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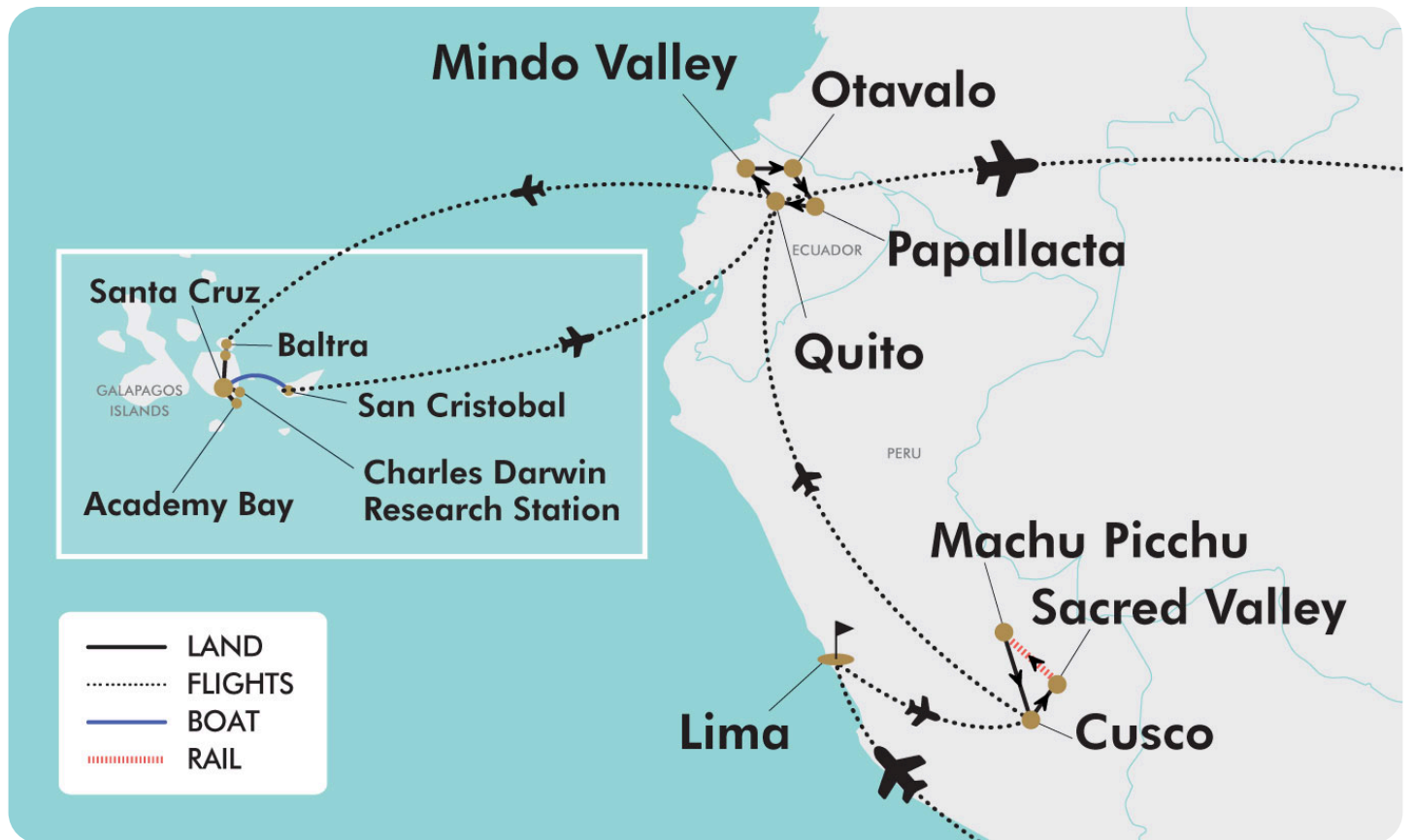

Itinerary 1

Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Lima, Peru

Today you'll depart from Australia (or New Zealand) for Lima, Peru, to start your epic adventure. Upon arrival, a tour representative will be waiting to transfer you to the hotel where you can enjoy the remainder of your day at leisure.

Please note:

- Due to flight scheduling and availability, some departures may occur on Day 0. Affected customers must be available to depart the day before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documents at least 4-6 weeks prior to departure.
- Some customers may experience an extended layover. Lounge passes may be purchased at your own expense.

Overnight: Costa Del Sol Wyndham Lima Airport or similar, Lima, Peru

Meals included: In-Flight

Day 2 Lima - Cusco - Sacred Valley

This morning you'll be transferred to the airport for your flight to Cusco, Peru. Upon arrival, you'll be met by a tour representative to drive onwards to the Sacred Valley, where you can enjoy lunch in a local restaurant (not included).

