Puno, the gateway to Lake Titicaca. Sail across the world's highest navigable lake to the floating Uros Islands, home to the indigenous Uru people.

Cross into Bolivia and arrive in La Paz, a city set dramatically against the Andean peaks. Continue to the vast Uyuni Salt Flats, where endless white landscapes reflect the sky in mesmerising beauty. Visit Isla Incahuasi, a cactus-covered island in the middle of the flats, and marvel at the bubbling 'Sol de Mañana' geysers before crossing into Chile.

Enjoy a leisure day in San Pedro de Atacama, before witnessing the steaming El Tatio Geysers at sunrise. Conclude in Santiago, Chile's vibrant capital, with a free day to explore its lively markets, museums, and hilltop viewpoints before flying home.

From ancient wonders to surreal natural landscapes, this adventure spans three incredible countries, offering an unforgettable experience through the heart of South America.

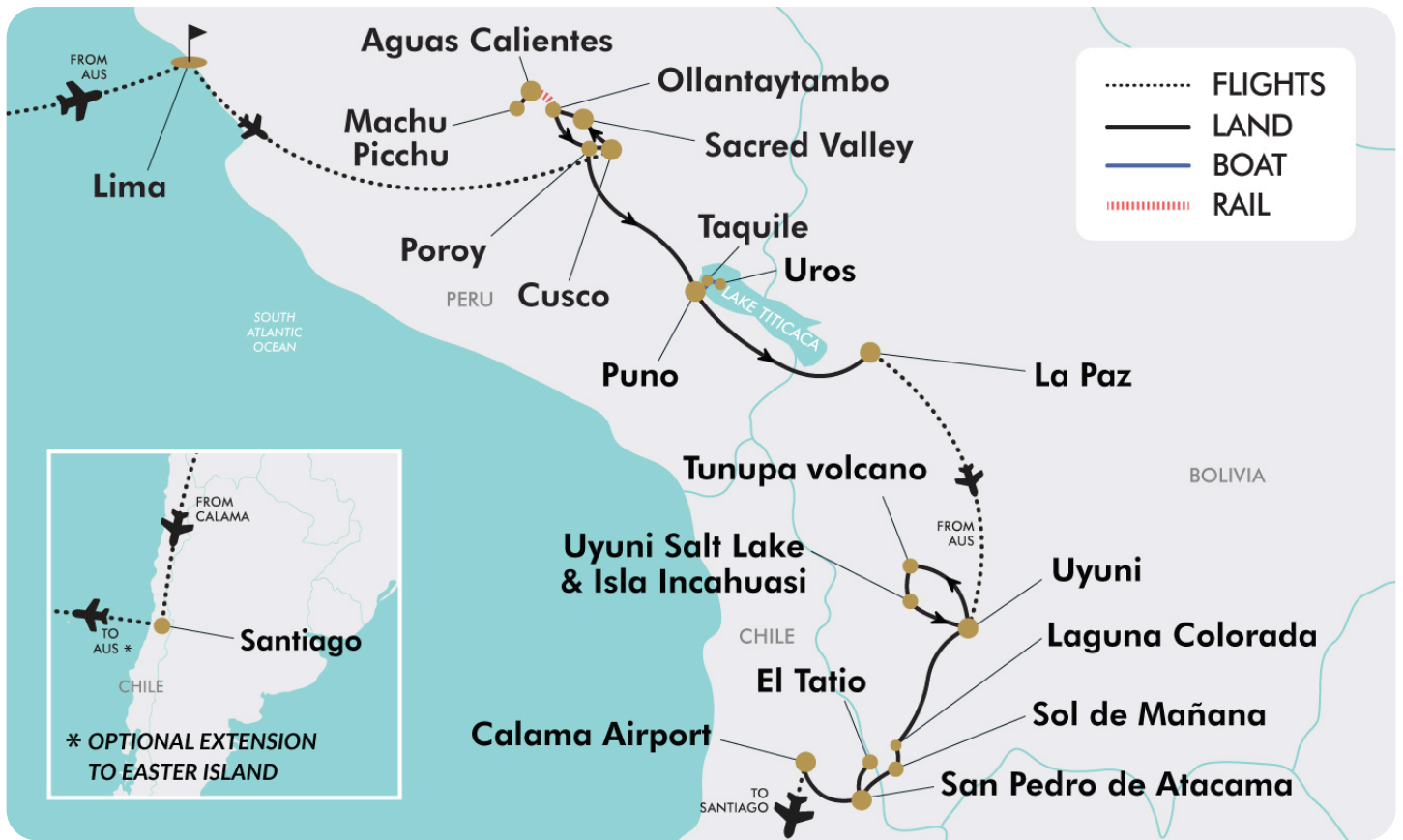

### Itinerary 1

#### Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Lima, Peru

Today depart from Australia (or New Zealand) to Lima, Peru. Upon arrival in Lima, be welcomed and transferred to the hotel.

Lima is a huge and fascinating city, a melting pot of all things Peruvian, where world-famous restaurants sit alongside ancient archaeological sites. Known as The City of Kings, the Peruvian capital is packed with stunning colonial architecture, huge religious buildings, government seats, and other important structures.

#### Please note:

- Due to flight scheduling and availability, some departures may occur on day 0. Affected customers must be at the airport the day before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation which you will receive prior to departure.
- For those departing from Perth, you may depart on day -1 (two days earlier). Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation, which you will receive prior to departure.
- Some customers may experience an extended layover. Lounge passes may be purchased at your own expense

#### Day 2 Lima City Tour

This morning, after breakfast, set off on a city tour of Lima, starting with a brief stop at the Huaca Pucllana Archaeological Site, an ancient pre-Inca ceremonial centre, before continuing to Lima's UNESCO World Heritage-listed historic centre. Explore the Plaza de Armas, the heart of the city, surrounded by grand colonial and Republican-era buildings with their signature carved wooden balconies. Iconic landmarks border the square, including the Government Palace, Lima Cathedral, Archbishop's Palace, Municipal Palace and the Palace of the Union.

