire various waterfalls and hanging glaciers. After about 3 hours, start to ascend a steep moraine towards the highest observation point at 900 m above sea level. Here you will be rewarded with a close-up view of massive granite towers (2,850m high) and the milky-green lake at the base. This is a truly memorable sight, well worth the hike and this unforgettable moment will last many years in the future. Here enjoy a boxed lunch and rest before returning on the same trail until reaching the starting point.

Day 6 Puerto Natales Free Day

Today, you can take the opportunity to rest up and discover Puerto Natales and its surroundings, or alternatively, you can choose an optional tour.

Optional Tour: Sailing Balmaceda & Serrano Glaciers

Total Duration: 10-12 hours

Available From: 1 September to 30 April

In the morning, you will be transferred from the hotel to the pier in Puerto Bories, where you will board the boat and set sail toward the Balmaceda and Serrano Glaciers. On the journey, you'll witness beautiful mountains, waterfalls, ranches and Patagonian bird life. Passing by the Balmaceda glacier and

stopping at a small pier to begin a gentle hike through the lush forest of Coigües and Ñirres to the foot of the Serrano glacier. Afterwards, board the boat in preparation for the return trip to Puerto Natales. On the way, you will enjoy a whisky aperitif with ancient glacier ice before stopping at Perales Tourist Farm for lunch. Here, enjoy a traditional-style lunch of grilled lamb with boiled potatoes (including grilled chicken), a glass of wine or soft drink, salad, and dessert (vegetarian option available). Afterwards, continue sailing to Puerto Bories, where you will disembark and be transferred back to the hotel. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 7 Puerto Natales, Chile - El Calafate, Argentina

Today, drive approximately 5 hours to El Calafate. El Calafate is a town near the edge of the Southern Patagonian Ice Field in the Argentine province of Santa Cruz. It's mainly known as the gateway to Los Glaciares National Park, home to the massive Perito Moreno Glacier, whose ever-shifting icy landscape is one of the most visited glaciers in the world. The name is derived from a little bush with yellow flowers and dark blue berries that are very common in Patagonia.

Once you arrive at the hotel, you can choose to enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure or participate in an optional tour.

Optional Tour: Nativo Experience Lakes & Caves

The Argentino Lake is the third biggest lake in South America. Surrounded by mountains and fed by giant glaciers, this lake astonishes local and foreign visitors with its immensity and special colour. It was exactly this light blue colour, the mountains covered in white and the light blue sky that motivated Francisco P. Moreno to name it "Argentino". This is a 3-hour tour that offers an anthropological and historical approach to the passage of man in the El Calafate area, rediscovering the experiences of the first expeditions ventured into the unknown by the Santa Cruz River. The tour focuses on the history of the early explorers' contact with the Tehuelches (native Indians), crossing cliffs overlooking the lake on 4x4 vehicles and marvelling at views of the environment. Enjoy dinner inside a cave while enjoying a unique experience in a totally natural setting. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 8 El Calafate - Perito Moreno Glacier, Los Glaciares National Park

Total Duration: 8 hours

Walking Distance: The catwalks are divided into 3 circuits. Guests can stop, rest and agree on a meeting point, a tour does not necessarily mean walking the entire balcony's path.

- Central Balconies: 600 metres (including 1st balcony, 2nd balcony and Northern balcony)
- Lower Balcony: 1,100 metres (including Lower balcony)
- Coast's Balcony: 1.117 metres (from the parking area up to the Northern balcony)

Walking Difficulty: Easy, stairs involved but gentle slopes.

Recommended Packing List: Warm clothes, raincoat jacket, waterproof trousers, hiking boots, sunglasses, sunscreen, gloves, hat and backpack.

Today you are heading to Perito Moreno Glacier in the Los Glaciares National Park. On the way you will be treated to a history of the Argentino Lake on the right and its shallowest part, Redonda Bay (Rounded Bay), populated by a large variety of birds, like black-necked swans, flamingos, steamer ducks, coots and Magellan gooses surrounded by yellow fields of "coirones", a typical grass in Patagonia. Continuing on you will be treated to the timberline formed by "high deciduous beech" trees, white oak trees, "low deciduous beech" trees and some cinnamon trees. Flowers of several colours can be appreciated too, the "fire bush", which stands out the most due to its deep red colour. All of them are typical Andean-Patagonian Forest species.

Perito Moreno Glacier is one of the most famous and aweinspiring of Argentina's natural wonders. Standing before its 70-metre-high electric blue face and watching 100-tonne blocks

of ice crumble and crash into the waters below is truly humbling. The Perito Moreno Glacier is over 30 kilometres in length and 5 kilometres wide at the face.