Afterwards, you'll travel to the village of Chincheros which is northwest of Cusco. This picturesque village was an important Inca centre and is known for the traditional Andean weaving techniques that are still used by its people. Wearing traditional clothes, the people of Chincheros meet in the Main Square to sell

colourful local handicrafts to visitors. Here you'll have the opportunity to learn about traditional weaving techniques and also do a bit of souvenir shopping.

You'll then travel onwards to Urubamba and check into the hotel before enjoying the remainder of the day at leisure.

Please note: For your stay in Aguas Calientes the following day, you will only be allowed to bring an overnight bag due to the luggage and space limitations on the expedition train. It is highly recommended to pre-pack a smaller bag with just the essentials needed for the overnight portion in Aguas Calientes. The remainder of your luggage will be securely kept with the tour operator in Cusco at no additional cost.

Overnight: Hotel Augusto Urubamba or similar, Urubamba, Peru
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 3 Sacred Valley - Aguas Calientes

This morning, you'll descend 1500 feet to the valley floor where you'll find yourself by the sacred Urubamba River and the village of Pisac. Here you'll enjoy a quick visit to a traditional market where you can browse and buy local souvenirs if desired. Afterwards, you'll drive to the ruins of Pisac where you can explore the extensive ruins while taking in stunning views over the beautiful valley. Enjoy a guided tour of the Citadel of Pisac where you'll see temples, homes, altars, carvings, tunnels, caves and the famous Intihuatana ritual stone.

You'll then continue back towards Urubamba where there will be a stop for lunch (not included) before a short drive onwards to Ollantaytambo which is surrounded by the sacred mountains.



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The Itinerary

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Here, you'll enjoy further exposure to Inca constructions such as the amazing temple of the sun, enormous blocks of perfectly carved rock, stone water fountains, stairs and terraces. You'll also have the chance to observe the beauty of the local people in their traditional dress.

In the afternoon, you'll transfer to Ollantaytambo Train Station (approximately 45 minutes) and board the expedition train bound for Aguas Calientes, a beautiful thermal town down the valley from the ancient citadel of Machu Picchu. The two-hour train journey is a memorable experience as you pass through river canyons and rolling hills before being met by your guide and transferred to the hotel upon arrival.

Overnight: Casa Andina Machu Picchu, Aguas Calientes, Peru
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 4 Grand Citadel Machu Picchu - Cusco

Begin the day with an early start, as you'll be collected from your hotel at approximately 05:40 to board the bus up to the citadel of Machu Picchu. There will be time for breakfast before you transfer this morning.

Passing through the gates of the ancient site, embark on a guided two-hour tour exploring the most iconic and remarkable areas of Machu Picchu. Highlights include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza and other significant landmarks. As you wander through this extraordinary archaeological complex, take in sweeping views of the surrounding mountains, plunging gorges and the terraced slopes of the citadel itself.

Return by bus to Aguas Calientes, where you'll have time to relax and enjoy lunch (not included) before boarding the train back to Poroy. From there, continue by road to Cusco. On arrival, a tour representative will meet you at the station and transfer you to your hotel, arriving at approximately 19:00.

Optional Tour: Huayna Picchu

There is time for those with enough energy to climb Wayna (Huayna) Picchu, the mountain behind Machu Picchu. For many people, climbing Huayna Picchu is one of the highlights when visiting Machu Picchu. The climb itself is interesting as you will see how the Incas cut out steps from the rocks as you wind around the side of a mountain. Day 5 Cusco Free Day

After breakfast, enjoy a day at leisure to explore Cusco, the capital city of the Inca empire that is now the undisputed archaeological capital of the Americas, as well as the continent's oldest continuously inhabited city. You can choose to relax and explore the city at your own pace or participate in an optional activity.

Optional Activity: Classic Cooking Class



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Begin your experience with a 09:30 pickup from your hotel, heading to the vibrant San Pedro Market in Cusco. Known as one of the city's most fascinating markets, it bursts with colourful stalls offering fresh produce, meats, spices, handicrafts and souvenirs.

Before entering, meet your chef guide, who will explain the flow of the tour. Together, you'll wander through the market, learning about local ingredients, shopping tips, and Andean food traditions. Along the way, you'll help select the fresh produce that will be used later in your cooking class. Meeting stallholders and hearing their stories adds to the authenticity of the experience.

After the market visit, you'll head to a local restaurant, where you'll be provided with an apron and everything needed to cook. Under the chef's guidance, you'll prepare a traditional Peruvian dish using seasonal, organic ingredients sourced from communities around Cusco. Staples such as potatoes and corn often feature, along with other highlights of Andean cuisine.

Once the cooking is complete, the group will set the table and share the delicious dishes you've prepared together. After enjoying your meal, the activity concludes with time to return to your hotel (transportation not included). Please see the current pricing in the Important Information section.

