The Itinerary

Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) – Tokyo, Japan

Today fly from Australia (or New Zealand) to one of the most captivating cities in the world - Tokyo, Japan. Upon arrival be transferred to your hotel in Tokyo.

Please note: Due to flight scheduling and availability, some departures may occur on Day 0. Affected customers must be at the airport the day before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation which you will receive 4-6 weeks prior to departure.

Overnight: Hotel Mystays Tachikawa or similar, Tokyo or similar
Meals included: In-Flight

Day 2 Tokyo Half-Day Sightseeing Tour - Free Afternoon

This morning you'll enjoy an introductory tour of Tokyo. This includes visiting the Tsukiji Outer Market where you can encounter traditional Japanese cuisine.

Afterwards, you'll stop by the stunning Meiji Shrine, a Shinto religious site that was dedicated to the Imperial Family in 1926. Enjoy walking among the serene gardens that surround the shrine as you learn details about its importance from your guide.

You'll then enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure to explore this fascinating city.

Overnight: Hotel Mystays Tachikawa or similar, Tokyo or similar
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 3 Tokyo – Mt Fuji – Nagano Region

After breakfast, you'll embark on an approximately 350-kilometre journey, starting at Mt Fuji's 5th Station. Located 2300 metres above sea level, it offers a commanding view of the Fuji Five Lakes area below, making it a popular spot even for those who do not intend on climbing the mountain, and features shrines, torii gates and souvenir shops.

Afterwards, you'll continue to Lake Kawaguchiko to admire the scenery as you enjoy a short cruise across the lake. The waters are overlooked by surrounding mountains including both Mt Fuji and Mt Komagatake.

Arrive in Nagano region this afternoon, check into the hotel and enjoy the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Hotel Route-Inn Suwa Inter or similar, Nagano Region

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 4 Nagano Region – Shirakawa-go – Takayama – Gifu

Today is a fun day to visit the countryside of Japan and see how local people live. Cover 170 kilometres during the drive to Shirakawa-go which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site in 1995. The area is famous for its traditional gassho-zukuri farmhouses, some of which are more than 250 years old.

Afterwards, you'll visit Takayama Old Town to walk along Sannomachi Street which survives in a particularly pretty state with many old homes, shops and restaurants. Takayama was once a bustling hub drawing expert artisans, farmers and merchants

from throughout the surrounding area. You'll find that Sanmachi, as well as Oshinmachi, preserves the traditional aesthetic of this time.

Finish the day in Gifu where you will check into your hotel for an evening at leisure.

Overnight: Hotel Resol Gifu or similar, Gifu
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 5 Gifu - Kyoto Sightseeing Tour

This morning, you'll take a 140-kilometre trip to Kyoto where you'll enjoy a half-day sightseeing tour of the ancient capital. First up visit Fushimi Inari Shrine, an important Shinto shrine in southern Kyoto. It's famous for its thousands of vermilion torii gates, which straddle a network of trails behind its main buildings. The tour continues with a visit to the iconic Temple of the Golden Pavilion where you'll see that the temple's top two floors are coated in gold leaf, creating a dazzling mirror image in the pond on which it's built.

Afterwards, enjoy the afternoon at your leisure or join one of the below optional activities, which can be booked during the trip directly with the operator.

Optional Activity: Maiko Dinner Show - 35,000 JPY per person

Today you will have the unique chance to enjoy an incredible Maiko performance with a Kaiseki dinner in Kyoto. Immerse yourself in the beguiling beauty of the 'Maiko' (apprentice geisha) scene during an exquisite evening of culture and cuisine at a Gion district restaurant. Gain fascinating insights into ancient Japanese customs as you chat with maikos and capture photographs to

immortalize your memorable evening. You will also have the chance to sip on a drink and pleasure your palate with delicacies inspired by 'kaiseki' cuisine, a traditional Japanese cooking style.

Optional Activity: Geisha Dress-Up Experience - 30,000 JPY per person

Enjoy a unique geisha transformation experience with full white face makeup, a beautiful kimono, a Japanese traditional hairstyle wig and a professional cameraman. The experience of a geisha makeover in the city of Geisha is a dream come true for many women from all around the world. You will remember this Geisha makeover experience forever.

Overnight: Comfort Hotel Kyoto Horikawa Gojo or similar, Kyoto
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 6 Kyoto - Nara - Osaka

This morning depart Kyoto for Nara and head to Nara Park to spot hundreds of free-roaming deer, which are considered the messengers of the gods. These deer have become a symbol of the city and have been designated national treasure status. Deer crackers are for sale around the park, and you'll find that some deer have learned to bow to visitors to ask to be fed.