From the square, walk to the Convent of San Francisco, one of Peru's most important religious sites. Founded in the 1530s and completed in 1766, this remarkable complex has withstood centuries of earthquakes. Inside, its historic library preserves over 25,000 rare volumes in Spanish, English and Quechua – some dating back to the 16th century. The convent is built around a tranquil courtyard planted with mango and lucuma (yellow sapote) trees, while its walls feature striking murals of St Francis of Assisi. Among the highlights are a golden Baroque altarpiece and Diego de la Puerto's famous 1696 painting of The Last Supper – notably featuring guinea pigs and potatoes on the table.

Descend into the eerie San Francisco Catacombs, Lima's largest. Once a burial site for more than 25,000 people, the catacombs were in use until 1808 and rediscovered in 1947. Today, they fascinate visitors with their macabre yet intriguing arrangements of bones in geometric patterns.

#### Day 3 Lima - Cusco

This morning, transfer to the airport for your flight to Cusco.

Upon arrival, meet your tour representative and transfer to the hotel. The remainder of the day is yours to relax and explore at your leisure in this enchanting city, the historic capital of the Inca Empire. Set in the breathtaking Peruvian Andes, Cusco is renowned for its rich heritage, where ancient Inca ruins seamlessly blend with colonial Spanish architecture. Wander the charming cobblestone streets, discover bustling markets, savour traditional cuisine, and admire iconic landmarks.

**Overnight: Hotel Jose Antonio Cusco or similar**

**Meals included: Breakfast**

#### Day 4 Cusco City Tour

Today, embark on a half-day tour, visiting Cusco Cathedral, the Koricancha (Qorikancha), Sacsayhuaman and Tambomachay, giving you a deep insight into the city and its history. Walking through the city centre, you can see the incredible mix of Inca and colonial architecture, watch the merging of indigenous and Spanish influences, and feel the history flowing through every cobblestone street.

First, go to the wonderful Koricancha, located next to the Church of Santo Domingo. According to chroniclers, the Koricancha was the most sacred and important temple of the Inca Empire during the period immediately after the Spanish conquest. Its walls were covered in gold, and life-size statues of plants and animals, all pure gold and silver, decorated its rooms and corridors. Unfortunately, this wealth was stripped away by the Spanish conquistadors.