Optional Activity: Folklore Show & Dinner

At 19:00, make your way to a restaurant near Cusco's central Plaza de Armas for an unforgettable evening. Indulge in a fabulous buffet dinner featuring a wide selection of traditional dishes, including meats, fish, vegetables, and exquisite desserts.

The culinary delights are sure to please every palate. As you dine, the evening comes alive with a vibrant traditional dance show. Immerse yourself in the rich culture of the Andes with folk and classical music performed on traditional instruments like the quena, charango, flute and zampona. For an even more memorable experience, you're welcome to join the dancers on the floor and become part of the celebration. It's an enchanting way to connect with the region's culture and traditions. Day 6 Cusco, Peru - Quito, Ecuador

Today you'll be transferred to the airport for your one-way international flight via Lima to Quito, the capital of Ecuador. On arrival, you will be welcomed and transferred to the hotel. In the evening, you'll meet your tour leader in the hotel lobby for a welcome briefing. At this time, you will discuss the details and any questions you may have regarding the upcoming journey through Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands before enjoying the remainder of the evening at leisure.

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Day 7 Quito Free Day

Today is yours free at leisure to enjoy Quito, the largest, best-preserved colonial city of America which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1978. The city is considered the cultural capital of South America and is located on the equator in a valley at the foothills of the Pichincha Volcano so there's plenty to discover or you can take the opportunity to join an optional city tour (not included).

Optional Activity: Full-Day Quito City Tour

Enjoy a truly unique experience in the heart of Quito city and discover its history from a local eye as you walk around its narrow streets visiting the most iconic buildings. This includes the Golden Church, San Francisco Square and the Main Square. You'll visit Luis's local workshop "Cruz Verde", a well-known artisan whose family has prepared the local candy "colaciones" for the last 100 years. For lunch, you will have the opportunity to sit with locals and enjoy a tasty meal freshly prepared using local products and flavours. In the afternoon, you will walk on the colourful Ronda Street where you can enjoy a giant empanada before going to Panecillo Hill to enjoy a panoramic view of Quito. Optional Activity - Pichincha Volcano Cable Car

If you like heights and want a spectacular panoramic view of Quito and the snow-capped mountains that surround the city, the best option is to hop on a cable car. In a traditional cabin, you will be able to admire the whole city and the Pichincha Volcano.

After ascending to 4,000 metres above sea level, you'll enjoy walking in the open air, hiking on various trails, enjoying views of the city or climbing the Pichincha Volcano. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 8 Ecuador 'Middle of the Earth' - Pululahua Crater - Mindo

Today you'll drive north of Quito to the Ecuador monument complex before visiting the 'middle of the world' which is a must when in Ecuador. It's the place where you will be able to stand on both sides of the hemispheres, north and south at the same time and feel the neutral forces of the equator.

On the way, you'll stop for a view of the Pululahua Crater, the third-biggest inhabited volcano crater in the world with a population of more than 400 people. Then you will continue



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onwards to the little town of Mindo, a village in the Andes Mountains that's known for the many bird species, butterflies and orchids found in the surrounding cloud forest.

In the afternoon, take the opportunity to enjoy a guided tour of a chocolate factory where you will have the chance to follow the process of cocoa from harvesting the seed to the final product. Here you may also enjoy a delicious brownie or a cup of hot cocoa before transferring to the hotel and enjoy being situated in the middle of the beautiful cloud forest.

Overnight: El Septimo Paraiso or similar, Mindo, Ecuador
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 9 Mindo Cloud Forest Hike & Free Afternoon

After breakfast, you'll explore the pristine cloud forest, crossing cable cars and hiking along waterfalls during a moderate hike (approximately 20 minutes) while being surrounded by a lush green forest that's filled with toucans and colourful birds. You'll have entry into the Nambillo Waterfalls Reserve and bird sanctuary.

In the afternoon, enjoy free time to explore the several optional activities offered in this area. One of the highlights of today is also the opportunity to visit a butterfly farm that's located on a private reserve called 'Mariposas of Mindo'. Here you can watch gargantuan butterflies dry their wings after emerging from their jewel-like cocoons before dipping your fingers into a banana concoction and watching as unique butterflies land on your hands for a snack. You'll also have the opportunity to explore an orchid farm.

You can participate in whitewater tubing (several large inner tubes tied together) as your guides steer you through thrilling rapids, or try canopy zip-lining where you'll sail along one of 13 zip-lines over the beautiful canopy of the cloud forest.

Day 10 Mindo - Cotacachi Town - Otavalo

The day starts with a unique scenic drive back up to the highlands where you will reach the Pan-American Highway that travels north to the world-famous indigenous town of Otavalo. Enjoy time to stroll along the narrow cobblestone streets which are filled with Otavalo indigenous people wearing the typical blue ponchos and explore the handcraft market with its wonderful textiles, native paintings, ceramics, jewellery, tapestries and more.