You'll then visit the Todaiji Temple, one of Japan's most famous and historically significant temples and a landmark of Nara. The temple was constructed in 752 AD as the head temple of all provincial Buddhist temples in Japan.

Finish the day in Osaka where you can check into your hotel and enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure. There's something for everyone in Osaka as it's where you'll find the famous Shinsaibashi and Dotonbori shopping and entertainment districts.

Overnight: Kansai Airport Washington Hotel, Osaka or similar
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 7 Osaka Free Day

Today you can enjoy free time at leisure to explore Osaka. Alternatively, you can join an optional activity which can be booked during the trip directly with the operator.

Optional Activity: Hiroshima Day Trip

This morning transfer to Shin-Osaka train station, where your bullet train awaits. Climb aboard and marvel at the train's incredible velocity during a two-hour ride to Hiroshima. On arrival, continue the journey to Miyajimaguchi by coach or train, then board a boat travelling to the majestic Miyajima Island, otherwise known as Itsukushima, or Divine Island. This landmass is hailed as one of Japan's most beautiful landscapes so enjoy discovering the natural and cultural treasures of the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Island for 45 minutes with your guide. This is your chance to see the shimmering Itsukushima Shrine before enjoying a delicious lunch in a local eatery (not included). Cruise back to Hiroshima to reflect on the history of the region. Take a moment of contemplation at the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park, a historical site near to where the atomic bomb exploded. See exhibitions that articulate the destruction the bomb caused and marvel at the city's regenerative recovery. Finally, board a bus to the Atomic Bomb Dome (Genbaku Dome), a skeletal structure that miraculously survived the 1945 attack. Return to the train

station for the exhilarating return journey to Osaka on the bullet train, where the tour concludes. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 8 Osaka, Japan - Busan, South Korea

Today at the appropriate time you will be transferred to the airport for your flight to Busan, South Korea. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Please note: This flight is approximately 1.5 hours long and does not include meals.

Overnight: Asti Hotel or similar, Busan
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 9 Busan City Tour

This morning you will enjoy a sightseeing tour of Busan.

Start by visiting the Yongdusan Dragon Head Park – it is called Yongdusan because the shape of the mountain resembles a dragon's head emerging from the sea. Then go to the iconic Busan Tower, a 120-metre high structure that provides a stunning bird's eye view of the entire city of Busan, including islands and ships dotted in the distant seas. Those who'd like to go up to the top of Busan Tower can purchase tickets directly (approximately \$10 USD per person)*.

From there visit the Jagalchi Fish Market, the largest of its kind in Korea and a popular 'must-see' site for tourists in Busan. Afterward, travel to Haedong Yonggungsa Temple, situated on the coast of the northeastern portion of Busan. This superb attraction offers visitors the rare find of a temple along the

shoreline (most temples in Korea are located in the mountains). Next, continue onwards to the Instagram-famous Gamcheon Culture Village. The village is formed by houses built in staircase fashion on the foothills of a coastal mountain, earning the nickname 'Machu Picchu of Busan'. Many alleys that cut through this community are vibrantly decorated with murals and sculptures created by the residents.

Finish the day back at your accommodation where you may enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Overnight: Asti Hotel or similar, Busan

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 10 Busan Free Day

Today is a free day at leisure to explore the beautiful city of Busan. Alternatively, you can take part in a full-day Busan city tour to visit some sights you did not see the previous day.

Optional Activity: Full-Day Busan Sightseeing Tour

This morning you'll visit Hunnyeoul Culture Village, a charming coastal village located on the sloping cliff of Yeongdo in Busan. In December 2011, the old houses of the area were remodelled and the area was reborn as a unique culture and art village where you can walk through and visit the numerous cafes and galleries while enjoying the sweeping views of Busan and the ocean. Afterwards, visit Songdo Beach where you can board the famous cable car to ride over the bay and enjoy views through the transparent floor of the cable car before stopping by the Sky Harbor Observatory Platform which offers beautiful views of the Songdo Sea and cable cars.

Return to Songdo Beach via the same cable car and take a short walk along the Songdo Cloud Walk which features sections of clear glass floor that creates the feeling of walking on top of the ocean. First opened in 2015, the 365-metre-long skywalk offers an amazing panoramic view of the surrounding area that has made the Skywalk a popular destination. You'll then visit the Nurimaru APEC House, built to host the 2005 APEC Summit meeting at the tip of Dongbaek Island (  ), which stands near Haeundae Beach. This eye-catching glass building has been one of Busan's symbolic places ever since.

Finally, you'll visit the UN Memorial Cemetery (Note. No sportswear/No revealing clothing/No strapless slippers.) after driving over the 7.4-kilometre Gwangandaegyo Bridge which is the longest bi-level bridge over the ocean in Korea.