Afterwards, visit the Cathedral of Cusco in the Plaza de Armas (Main Square). Built between 1560 and 1654 on the foundations of an existing Inca temple, this spectacular cathedral houses many works of art from the Cusco school of painters, and its high altar and pulpit are covered in gold and silver reliefs. The next stop is the imposing Inca fortress of Sacsayhuaman (3,700 metres above sea level), which stands on a hill above Cusco. Here, you will see some of the best examples of Inca stonework and construction, including huge rocks carefully cut and fitted perfectly to form the walls. Then, visit the Qenko Archaeological Complex (3580 metres above sea level), considered an Inca labyrinth with an altar with ritual motifs. Then head to Tambomachay (3,765 metres above sea level). The exact purpose of this site is unknown, but it may have functioned, at least in part, as an Inca spa. After a morning of exploring, have the remainder of the day at your own leisure.

*Please note: Cusco is located in the Peruvian Andes at 3,399 metres above sea level, high altitude environments are classified as above 2,500 metres above sea level. Please consult a medical professional if*

### Day 5 Cusco Free Day

After breakfast, enjoy a free day to explore Cusco at your own leisure. The capital city of the Inca Empire is the archaeological capital of the Americas, as well as the continent's oldest continuously inhabited city. Alternatively, you can choose to participate in an optional activity,

Optional Activity: Maras & Moray

Embark on a captivating half-day tour of Maras and Moray, beginning with a pickup from your Cusco hotel at approximately 09:00.

The journey to Moray takes about 1.5 hours, offering breathtaking views of the Andean landscape along the way. Pass golden wheat fields, charming traditional villages, and majestic snow-capped mountains. Upon arrival at Moray, explore its fascinating amphitheatre-like terraced structures. These circular terraces, believed to have been an agricultural laboratory for the Incas, showcase their innovative techniques for optimising crop growth. It's a truly awe-inspiring site that highlights the ingenuity of the Inca Empire.

Next, visit Maras, located just 3 kilometres from Moray. Marvel at the ancient salt evaporation ponds carved into the mountainside. More than 3,000 pools collect salty spring water that evaporates

to leave behind the renowned sal de Maras, a prized pink salt still harvested today. The view of these glistening ponds, resembling a blanket of snow or ice, is unforgettable. After exploring Maras, you'll return to Cusco, with drop-off at your hotel included.

Optional Activity: Rainbow Mountain Trek

Set off before sunrise on a breathtaking full-day adventure to Rainbow Mountain (Vinicunca), one of Peru's most extraordinary natural wonders. Your day begins with a 05:00 hotel pick up from Cusco, followed by a 2.5-hour drive southeast through the stunning Andean highlands to the village of Pitumarca. Continue to the Quesiuño trailhead, perched at an impressive 4,326 metres above sea level.

The hike covers approximately 3.6 kilometres on a round-trip (1.8 kilometres each way) along a gentle path, making it one of the more accessible routes to Rainbow Mountain. As you walk, take in sweeping vistas of snow-capped peaks, traditional Andean villages, and herds of alpacas and llamas grazing across the high plains. After around 1 hour and 20 minutes of walking, arrive at the summit of Rainbow Mountain, standing at 5,036 metres. You'll have time to admire the incredible mineral-rich stripes that create the mountain's vibrant colours and enjoy panoramic views of the surrounding peaks.

Your return trek takes approximately one hour, followed by a well-earned lunch in the area. Afterwards, sit back and relax as you make the 2.5-hour drive back to Cusco, arriving at your hotel around 18:00, concluding an unforgettable day in the Andes.

*Please note: The Rainbow Mountain trek via Pitumarca requires a moderate to high level of fitness. The trail is relatively gentle compared to other routes, but the high altitude remains the main challenge. Consulting with your GP prior to travel to assess your suitability for this excursion is recommended.*

#### Optional Activity: Folklore Dinner & Show

At 19:00, make your way to a restaurant near Cusco's central Plaza de Armas for an unforgettable evening. Indulge in a fabulous buffet dinner featuring a wide selection of traditional dishes, including meats, fish, vegetables, and exquisite desserts. The culinary delights are sure to please every palate. As you dine, the evening comes alive with a vibrant traditional dance show. Immerse yourself in the rich culture of the Andes with folk and classical music performed on traditional instruments like the quena, charango, flute and zampoña.