In the afternoon, you'll drive to Cotacachi which was made famous for its production of amazing leather goods and its beauty as a small village. You will have free time to explore the shops or simply stop and enjoy one of the best coffees in Ecuador at the main square. Later, you'll arrive at the historical hacienda of Pinsaquí and enjoy a typical Andean cocktail as a welcome before learning about the history of Hacienda.

Overnight: Hacienda Palmeras or similar, Otavalo, Ecuador
Meals included: Breakfast



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Day 11 Otavalo - Cuicocha Crater Lake - Papallacta Hot Springs

Today, you'll start the day with a visit to Cotacachi-Cayapas Ecological Reserve to witness the breathtaking scenery of the crystalline-clear waters of this active volcano and the amazing surrounding landscapes. At the end of a short hike, enjoy a boat ride on Cuicocha Crater Lake to the centre of the crater to observe the activity of the volcano such as bubbles coming up from the centre of the caldera.

Later, you'll make your way to Pijal, a small village located in the heart of the Andes where you will have an unforgettable cultural experience as you immerse yourself in the true spirit of the South American Highlands. You'll spend time with local women from the village and learn about their lifestyle and knowledge of textiles and culinary traditions from past generations. You'll also get to help the locals prepare a delicious lunch using fresh products harvested the same day from the surrounding organic fields and share with them precious moments of conviviality.

In the late afternoon, you'll reach the luxury volcanic hot-springs resort of Papallacta where you will have the chance to relax and enjoy the facilities surrounded by views of the majestic Andean mountains.

Overnight: Papallacta Spa & Resort or similar, Papallacta, Ecuador

Meals included: Breakfast; Lunch

Day 12 Papallacta - Cotopaxi Volcano - Quito

This morning, enjoy the chance to take one last dip in the open-air hot springs before driving south on the Pan-American Highway towards one of the highest active volcanoes in the world, Cotopaxi. The snow-capped volcano is surrounded by national park and is home to abundant plant life, rich fauna and Inca ruins. You will begin at the Interpretation Centre which is at the park's entrance, before continuing across the páramo to Limpiopungo Lake. During a short walk around the lake, observe a variety of birds and enjoy the stunning views of the almost symmetrical cone of Cotopaxi.

Afterwards, you'll continue back to Quito where you will check into the hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Sheraton Quito or similar, Quito, Ecuador

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 13 Quito - Baltra - Santa Cruz Island (Galapagos Islands)

After breakfast today, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight to the Island of Baltra in the Galapagos Islands. On arrival you will be picked up and transferred to Santa Cruz, a nearby island, crossing the narrow Itabaca channel by ferry before continuing by car. Your first stop will be at the highlands of Santa Cruz, the "Parte Alta", as the highlands are called in Spanish, are very lush and home to the iconic giant Galapagos tortoises. Here you will visit a private ranch where you will enjoy lunch before heading out on a walk in search of the giant tortoises.



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During this visit, you will also visit lava tubes which are formed when the surface of a lava stream solidifies but the inside remains liquid and flows out like a river. After this tour, you will continue by private transport to the hotel where you will have a meet and greet with a local guide who will explain the following day's itinerary to you before you can enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Hotel Fiesta or similar, Puerto Ayora, Santa Cruz, Galapagos

Meals included: Breakfast; Lunch

Day 14 Academy Bay Tour

Today, after breakfast, you will enjoy a half-day tour of Academy Bay where you can swim and snorkel with sea lions and all kinds of colourful fish. Here you can also see the blue-footed boobies who are resting at the edge of the cliffs. Afterwards, you can climb to a nearby viewpoint and, if you are lucky, you'll see white-tipped reef sharks swimming in the ocean below. You'll then take a walk to 'Playa de los Perros' where many sea iguanas can often be found resting in the sun. You'll find that the enormous cacti, the red colour of the rocks and the turquoise colour of the ocean make for great photo opportunities.

Day 15 Santa Cruz - Charles Darwin Research Station - San Cristobal Island

This morning you'll visit the Charles Darwin Research Station to learn more about many of the endemic species seen in the wild, as well as the ongoing conservation and management efforts on the Galapagos Islands. In the afternoon you will be met and transferred from the hotel to the dock of Santa Cruz from where you will take a boat (approximately 2 hours) to the island of San Cristobal.

Upon arrival at the dock in San Cristobal, you will be transferred to the hotel in the town of Puerto Baquerizo Moreno. Here you will have a meet and greet with another local guide who will explain the rest of your itinerary to you before you can enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure on this stunning island.

Overnight: Hotel Galapagos Planet or similar, Puerto Baquerizo Moreno, San Cristobal, Galapagos

Meals included: Breakfast



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Day 16 Isla Lobos Tour

After breakfast this morning, you will be met and transferred to a dock where you will take a short boat ride to the nearby Isla Lobos. During this boat trip, you will observe a lot of sea life before even setting foot on the island. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided tour where you will have the chance to observe frigate birds, blue-footed boobies and sea lions that all inhabit the island. Afterwards, you will have time for swimming or snorkelling in the beautiful waters.