Scattered with boardwalks and viewing platforms along the glacier perimeter, you'll get close enough to the action to hear ruptures of ice collapsing into the water. Whilst there are many glaciers in Argentina, Perito Moreno Glacier is by far the most spectacular and unique. The route of the visit will be closely related to weather conditions and participants' willingness and physical conditions; the available time to walk through and visit the catwalks is 1 to 3 hours. The excursion is usually organised as a full-day program. The visit makes it possible to have different viewpoints of the glacier and enough time for lunch (boxed lunch provided).

Box lunch menu choices will be asked to be picked at least 3 days in advance.

Optional Tour: Safari Boat at Perito Moreno Glacier

This tour is a voyage of one hour by the Rico branch of Argentino Lake in order to appreciate the majestic south wall of the Perito Moreno Glacier. This glacier ice wall is about 60 metres high and 100 metres below lake level. The boat comes about 200m from where the glacier touches the Magallanes Peninsula and then goes at length (about 3km) south allowing you to enjoy the landslides that occur daily and the magical beauty of its seracs, cracks and intense blue. This service is carried out with the boat Yagan, with a capacity for 110 passengers. Boarding takes place

at the port on the Bay "Under the Shadow", about 7 kilometres before the glacier viewpoint. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 9 Todo Glaciares

Total Duration: 9 hours

Walking Difficulty: Low

Recommended Packing List: Warm clothes, raincoat jacket, waterproof trousers, hiking boots, sunglasses, sunscreen, gloves, hat and backpack.

On this full-day tour, you will have the opportunity to get up close to two of the most significant glaciers: Upsala and Spegazzini. In addition, you will see the most spectacular Patagonian scenery. From the hotel, head to Puerto Bandera Port where you'll board the boat, travelling up the North Arm of Lake Argentino. Cross the Boca del Diablo to the Upsala Canal and navigate between large icebergs that emerge from the front of the Upsala Glacier. Sail through the Spegazzini Channel and moments later, enjoy the first view of the Dry Glacier. Continue sailing to the front of the Spegazzini Glacier to contemplate the Heim Sur and Peineta glaciers.

Disembark in The Spegazzini Base to begin walking through from the forest path to the Spegazzini Refuge. Stop for some viewpoints overlooking the entire Bay of Los Glaciers. In the refuge, you can stop for a sit-down lunch (additional charge), visit the shop or just contemplate the landscape.

For those who like to walk, they can take the mountain path. This tour is of medium difficulty trekking through a wooded road, with natural viewpoints, full of incredible views that end at the landing point. The forest trail covers 300 metres from the point of disembarking up to the Spegazzini Shelter. During this walk, there will be stops in different stations (glaciology - history - flora and fauna) and have access to different viewpoints. This is an easy path, which offers no complexity. A boxed lunch will be provided as part of this day tour.

Afterwards, you will be returned to the hotel to enjoy the evening at leisure. The itinerary is liable to change according to weather and sailing conditions for the day.

Day 10 El Calafate Free Day

Today you will have the day at leisure to explore the small, vibrant town of El Calafate. Alternatively you can choose to participate in an optional tour.

Optional Tour: El Chalten Full Day Tour

Tour Duration: 13 hours (the distance from El Calafate to El Chalten is 3 hours each way).

Pick-up Time: Approximately 07:30

Walking Distance: A guided hike to the Mirador de los Cóndores,

(approximately 1.5 - 2 hours) and Chorrillo del Salto

(approximately 1.5 - 2 hours)

Walking Difficulty: These are considered easy walks.

Recommended Packing List: Warm clothes, raincoat jacket, waterproof trousers, hiking boots, sunglasses, sunscreen, gloves, hat and backpack.

Embark on an adventure early in the morning and head towards the legendary Route 40. This route skirts the Argentino Lake, crosses the Santa Cruz and La Leona Rivers and arrives, after 1.15 hours at the Parador La Leona (almost a museum of Route 40). Later, you'll continue along Lake Viedma, having the Andes in the background and, before reaching El Chalten, you'll stop to enjoy the beautiful views of the Viedma Lake and Glacier, and the Andes in the background with the emblematic Mount Fitz Roy and Mount Torre.

After 3 hours and 220 kilometres travelled, you will arrive at the mountain village of El Chalten. Your day starts with a guided hike to the Mirador de los Cóndores, a scenic viewpoint that offers a perfect introduction to the area's majestic surroundings. Then, a break to enjoy a tasty packed lunch—essential fuel for the second half of the day. In the afternoon, the trail leads to Chorrillo del Salto, a hidden waterfall framed by forest and mountains, leaving visitors with an unforgettable image to take home.