For an even more memorable experience, you're welcome to join the dancers on the floor and become part of the celebration. It's an enchanting way to connect with the region's culture and traditions. Please see the current pricing in the Important Information section.

#### **Day 6 Sacred Valley**

After breakfast, depart the hotel and journey into the Sacred Valley of the Incas. Passing the impressive ruins of Saqsaywaman, cross the mountains before descending 450 metres to the fertile valley floor, where the Urubamba River winds its way past picturesque villages.

The first stop is Pisac, famous for its lively traditional market. Here, browse colourful stalls filled with local handicrafts, textiles and souvenirs. Continue to the Pisac ruins, perched high above the valley. During a guided tour, explore terraces, temples, tunnels and ceremonial altars, including the remarkable Intihuatana—the “hitching post of the sun.”

Continue to Urubamba for lunch, before driving on to Ollantaytambo, one of the most important Inca sites. Once the royal estate of Emperor Pachacuti, Ollantaytambo is both a living town and an archaeological wonder. Explore the Temple of the Sun, admire the colossal stone blocks shaped with astonishing precision, and learn about the Inca's advanced agricultural terraces and sophisticated water systems.

Back in the town itself, see Inca-built water channels still flowing through the streets, as well as storage houses clinging to the mountainsides above. With its cobbled lanes and locals often dressed in traditional clothing, Ollantaytambo offers a rare glimpse of Andean life little changed over the centuries.

In the late afternoon, be transferred to the hotel in Urubamba, where the evening is at leisure.

*Please note: You will need to prepare a smaller backpack (maximum 8 Kg) to take with you to Aguas Calientes (luggage cannot be taken on the train). Larger suitcases will be transferred to the hotel in Cusco for your return.*

#### Day 7 Peru Expedition Train to Aguas Calientes

Today, transfer to the train station in Ollantaytambo and board the Peru Expedition Train for a spectacular journey to Aguas Calientes, the gateway to Machu Picchu. As the train winds its way along the Urubamba River, be treated to breathtaking views of the Sacred Valley, with steep mountains rising dramatically on either side. The scenery shifts from fertile agricultural terraces and quaint Andean villages to lush cloud forest, where cascading waterfalls and dense greenery signal your approach to the edge of the Amazon.

Nestled at the base of the mountains leading to Machu Picchu, Aguas Calientes blends traditional Andean life with a vibrant tourist scene. The largely pedestrianised town is filled with colourful markets, souvenir shops, cafes and restaurants, making

it a lively place to explore on foot. Framed by jungle-clad cliffs and with the Urubamba River rushing past, the setting is both dramatic and enchanting.

The town is also famous for its natural hot springs, where you'll have time to unwind in the steaming pools after your journey (not included). You can also stroll through the bustling streets, browse local handicrafts, and soak up the atmosphere of this unique settlement. An early evening is recommended to rest and prepare for an early start tomorrow - a sunrise visit to the iconic Machu Picchu.

#### Optional Activity: Express Inca Trail Trek

Physical ability: Active (please refer to the Other Important Information section for a description).

You will be picked up early (approximately 06:00). Board the train for a 1.5-hour scenic ride to a point known as Kilometre 104 to start your short Inca Trail trek. From here, you will hike for approximately four hours to the Inca site of Wiñay Wayna ("Forever Young"), approximately 2,680 metres above sea level. Built on a steep hillside overlooking the Urubamba River, this archaeological site has ten baths and numerous Inca buildings displaying high levels of Inca masonry. Wiñay Wayna was discovered almost 30 years after the entire world knew about Machu Picchu and 40 years after Machu Picchu was first discovered. Little is known about what Wiñay Wayna was originally built for, however there are theories that it was built as a spiritual destination or resting place before reaching Machu Picchu, where elders and royalty would cleanse themselves in the baths. Others believe that the site functioned as a kind of

administrative centre to keep track of the amount of produce stored on-site. After exploring Wiñay Wayna, you will continue your walk to Inti Punku (the Puerta del Sol, or The Sun's Gate). From here, you will have your first spectacular view of Machu Picchu. This site was believed to have once been the main entrance to Machu Picchu and was dedicated to Inti, the Inca Sun God. You'll then head to Aguas Calientes where your afternoon will be spent at leisure. Current pricing details can be found on the Important Information section.