You'll then continue onwards to a nearby beach in San Cristobal where you may enjoy an included packed lunch and some time at leisure. The white coral beaches of San Cristobal are great for walking around, relaxing and swimming in the shallow waters before returning to Puerto Baquerizo Moreno.

Day 3 Sacred Valley - Aguas Calientes

This morning, you'll descend 1500 feet to the valley floor where you'll find yourself by the sacred Urubamba River and the village of Pisac. Here you'll enjoy a quick visit to a traditional market where you can browse and buy local souvenirs if desired.

Afterwards, you'll drive to the ruins of Pisac where you can explore the extensive ruins while taking in stunning views over the beautiful valley. Enjoy a guided tour of the Citadel of Pisac where you'll see temples, homes, altars, carvings, tunnels, caves and the famous Intihuatana ritual stone.

You'll then continue back towards Urubamba where there will be a stop for lunch (not included) before a short drive onwards to Ollantaytambo which is surrounded by the sacred mountains.



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The Itinerary

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Here, you'll enjoy further exposure to Inca constructions such as the amazing temple of the sun, enormous blocks of perfectly carved rock, stone water fountains, stairs and terraces. You'll also have the chance to observe the beauty of the local people in their traditional dress.

In the afternoon, you'll transfer to Ollantaytambo Train Station (approximately 45 minutes) and board the expedition train bound for Aguas Calientes, a beautiful thermal town down the valley from the ancient citadel of Machu Picchu. The two-hour train journey is a memorable experience as you pass through river canyons and rolling hills before being met by your guide and transferred to the hotel upon arrival.

Day 4 Grand Citadel Machu Picchu - Cusco

Begin the day with an early start, as you'll be collected from your hotel at approximately 05:40 to board the bus up to the citadel of Machu Picchu. There will be time for breakfast before your transfer this morning.

Passing through the gates of the ancient site, embark on a guided two-hour tour exploring the most iconic and remarkable areas of Machu Picchu. Highlights include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza and other significant landmarks. As you wander through this extraordinary archaeological complex, take in sweeping views of the surrounding mountains, plunging gorges and the terraced slopes of the citadel itself.

Return by bus to Aguas Calientes, where you'll have time to relax and enjoy lunch (not included) before boarding the train back to Poroy. From there, continue by road to Cusco. On arrival, a tour representative will meet you at the station and transfer you to your hotel, arriving at approximately 19:00.

Optional Tour: Huayna Picchu

There is time for those with enough energy to climb Wayna (Huayna) Picchu, the mountain behind Machu Picchu. For many people, climbing Huayna Picchu is one of the highlights when visiting Machu Picchu. The climb itself is interesting as you will see how the Incas cut out steps from the rocks as you wind around the side of a mountain. Day 5 Cusco Free Day

Optional Activity: Classic Cooking Class



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Begin your experience with a 09:30 pickup from your hotel, heading to the vibrant San Pedro Market in Cusco. Known as one of the city's most fascinating markets, it bursts with colourful stalls offering fresh produce, meats, spices, handicrafts and souvenirs.

Before entering, meet your chef guide, who will explain the flow of the tour. Together, you'll wander through the market, learning about local ingredients, shopping tips, and Andean food traditions. Along the way, you'll help select the fresh produce that will be used later in your cooking class. Meeting stallholders and hearing their stories adds to the authenticity of the experience.

After the market visit, you'll head to a local restaurant, where you'll be provided with an apron and everything needed to cook. Under the chef's guidance, you'll prepare a traditional Peruvian dish using seasonal, organic ingredients sourced from communities around Cusco. Staples such as potatoes and corn often feature, along with other highlights of Andean cuisine.

Once the cooking is complete, the group will set the table and share the delicious dishes you've prepared together. After enjoying your meal, the activity concludes with time to return to your hotel (transportation not included). Please see the current pricing in the Important Information section.

Optional Activity: Folklore Show & Dinner

This includes the Golden Church, San Francisco Square and the Main Square. You'll visit Luis's local workshop "Cruz Verde", a well-known artisan whose family has prepared the local candy "colaciones" for the last 100 years. For lunch, you will have the opportunity to sit with locals and enjoy a tasty meal freshly prepared using local products and flavours. In the afternoon, you will walk on the colourful Ronda Street where you can enjoy a giant empanada before going to Panecillo Hill to enjoy a panoramic view of Quito. You will begin at the Interpretation Centre which is at the park entrance, before continuing across the paramo to Limpiopungo Lake. During a short walk around the lake, observe a variety of birds and enjoy the stunning views of the almost symmetrical cone of Cotopaxi.