On the way back to the hotel, you can visit Nampodong International Market which is one of Korea's largest markets. Each alleyway is crowded with stalls and connects to Bupyeong Market, Kkangtong Market and other smaller markets. The market stocks such a wide variety of goods that you can find almost everything you need. Note. Tour Bus will pick you up in an hour, For those who need more time at the market, will need to make their own way back to the hotel (approximately 10-15 minute taxi).

Day 11 Busan - Gyeongju - Jeonju

This morning transfer to Gyeongju, the century-old historical Gyeongju City and 1,000-year-old capital of the Silla Dynasty. The Gyeongju Historic Areas were designated a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site in 2000. The protected areas encompass the ruins of temples and palaces, outdoor pagodas and statuary, as well as other cultural artifacts left by the Silla Kingdom. The historic areas are also known as one of the largest outdoor museums in the world.

Start your city tour from Bulguksa temple, also known as 'The Buddhist Country Temple'. Alongside the neighboring Seokguram Grotto Hermitage, Bulguksa Temple was designated a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site in 1995. Lastly, visit Daereungwon, also known as Tumuli Park which has more than 20 large and small tombs from the Silla Period. Pass by Chomsongdae Observatory, constructed as the lunar calendar, and Tumuli park exhibiting the Royal tombs.

In the afternoon you will proceed to the celebrated village of Jeonju, an important tourist centre that is famous for its Korean food and historic traditional buildings. In May 2012, Jeonju was chosen as a Creative City for Gastronomy as part of UNESCO's Creative Cities Network. This honour recognises the city's traditional home cooking handed down through generations over thousands of years, its active public and private food research, its system for nurturing talented chefs, and its hosting of distinctive local food festivals. Jeonju is the birthplace of Bibimbap (rice with vegetables & meat). In 2011, it was ranked 40th on the world's 50 most delicious foods readers' poll compiled by CNN Travel. We highly recommend you enjoy excellent Bibimbap food during your stay (not included).

Check into your accommodation on arrival and enjoy the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Best Western Plus Jeonju Hotel or similar, Jeonju
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 12 Jeonju - Seoul

This morning, We first visit Hanji Industry Center (Korean Traditional Mulberry paper). As Korea's first center specializing in paper, it has an extensive collection of 3,000 artifacts and a database documenting the long history and superiority of Hanji (Korean paper). Additionally, you will have the opportunity to make Korean paper with wooden tools or Traditional Fan making and bring it back home.

Afterwards, take a tour of Jeonju Hanok, the largest traditional Korean village with various traditional cultural facilities in the downtown area.

The tour will then depart for Seoul, South Korea's bustling capital. Your accommodation is located in Insadong, the heart of the city, and one of the cultural and artistic hubs of Seoul. There is one main road in Insadong with alleys on each side. Within these alleys are galleries, traditional restaurants, teahouses, and cafes.

The galleries are the heartbeat of Insadong. There are hundreds of them in the area offering every example of traditional Korean fine art, from paintings to sculptures. The most famous are Hakgojae Gallery, which functions as the centre of folk art, Gana Art Gallery, which promotes many promising artists, and Gana Art Centre.

The teahouses and restaurants are the perfect complement to the galleries. They are hidden deep within the twisting alleyways, making it feel like a treasure hunt. The shops in Insadong are very popular among all age groups providing a unique experience for every taste.

Overnight: Ibis Ambassador Seoul Insadong or similar, Seoul
Meals included: Breakfast

Day 13 Seoul City Tour

This morning begin a Seoul city tour at the beautiful Gyeongbokgung Palace to experience the most representative edifices of the Joseon Dynasty (more than 500 years old).

Afterwards, visit the National Folk Museum to learn about the country's unique culture and how Koreans used to live in the olden days. Continuing onwards, enjoy a quick stop to witness the Traditional Royal Guard Changing Ceremony and the Presidential Blue House before arriving at the famous Bukchon Hanok Village. This is a Korean traditional village in Seoul with a long history, located on the top of a hill between Gyeongbok Palace, Changdeok Palace and Jongmyo Royal Shrine. The traditional village is composed of many alleys and hanoks, preserved to showcase its 600-year-old urban environment. Here you will enjoy a guided walk and marvel at beautiful traditional homes.

After visiting the Bukchon Hanok village, you will then visit an Amethyst factory and learn more about South Korean Amethyst, which was one of the Koreans' symbols of wealth in olden times.

Finish the day with some time at leisure at the Dongdaemun open market, the largest of its kind in the Orient. Dongdaemun Market is a large commercial district of traditional markets and shopping centres that covers the entire area around Dongdaemun Gate, a prominent landmark in Korea. It is Korea's largest wholesale and retail shopping district, featuring 26 shopping malls, 30,000 specialty shops and 50,000 manufacturers.