*Please note: Due to the nature and duration of this tour, a moderate to active fitness level is required for participation in this supplementary trek. The route includes uneven surfaces, steep ascents and descents, a mix of stairs and dirt trails, and high-altitude conditions. The trek spans approximately 12 kilometres (6–8 hours) of walking including stops for photos, lunch (included) and exploring. If you have any concerns about your ability to complete this trek, we recommend consulting your GP for guidance.*

*Please note: Express Inca Trail Trek tickets are non-refundable and non-transferable. Once purchased, this optional activity cannot be refunded.*

**Meals included:** Breakfast

### Day 8 Machu Picchu - Cusco

Today is an early start as at approximately 05:40, you will be picked up and board the bus to the citadel of Machu Picchu. Pass through the gates into the Machu Picchu archaeological site and be guided on a two-hour tour to the most famous and spectacular parts of the extensive archaeological complex. These include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza and other key locations (depending on the circuit determined by the Ministry of Culture). As you walk around, you'll have spectacular views across the agricultural terraces of Machu Picchu and across the surrounding mountains and plunging gorges.

Once you've finished your tour of Machu Picchu, you'll take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes where you can relax and have lunch (not included) before boarding the train back to Poroy and Cusco. Upon arrival at the station, a tour representative will be waiting for you to take you back to your hotel in Cusco.

### Day 9 Cusco - Puno

The day begins early with a 05:00 hotel pick-up, transferring to the bus station for a 07:00 departure towards Puno. This scenic journey through the Andes is not just a transfer — it's an experience in itself, with fascinating stops along the way.

The first visit is to the Chapel of Andahuaylillas, a 17th-century church often called the "Sistine Chapel of the Andes" for its exquisite murals, intricate gold-leaf work and masterpieces of the

Cusco School. Continue to the Raqchi Archaeological Complex, home to the remarkable Temple of Wiracocha, the supreme Inca deity. Explore the site's impressive stone and adobe structures, including one of the largest collections of Inca storehouses (colcas).

Next, pause for a buffet lunch at a local restaurant, featuring a wide selection of national and regional dishes, fresh vegetables, local desserts and traditional hot drinks such as coca tea.

Journey onwards to La Raya Pass (4,335 metres above sea level), the highest point on the route and the natural border between Cusco and Puno. From here, admire the snow-capped Chimboya Mountain, birthplace of the Amazon River.

The final stop is the Pukara Lithic Museum, showcasing ceramics and stone sculptures from the ancient Pukara culture (1600 BC–400 AD), including the striking Hatun Ñaqac, or "Supreme Executioner."

Settle back for the last stretch of the journey — about five hours of scenic highland landscapes — before arriving to the lakeside city of Puno (3,830 metres above sea level) around 17:00.

#### Optional Train Upgrade: Cusco - Puno

An optional train upgrade is available as an alternative to travelling by bus.

Trade the highway for a front-row seat to the Andes on this iconic full-day rail journey from Cusco to the mystical Lake Titicaca. Departing at 07:50 and arriving in Puno at 18:08, you will traverse the expansive altiplano while being immersed in vibrant local culture through traditional music and dance

performances that bring the Andean spirit to life right in your carriage. This scenic route offers a perfect blend of comfort and culture, featuring an onboard lunch, snacks, and a relaxing afternoon tea as the breathtaking highlands glide by. A standout moment of the trip is the stop at Abra La Raya, the highest point of the route at 4,300 meters above sea level, providing an awe-inspiring photo opportunity where the mountains meet the sky. Your upgrade includes private transfers from your Cusco hotel to the station and a dedicated professional driver waiting to meet you upon arrival in Puno for a transfer to your Puno hotel. Please note, this optional upgrade is only available for departures where this travel day falls on a Wednesday, Friday, or Sunday (where Day 1 departure date is a Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday). #### **Day 10 Puno - Lake Titicaca - Uros Islands**

This morning, transfer to Puno's main port and board a modern motorboat with panoramic windows and an expert guide. The 30-minute boat ride offers stunning views of Lake Titicaca's sparkling waters, surrounding mountains, and diverse flora and fauna, leading to the extraordinary Floating Islands of the Uros.