Today's activity is a full-day trek to explore the stunning landscapes of Torres del Paine National Park including the Milodón Cave, wildlife, waterfalls and icebergs over Grey Lake. Select this alternative option at checkout to get a close-up view of the three iconic granite towers and the milky-green lake at the base.

which is notable for the discovery in 1895 of skin, bones and other parts of a ground sloth called Mylodon darwinii, from which the cave takes its name.

Continuing on the Torres del Paine through the Laguna Amarga section, on route you can observe the beautiful landscape featuring lagoons and mountain ranges including the Nordenskjold and Pehoé Lakes. Keep an eye out for guanacos, which is a non-domesticated alpaca, and rheas which is similar to an African ostrich and are native to the area. Stop at Salto Grande waterfall, the largest waterfall in the Torres del Paine, before continuing to the Pehoé section for a buffet lunch, consisting of soup, salad, main course, dessert and natural juice. After lunch the tour continues towards the Grey Glacier sector, where there will be a stop of approximately 45 minutes to enjoy some soft trekking between a Lenga forest and getting to see some icebergs over the Grey Lake. On the return trip, leave the park through Laguna Amarga or Serrano sector. Red foxes and condors usually accompany the beautiful panoramic views of the Paine massif.

Arrival back in Puerto Natales is expected around 19:00.

Torres del Paine National Park, in Chilean Patagonia, is known for its spectacular hiking trails, but the most iconic hike is to Mirador las Torres, a lookout at the base of the park's three distinctive granite peaks. Known as Torres del Paine, or the "blue towers", these rocky peaks overlook a dazzling turquoise lake nestled in a mountainous valley. Leave Puerto Natales and head north towards the Torres del Paine National Park. There is a 2-hour trip to reach the starting point of the hike, on the way keep a look out for guanacos, grey foxes, rheas, flamingos and condors. First, your guide will give a short presentation, and then you will begin with a gentle trek on the trail that will take you to an old bridge that crosses the Asencio River. Walking through dense beech forests, stop to admire various waterfalls and hanging glaciers. After about 3 hours, start to ascend a steep moraine towards the highest observation point at 900 m above sea level. Here you will be rewarded with a close-up view of massive granite towers (2,850m high) and the milky-green lake at the base. This is a truly

Continuing on you will be treated to the timberline formed by "high deciduous beech" trees, white oak trees, "low deciduous beech" trees and some cinnamon trees. Flowers of several colours can be appreciated too, the "fire bush", which stands out the most due to its deep red colour. All of them are typical Andean-Patagonian Forest species.

Perito Moreno Glacier is one of the most famous and aweinspiring of Argentina's natural wonders. Standing before its 70-metre-high electric blue face and watching 100-tonne blocks of ice crumble and crash into the waters below is truly humbling. The Perito Moreno Glacier is over 30 kilometres in length and 5 kilometres wide at the face.

Scattered with boardwalks and viewing platforms along the glacier perimeter, you'll get close enough to the action to hear ruptures of ice collapsing into the water. Whilst there are many glaciers in Argentina, Perito Moreno Glacier is by far the most spectacular and unique. The route of the visit will be closely related to weather conditions and participants' willingness and physical conditions; the available time to walk through and visit the catwalks is 1 to 3 hours. The excursion is usually organised as a full-day program. The visit makes it possible to have different viewpoints of the glacier and enough time for lunch (boxed lunch provided).

Optional Tour: Safari Boat at Perito Moreno Glacier

The boat comes about 200m from where the glacier touches the Magallanes Peninsula and then goes at length (about 3km) south allowing you to enjoy the landslides that occur daily and the magical beauty of its seracs, cracks and intense blue. Disembark in The Spegazzini Base to begin walking through from the forest path to the Spegazzini Refuge. Stop for some viewpoints overlooking the entire Bay of Los Glaciers. In the refuge, you can stop for a sit-down lunch (additional charge), visit the shop or just contemplate the landscape.

Physical ability: Active (please refer to the Other Important Information section for a description).