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In the late afternoon, you will reach the luxury volcanic hot springs resort of Papallacta, where you will have the chance to relax at the spa resort surrounded by the view of the majestic Andean mountains.

Day 9 Termas - Otavalo Market – Sacha Warmi Project

The day starts with a unique scenic drive up the highlands where you will reach the Pan-American Highway that travels north to the world-famous indigenous town of Otavalo. Here, admire the endless number of handicrafts from the local people. Enjoy time to stroll along the narrow cobblestone streets, which are filled with Otavalo indigenous people wearing the traditional blue ponchos. Visit their handicraft market, with its wonderful textiles, native paintings, ceramics, jewelry, tapestries and more.

Later, you will head to Pijal, a small village located in the heart of the Andes where you will have an unforgettable cultural experience as you immerse yourself in the trust spirit of the South American Highlands. You'll spend time with local women from the village and learn about their lifestyle and knowledge of textiles and culinary traditions from past generations. You'll also get to help the locals prepare a local lunch using fresh products harvested the same day from the surrounding organic fields and share with them previous moments of conviviality.

Afterwards, learn more about the weaving process of their textiles. Don't miss the amazing opportunity to have the chance to give back by buying handmade scarfs.

Day 10 Cuicocha – Mindo Cloud Forest

After breakfast, you'll explore the Cotacachi Cayapas ecological reserve to see the breathtaking scenery of the crystalline-clear waters of this active volcano and the amazing surrounding landscapes. At the end of an hour-long

hike along the rim of the Cuicocha Crater Lake, take a boat ride to the center of the crater to observe the activity of this volcano, watching bubbles coming up from the center of the caldera.

After, you will reach the little town of Mindo, nestled into the pristine cloud forest. Mindo is a village in the Andes Mountains. It's known for the many bird species, butterflies and orchids found in the surrounding cloud forest; it's a bird-lovers' paradise. This area is filled with a wide variety of plants and animal life-perfect for a nice introduction to the diversity of Ecuador. Mindo and its surrounding cloud forest are a birdwatcher's paradise, especially for hummingbirds! We will visit a chocolate distributor, where you can take a tour of the process of the cocoa, from harvesting the seed to the final product, like as a delicious brownie or a cup of real hot cocoa.

Overnight: El Septimo Paraiso or similar, Mindo, Ecuador

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Day 11 Mindo Nambillo waterfall – Optional activities

Explore the pristine cloud rain forest of Mindo, crossing cable cars and hiking along waterfalls, surrounded by a lush green forest filled with toucans, hummingbirds and colorful birds. In the afternoon, you will have some free time to enjoy the several optional outdoor activities offered in this area. You can go whitewater rafting or tubing (several large inner-tubes tied together) as our steely-nerved guides steer you through thrilling rapids. Or try a canopy zip-line (sailing along one of 13 zip-lines over the beautiful canopy of the cloud forest.) One of the highlights of today is the visit to the butterfly nursery, where we watch gargantuan butterflies dry their wings after emerging from their jewel-like cocoons. You can dip your fingers into a banana concoction and then be thrilled as butterflies the size of birds land on your hands for a snack.

Visiting the middle of the world is a mandatory stop once you are in Ecuador, you will have the opportunity to be able to stand on both sides of the hemispheres, north and south, at the same time and feel the neutral forces of the equator.

Afterwards, you'll continue back to Quito where you'll check into your hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Day 13 Quito - Baltra - Santa Cruz Island (Galapagos Islands)

After breakfast today, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight to the Island of Baltra in the Galapagos Islands. On arrival you will be picked up and transferred to Santa Cruz, a nearby island, crossing the narrow Itabaca channel by ferry before continuing by car. Your first stop will be at the highlands of Santa Cruz, the "Parte Alta", as the highlands are called in Spanish, are very lush and home to the iconic giant Galapagos tortoises. Here you will visit a private ranch where you will enjoy lunch before heading out on a walk in search of the giant tortoises.

During this visit, you will also visit lava tubes which are formed when the surface of a lava stream solidifies but the inside remains liquid and flows out like a river. After this tour, you will continue by private transport to the hotel where you will have a meet and greet with a local guide who will explain the following day's itinerary to you before you can enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

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Day 14 Academy Bay Tour

Today, after breakfast, you will enjoy a half-day tour of Academy Bay where you can swim and snorkel with sea lions and all kinds of colourful fish. Here you can also see the blue-footed boobies who are resting at the edge of the cliffs. Afterwards, you can climb to a nearby viewpoint and, if you are lucky, you'll see white-tipped reef sharks swimming in the ocean below. You'll then take a walk to 'Playa de los Perros' where many sea iguanas can often be found resting in the sun. You'll find that the enormous cacti, the red colour of the rocks and the turquoise colour of the ocean make for great photo opportunities.