Explore the unique lifestyle of the Uros people, descendants of one of the oldest cultures in the Americas. Living on islands made of totora reeds, they continue traditional activities such as fishing, crafting, and building their reed homes. Immerse in their distinctive way of life in this remarkable floating community.

Next, journey to Taquile Island, renowned for its scenic beauty and welcoming locals. Enjoy a cultural welcome with music, dance and presentations of traditional life. Take a guided walk across the island's breathtaking landscapes, offering panoramic views of Lake Titicaca and the snow-capped Andes of Bolivia. Visit a local family's home to witness their daily life and learn about their intricate textile craftsmanship.

Lunch is served at a typical island restaurant, after which you can relax on the lakeshore, taking in the surroundings. Later, return by motorboat to Puno and the hotel. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

### Day 11 Puno, Peru - La Paz, Bolivia

Today, travel from Puno, over the border to La Paz in Bolivia. This 5-hour journey offers breathtaking views of the Andes and the journey will be broken up with a stop in Copacabana to view its iconic basilica and vibrant markets. Enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure in La Paz, Bolivia.

*Please note: the services of your Peruvian tour leader will cease once you have arrived at the hotel in La Paz, Bolivia. The following day you will be transferred to the airport for an onward flight to Uyuni, where the services of the Uyuni Salt Lakes tour leader will commence.*

### Day 12 La Paz - Uyuni Salt Lake + Isla Incahuasi Island Oasis

At the appropriate time today, transfer to the airport in La Paz for your domestic flight to Uyuni. Upon arrival, meet your tour representative and begin an unforgettable journey.

First, visit the fascinating Train Cemetery, a relic of Uyuni's rich railway history. Continue to Colchani, the gateway to the Uyuni Salt Flats, where you'll explore a salt-processing workshop. Begin your adventure into the breathtaking Uyuni Salt Flats, the largest salt flats in the world, spanning over 10,000 square kilometres on the Bolivian High Plateau.

Along the way, stop at the Salt Museum and the bubbling Cold-Water Springs, known as "Ojos de Agua." Arrive at Isla Incahuasi, a unique island oasis adorned with ancient algae formations, fossils, and towering columnar cacti, some over a century old and reaching heights of more than 12 metres. The stunning vistas of the Bolivian Andes, the surreal pentagonal salt patterns, and the tranquil silence create an otherworldly experience like no other. Conclude the day by returning to your hotel for a well-earned rest.

- *Today's lunch will be a picnic.*
- *During the rainy season, a thin layer of water transforms the salt flats into the world's largest natural mirror, creating breathtaking reflections of the sky. If this occurs during your trip some areas such as Isla Incahuasi and Conquesa become completely*

#### Day 13 Uyuni Salt Lake

Today, embark on a full-day exploration of the Uyuni Salt Flats. Travel to the quaint village of Coquesa, nestled at the base of the majestic Tunupa Volcano, known as the guardian of the salt flats. Admire the picturesque stone corrals dotting the slopes like a chessboard, where shepherds tend to their llamas or cultivate quinoa in the fertile volcanic soil.

As you ascend toward the crater, marvel at the vibrant layers of sediment that emerge beneath the clear blue sky. From this vantage point, soak in one of the most breathtaking panoramic views of the Uyuni Salt Flats. Take time to stroll through the peaceful village and hike to the cave of the Coquesa Mummies, a fascinating site offering glimpses into ancient local history. In the afternoon, return to your hotel for an evening of leisure.

Along the way, pass through San Cristóbal Village and the striking Rock Valley. As you enter Bolivia's Eduardo Avaroa National Reserve, be immersed in a spectacular landscape of lagoons, salt flats, fumaroles, volcanoes, snow-capped peaks, vast plains, thermal springs, and flowing rivers.

The first highlight is Laguna Colorada, also known as the Red Lagoon—spanning 60 square kilometres at an altitude of 4,278 metres. The lagoon is famed for its deep red waters and as a sanctuary for three species of flamingos: the red-feathered tokoko, the pale-coloured chururu, and the delicate pink jututu. Continue to the surreal "Sol de Mañana" geysers, an extraordinary one-square-kilometre geothermal field of bubbling fumaroles and volcanic craters, showcasing the earth's raw volcanic energy.