You will be picked up early (approximately 06:00). Board the train for a 1.5-hour scenic ride to a point known as Kilometre 104 to start your short Inca Trail trek. From here, you will hike for approximately four hours to the Inca site of Wiñay Wayna ("Forever Young"), approximately 2,680 metres above sea level. Built on a steep hillside overlooking the Urubamba River, this archaeological site has ten baths and numerous Inca buildings displaying high levels of Inca masonry. Wiñay Wayna was discovered almost 30 years after the entire world knew about Machu Picchu and 40 years after Machu Picchu was first discovered. Little is known about what Wiñay Wayna was originally built for, however there are theories that it was built as a spiritual destination or resting place before reaching Machu Picchu, where elders and royalty would cleanse themselves in the baths. Others believe that the site functioned as a kind of administrative centre to keep track of the amount of produce stored on-site. After exploring Wiñay Wayna, you will continue your walk to Inti Punku (the Puerta del Sol, or The Sun's Gate). From here, you will have your first spectacular view of Machu

Itinerary 2 - Machu Picchu Extension

Picchu. This site was believed to have once been the main entrance to Machu Picchu and was dedicated to Inti, the Inca Sun God. You'll then head to Aguas Calientes where your afternoon will be spent at leisure. Current pricing details can be found in the Important Information section.

Please note: Due to the nature and duration of this tour, a moderate to active fitness level is required for participation in this supplementary trek. The route includes uneven surfaces, steep ascents and descents, a mix of stairs and dirt trails, and high-altitude conditions. The trek spans approximately 12 kilometres (6–8 hours) of walking, including stops for photos, lunch (included) and exploring. If you have any concerns about your ability to complete this trek, we recommend consulting your GP for guidance.

Day 17 Machu Picchu - Cusco

Begin the day with an early start, as you're collected from your hotel at approximately 05:40 to board the bus up to the citadel of Machu Picchu. There will be time for breakfast before your transfer this morning.

Passing through the gates of the ancient site, embark on a two-hour guided tour exploring the most iconic and remarkable areas of Machu Picchu. Highlights include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza and other significant landmarks. As you wander through this extraordinary archaeological complex, take in sweeping views of the surrounding mountains, plunging gorges, and the terraced slopes of the citadel itself.

After your guided visit, return by bus to Aguas Calientes, where you'll have time to relax and enjoy lunch (not included) before boarding the train back to Poroy. From there, continue by road to Cusco. On arrival, a tour representative will meet you at the station and transfer you to your hotel, arriving at approximately 19:00.

Day 18 Cusco City Tour

Walking through the city centre, you can see the incredible mix of Inca and colonial architecture, watch the merging of indigenous and Spanish influences, and feel the history flowing through every cobblestone street.

Cusco is located in the Peruvian Andes, at 3,399 metres above sea level. Today, you will embark on a half-day tour, visiting Cusco Cathedral, the Koricancha (Qorikancha), Sacsayhuaman and Tambomachay, giving you a deep insight into the city and its history. First, go to the wonderful Koricancha, located next to the Church of Santo Domingo. According to chroniclers, the Koricancha was the most sacred and important temple of the Inca Empire during the period immediately after the Spanish conquest. Its walls were covered in gold, and life-size statues of plants and animals, all pure gold and silver, decorated its rooms and corridors. Unfortunately, this wealth was stripped away by the Spanish conquistadors.

Itinerary 2 - Machu Picchu Extension

Afterwards, visit the Cathedral of Cusco in the Plaza de Armas (Main Square). Built between 1560 and 1654 on the foundations of an existing Inca temple, this spectacular cathedral houses many works of art from the Cusco school of painters, and its high altar and pulpit are covered in gold and silver reliefs. The next stop is the imposing Inca fortress of Sacsayhuaman (3,700 metres above sea level), which stands on a hill above Cusco. Here, you will see some of the best examples of Inca stonework and construction, including huge rocks carefully cut and fitted perfectly to form the walls. Then, visit the Qenqo Archaeological Complex (3,580 metres above sea level), considered an Inca labyrinth with an altar with ritual motifs. Then head to Tambomachay (3,765 metres above sea level). The exact purpose of this site is unknown, but it may have functioned, at least in part, as an Inca spa. After a morning of exploring, you'll have the remainder of the day at your own leisure.

Please note: Cusco is located in the Peruvian Andes at 3,399 metres above sea level, high altitude environments are classified as above 2,500m above sea level. Please consult a medical professional if you have any concerns or to find out what preventative measures are available. Please refer to the 'Other important information' section for further details.