Here you will have a meet and greet with another local guide who will explain the rest of your itinerary to you before you can enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure on this stunning island.

Day 16 Isla Lobos Tour

After breakfast this morning, you will be met and transferred to a dock where you will take a short boat ride to the nearby Isla Lobos. During this boat trip, you will observe a lot of sea life before even setting foot on the island. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided tour where you will have the chance to observe frigate birds, blue-footed boobies and sea lions that all inhabit the island. Afterwards, you will have time for swimming or snorkelling in the beautiful waters.

Easter Island, or Rapa Nui, is a remote volcanic island in the Pacific Ocean, famous for its nearly 900 monumental moai statues. These massive stone figures, carved by the island's Polynesian inhabitants between the 13th and 16th centuries, remain a mystery in terms of their exact purpose and transportation.

Beyond its rich archaeological heritage, Easter Island offers stunning landscapes, including volcanic craters, pristine beaches, and ancient petroglyphs and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Spend 3 nights at leisure on Easter Island, where you can choose to independently explore or participate in optional activities on offer.

Please note: The Easter Island portion of the trip is self-guided.

Overnight: Puku Vai Hotel or similar

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 22 Easter Island

Today, you'll have the day at leisure to independently explore Easter Island, or you can choose to participate in an optional activity:

Please note: These activities can be chosen for either Day 22 or Day 23 of the itinerary.

Optional Activity: Orongo Village Tour

Today, visit the Ana Kai Tangata cave, where stylised birds are drawn on one of the walls, representing the Manutara (terns), whose precious egg was the centre of the annual "bird man" competition. Go to the Vinapu sector, an archaeological site characterised by its large basalt slabs, carefully crafted to fit, similar to the Inca constructions of Cusco. Also, visit the Rano Kau Volcano, a beautiful place with a lagoon with small cattail islands and abundant vegetation and microfauna. Next, visit the ceremonial village of Orongo, where the "bird man" ceremony was held, which designated the spiritual and political chief to



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serve alongside the king for one year. This sacred character, with the body of a shrunken man and a large bird-like beak, is sculpted on a large number of engraved stones.

Difficulty level: Easy Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen and comfortable clothes.

Optional Activity: Ahu Akivi Half-Day Tour

This half-day excursion takes you to explore a site featuring three Tahai ceremonial platforms, all meticulously restored in 1974. Among them is Ko Te Riku, notable for being the only Moai with restored eyes, along with Tahai and Vai Ure. Here, remnants of a houseboat, a stone house, and a jetty constructed from rocks can also be observed. Then journey to Ahu Akivi, a significant archaeological site showcasing a row of seven meticulously restored statues. According to legend, these statues represent the first explorers who arrived in Rapa Nui, sent by King Hotu Matua. Concluding the tour, you'll visit Puna Pau Quarry, the exclusive source of the red stone utilised in crafting the Pukau, or topknots, of the Moai sculptures.

Difficulty level: Easy

Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen and comfortable clothes.

Optional Activity: Anakena Full Day Tour

Journey along the southeast and northeast coasts of the island, visiting Ahu Akahanga, where we will find very well-preserved remains of what was an ancient Rapa Nui village. Continue to Rano Raraku, one of the most important and extraordinary

archaeological sites on the island. In that volcanic quarry, the moai were carved, and hundreds of them can be seen. After the tour, we will have lunch in a picnic area on the slopes of this volcano. Then, on to the Ahu Tongariki platform, the largest ceremonial structure built on Easter Island and one of the most surprising. It is one of the most famous postcards on the island, with its 15 enormous moai. Next, Ahu Te Pito Kura showcases the largest Moai ever erected—standing 10 meters tall and weighing 85 tons—alongside a spherical stone known as Te Pito o Te Henua, or "the navel of the world," believed to have been brought by King Hotu Matua. Finally, arrive at Anakena beach, with its white sands, pristine water and tropical palm trees. In this area, there are important archaeological remains due to their state of conservation, such as the Ahu Nau Nau platform. At that beautiful beach, there will be time to enjoy and relax before returning to the hotel.

Difficulty level: Easy, except for the Rano Raraku volcano, medium difficulty.

Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen, and comfortable clothes. A boxed lunch will be provided, including a sandwich, hard-boiled egg, nuts, a cereal bar, fruit, and one refill of water.

INGALA TRANSIT CONTROL CARD (GALAPAGOS)

INGALA, the Ecuadorian governmental agency that regulates all things pertaining to the Galapagos Islands issues a "Transit Control Card". This card is designed to help control immigration to the islands. INGALA has instituted the transit control card is to help keep track of who is visiting the islands. Visitors must go to a booth in the airport with their plane tickets before they board their flight to get the card, which costs around \$20 USD per person. The card is returned at the end of the trip.

Please note: This fee is subject to change.