Return to your accommodation, where you can enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Please note:

- *If the Seoul City Tour falls on a Tuesday, then the Gyeongbokgung Palace will be closed and the Changdeokgung Palace will be visited instead. Changdeokgung Palace was the second royal palace built following the construction of Gyeongbokgung Palace in 1405, recognised as a World Cultural Heritage site by UNESCO.*
- *Due to recent local government regulations aimed at protecting resident privacy and maintaining order Bukchon Hanok Village has been temporarily closed for groups. If the village is closed for your tour, an alternative visit to Namsangol Hanok Village will be provided in place of this.*

Day 14 Seoul Free Day - Optional DMZ Tour

Today is a free day to explore Seoul at leisure or join the below optional tour (not included).

Optional Activity: Korean DMZ (Demilitarized Zone) Tour

Nowhere is the tension between North and South Korea more palpable than in the no-man's-land known as the Korean Demilitarized Zone, or DMZ. Located on each side of the 38th parallel, this infamous border was established at the end of the war in 1953 at the signing of Panmunjom's armistice in order to separate North and South Korea.

This morning you'll head towards the North Korean border where you'll take the gondola for a perfect bird eye view of the Demilitarized Zone. Then, visit Dokgae Bridge which symbolises the pains of war and separation. The skywalk experience will be divided into three themes: past, present, and future. Proceed to Bunker Beat 131, a military underground bunker constructed during the Korean War turned into a unique exhibition space. You can feel the atmosphere of a military facility from the entrance. Walking down the stairway, you will see the situation room of the command during wartime.

Afterwards, you will head through passport security control and visit the Odusan Unification Observatory (closed every Monday), which is on the South Korean Side of the 38th parallel. After receiving a brief and listening to the precautions, you can watch a 3D film about the war, and then we can vividly see the North Korean villages, people working, and their daily lives.

The tower gives a view of North Korea at a glance and is a special place to experience the division of a nation and the life of North Korean people. Using binoculars, you can see the North Korean territory from the 304 square feet, 500-person capacity observatory. There's also an exhibition hall with displays on the conflict. Then, you will enjoy the Imjingak Resort, which has various war-related artefacts as well as boasting the spacious Pyeonghwa Nuri Park. The resort preserves the Freedom Bridge

and Imjingang rail bridge from the Korean War to remind people of the past, along with a Memorial Hall, memorial monuments, the Bell of Unification Last Train Out, The Bridge of No Return and other recreational areas.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Tokyo

Tokyo, the capital city of Japan, has a humid subtropical climate with four distinct seasons. Here is some climate information for Tokyo:

Spring (March to May)

Spring in Tokyo is mild and often considered the most pleasant season. Average temperatures range from 10°C to 20°C in March and gradually increase to 15°C to 25°C in May. It is generally dry, although occasional rain showers occur.

Summer (June to August)

Summers in Tokyo are hot, humid, and can be uncomfortable. Average temperatures range from 25°C to 30°C, and high humidity levels make it feel hotter. July and August are the rainiest months, and occasional thunderstorms and typhoons occur during this time.

Autumn (September to November)

Tokyo experiences relatively mild winters compared to other parts of Japan. Average temperatures range from 5°C to 10°C in December and January, gradually increasing to 8°C to 13°C in February. While snowfall is infrequent in Tokyo, occasional light snow or flurries can occur.

Seoul

Seoul, the capital city of South Korea, has a humid continental climate with four distinct seasons. Here is some climate information for Seoul:

Spring (March to May)

Spring in Seoul is generally mild and pleasant. Average temperatures range from 5°C to 15°C in March and gradually increase to 15°C to 25°C in May. It can be a bit chilly in March, but by May, the weather becomes more comfortable and enjoyable. Spring is known for cherry blossoms, which usually bloom in early to mid-April, attracting many tourists.

Summer (June to August)

Summers in Seoul are hot, humid, and can be quite muggy. Average temperatures range from 20°C to 30°C, with high humidity levels making it feel hotter. A tourist visa is not required for Australian or New Zealand citizens visiting Japan for stays of up to 90 days.

South Korea

Australian passport holders can visit as tourists for stays of up to 90 days without applying for a K-ETA (or visa waiver). The South Korean Government has announced that Australian passport holders will remain exempt from applying for a K-ETA until 31 December 2026.

While you don't need a visa or a K-ETA, you do need to complete a digital arrival card. See the official government portal at www.e-arrivalcard.go.kr.

Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
- *Visa rules may have changed since Covid-19. Some countries and airlines may require you to obtain an additional visa before arrival. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination you're entering.*

Please note:

- *Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.*