TOUR GUIDE VS. TOUR LEADER

Tour Guide

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on the history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction where they are guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves it at the end of the tour; they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides at each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Patagonia

October - April

The weather in Patagonia is mostly mild, between lows of 4°C (39.2°F) and highs of 18°C (64.4°F). In their summer months (December to February), this is the height of their growth season, so you will definitely see landscapes full of greenery. There will be warmer days and cool nights and potentially strong winds and rains. This is generally the peak tourist season. Argentina can be hot and humid during

their summer months with potential rains. You can expect temperatures in Argentina to range from 19°C to 30°C. Southern Chile experiences temperatures of 12°C to 25°C.

The general rainy season in Patagonia is during the months of April and May, during the autumn and potentially from November to January, with less intensity. Rainy season in Chile ranges from May to August with averages of 72-90mm of rain per month, whilst in Argentina it ranges from October to March with averages of 100mm of rain per month.

Cusco, Peru

Cusco has a subtropical highland climate due to its elevation (3500m above sea level). It is generally dry and temperate, with two defined seasons. The dry season lasts from May to August, with abundant sunshine and occasional nighttime freezes. July is the coldest month with an average of 9.7°C. The wet season lasts from December to March, with night frost less common. November averages 13.3°C. Temperatures usually range from 0.2°C to 20.9°C.

Express Inca Trail Trek (Optional Activity): Active

Active/demanding are more strenuous activities, suitable for a good fitness level and for guests who exercise regularly. More fast-paced activities and walking on uneven surfaces. A high fitness level is required to undertake activities, which include high-altitude trekking for anywhere between four to seven hours per day for an extended number of days. Recommended for active travellers with some previous trekking experience.

High Altitude Sickness

Altitude sickness can occur at high elevations when the body receives less oxygen. It can affect anyone, regardless of age or fitness, with symptoms such as headache, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and shortness of breath.

Tips to help prevent altitude sickness:

- Stay well hydrated and eat light, high-carbohydrate meals.
- Avoid overexertion during the first 24–48 hours at high altitude.
- Limit alcohol and avoid smoking.
- Consult your healthcare professional about preventive medications or your suitability for travel to high-altitude areas. Local tour providers are trained in first aid, including high-altitude care, and have oxygen available for guests if needed. Medications are also readily available in

Cusco.

Please note: Inoculations may be required to enter the country visited, along with re-entry into Australia after your visit. It is your responsibility to consult with your travel doctor for up-to-date medical travel information well before departure.

Yellow Fever

A valid international certificate of vaccination against Yellow Fever is required in many countries. You may need to present this on arrival at the airport or border crossing. Some countries will refuse entry if you are unable to present your certificate. It's also common for your home country to request a Yellow Fever certificate upon arrival. Visas

New Zealand (Transiting)

If you do not hold an Australian passport you may be required to obtain a transit visa. Some flight routes make a stop in New Zealand and you may be required to obtain a transit visa to board your flight. It is the passengers' sole responsibility to seek advice on the correct visa and take appropriate action to ensure they have the correct visa prior to departure. Failure to do so may result in denied boarding and or refusal of entry to the country by the local authorities and immigration department. We strongly advise you to carefully review your flight tickets and then contact your respective consulate or a visa agency to confirm the necessary visa regulations and acceptable forms of personal identification for your transit.

Chile

As of 17th September 2025 tourist visas for Chile are not required if travelling on an Australian Passport. You can stay in Chile for up to 90 days without a visa. If you're unsure whether you need a visa, contact the nearest embassy or consulate of Chile.

Argentina

As a tourist, you can stay for up to 90 days without a visa, but you'll need:

- A return or onward ticket
- A valid passport
- Travel/medical insurance Please Note: Effective immediately, all international travellers to Argentina must hold valid travel insurance with medical coverage.

This insurance may be requested and

verified upon arrival in the country.

Argentina's public healthcare system will no longer provide free medical services to foreign nationals. It is therefore essential that you obtain appropriate insurance before your departure.

Peru

Australian tourists don't need a visa. You can get a permit to stay for up to 3 months when you arrive. If you overstay your permit, you'll have to pay a fine before leaving the country. In other situations, you'll need to apply for a visa through an embassy or consulate of Peru. Entry and exit conditions can change at short notice. You can contact the nearest embassy or consulate of Peru for the latest details. They'll tell you about visas, currency, customs and other travel requirements.

Important:

- Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.
- Visa rules may have changed since
 Covid-19. Some countries and airlines may
 require you to obtain an additional visa
 before arrival. Please check with the
 nearest embassy, consulate or immigration
 department of the destination you're
 entering.

Please note:

- Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.
- It is also important to note that some areas
 of employment, such as journalism,
 government authorities and charity
 organisations, may have additional
 restrictions in applying for visas. This may,
 in turn, affect the type of application
 required.

Travel Insurance