NATIONAL PARK ENTRANCE FEES (GALAPAGOS)

All tourists visiting the Galapagos Islands must pay an entry tax to visit the archipelago. The amount of this entrance fee depends on the age and nationality of the tourist. Most foreign tourists including Australians over the age of 12 pay \$200 USD per person. For some, this entry tax may seem a bit high, but it is important to keep in mind that these fees are helping to protect the wonderful islands.

TOUR GUIDE VS. TOUR LEADER

Tour Guide

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role

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entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on the history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction where they are guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves it at the end of the tour; they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides at each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

Please note: Tour leaders/guides are not a standard inclusion in all travel offers. Tour leaders/guides will only be made available when required to enhance the experience of the destination featured.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Lima, Peru

Lima is usually described as mild and warm throughout the year without noteworthy rain making Lima one of the driest capitals in the world. The average temperatures range from 18°C to 28°C.

Cusco, Peru

Cusco has a subtropical highland climate due to its elevation (3500m above sea level). It is generally dry and temperate, with two defined seasons. The dry season lasts from May to August, with abundant sunshine and occasional night time freezes; July is the coldest month with an average of 9.7°C. The wet season lasts

from December to March, with night frost less common; November averages 13.3°C. Although frost and hail are common, the only snowfall ever recorded was in June 1911. Temperatures usually range from 0.2°C to 20.9°C.

Quito, Ecuador

The Quito lies on 2832 metres above sea level. They generally experience two seasons in Quito, summer/dry season and winter/wet season. Their dry season generally is experienced from June to September and their wet season goes from October to May, bringing warmer temperatures, rain and higher humidity. In Quito, the average annual temperature is 13.9 °C. Precipitation here is about 1273 mm per year. With an average of 14.1°C, May is the warmest month. The lowest average temperatures in the year occur in June when it is around 13.6 °C.

Santa Cruz (Galapagos Islands), Ecuador

No time of year is too hot or too cold to enjoy the Galapagos, but the climate is not exactly the same throughout. June through December is considered the cooler months in terms of both the air and water. This is also the time of the dry season, where the highlands of the major islands are kept lush but the beaches and flatlands receive very little rain. Blue skies interrupted by sparse and sporadic afternoon showers are the norm.

Santiago, Chile

Santiago has a Mediterranean climate with hot, dry summers (up to 35°C) and mild, wet winters (around 14°C). Most rain falls from May to August.

Easter Island, Chile

Easter Island has a subtropical climate with warm summers (up to 28°C), mild winters (15°C), and year-round humidity. Rainfall is spread throughout the year, peaking in April-June.

Seat Selection & Frequent Flyer Points

A moderate level of fitness will be required. Expect a moderate pace of touring with a focus on guided tours that may include full days with extended activity, guided city tours or nature walks. You will be responsible for your own luggage and have the ability to board all modes of transport without assistance.

This trek involves hiking at high altitudes, navigating uneven terrain for several hours. Participants should be prepared for steep ascents and the effects of altitude. Recommended for active travellers with prior trekking experience and a reasonable level of endurance, this trek offers breathtaking views of the vibrant Rainbow Mountain and its surrounding landscapes

Please note:

High Altitude Sickness

Altitude sickness can occur at high

elevations when the body receives less oxygen. It can affect anyone, regardless of age or fitness, with symptoms such as headache, nausea, dizziness, fatigue and shortness of breath.

Tips to help prevent altitude sickness:

- Stay well hydrated and eat light, high-carbohydrate meals.
- Avoid overexertion during the first 24–48 hours at high altitude.
- Limit alcohol and avoid smoking.
- Consult your healthcare professional about preventive medications or your suitability for travel to high-altitude areas.

Local tour providers are trained in first aid, including high-altitude care, and have oxygen available for guests if needed. Medications are also readily available in Cusco.

Please note: Inoculations may be required to enter the country visited, along with re-entry into Australia after your visit. It is your responsibility to consult with your travel doctor for up-to-date medical travel information well before departure.

Yellow Fever

A valid international certificate of vaccination against Yellow Fever is required in many countries. You may need to present this on arrival at the airport or border crossing. Some countries will refuse entry if you are unable to present your certificate. It's also common for your home country to request a Yellow Fever certificate upon arrival. You must check with your doctor well before leaving home about the Yellow Fever requirements for the countries you'll be visiting.

Gratuities/Tipping

Land

As of 17th September 2025 tourist visas for Chile are not required if travelling on an Australian Passport. You can stay in Chile for up to 90 days without a visa. If you're unsure whether you need a visa, [contact the nearest embassy or consulate of Chile](#).

United States (Transiting)

If travelling on an Australian passport, an ESTA (visa waiver) for the USA is a strict requirement when travelling to or flying through the USA. In the event we are unable to obtain a refund or travel service credit, or part thereof, this cost is passed on to the customer as a Supplier Fee.