The journey continues to the shimmering Green Lagoon, a vast emerald pool set against the dramatic backdrop of Licancabur Volcano. Its luminous green hue is due to the high magnesium content in the water—truly an unforgettable sight. As you make your way onward, keep an eye out for native Andean wildlife, including vicunas, llamas, and vizcachas. Upon arrival at Hito

#### Day 16 Atacama Desert, El Tatio Geysers

Depart early in the morning from your hotel for an unforgettable journey to the El Tatio geothermal field, located approximately 70 kilometres from San Pedro de Atacama. El Tatio, meaning "the grandfather who cries" in the Kunza language, is one of the world's highest-altitude geothermal fields, sitting at an impressive 4,320 metres above sea level. Arriving before dawn, you'll witness the striking contrast between the first rays of sunlight and the billowing steam rising from the earth's surface, creating a surreal and breathtaking landscape.

After taking in the mesmerising geothermal activity, begin the return journey with a stop at the remote village of Machuca, perched at over 4,000 metres above sea level. Once home to a thriving community, the village experienced a significant decline due to migration to larger towns. However, in recent years, some families have returned to revive traditional agricultural and pastoral practices, including the production of artisanal goat cheese. Machuca is also a haven for wildlife, as its small wetland attracts an array of bird species, including elegant flamingos, ducks, and Andean seagulls. Enjoy the peaceful surroundings and soak in the rich cultural heritage before making your way back to your hotel.

#### Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Lima, Peru

Today depart from Australia (or New Zealand) to Lima, Peru. Upon arrival in Lima, be welcomed and transferred to the hotel.

Lima is a huge and fascinating city, a melting pot of all things Peruvian, where world-famous restaurants sit alongside ancient archaeological sites. Known as The City of Kings, the Peruvian capital is packed with stunning colonial architecture, huge religious buildings, government seat, and other important structures.

#### Please note:

- *Due to flight scheduling and availability, some departures may occur on day 0. Affected customers must be at the airport the day before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation which you will receive prior to departure.*
- *For those departing from Perth, you may depart on day -1 (two days earlier). Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation, which you will receive prior to departure.*

#### Day 2 Lima City Tour

This morning, after breakfast, set off on a city tour of Lima, starting with a brief stop at the Huaca Pucllana Archaeological Site, an ancient pre-Inca ceremonial centre, before continuing to Lima's UNESCO World Heritage-listed historic centre. Explore the Plaza de Armas, the heart of the city, surrounded by grand colonial and Republican-era buildings with their signature carved wooden balconies. Iconic landmarks border the square, including the Government Palace, Lima Cathedral, Archbishop's Palace, Municipal Palace and the Palace of the Union.

From the square, walk to the Convent of San Francisco, one of Peru's most important religious sites. Founded in the 1530s and completed in 1766, this remarkable complex has withstood centuries of earthquakes. Inside, its historic library preserves over 25,000 rare volumes in Spanish, English and Quechua – some dating back to the 16th century. The convent is built around a tranquil courtyard planted with mango and lucuma (yellow sapote) trees, while its walls feature striking murals of St Francis of Assisi. Among the highlights are a golden Baroque altarpiece and Diego de la Puerto's famous 1696 painting of The Last Supper – notably featuring guinea pigs and potatoes on the table.

Descend into the eerie San Francisco Catacombs, Lima's largest. Once a burial site for more than 25,000 people, the catacombs were in use until 1808 and rediscovered in 1947. Today, they fascinate visitors with their macabre yet intriguing arrangements of bones in geometric patterns.

#### Day 3 Lima - Cusco

This morning, transfer to the airport for your flight to Cusco.

Upon arrival, meet your tour representative and transfer to the hotel. The remainder of the day is yours to relax and explore at your leisure in this enchanting city, the historic capital of the Inca Empire. Set in the breathtaking Peruvian Andes, Cusco is renowned for its rich heritage, where ancient Inca ruins seamlessly blend with colonial Spanish architecture. Wander the charming cobblestone streets, discover bustling markets, savour traditional cuisine, and admire iconic landmarks.

**Overnight: Hotel Jose Antonio Cusco or similar**

**Meals included: Breakfast**

#### Day 4 Cusco City Tour

Today, embark on a half-day tour, visiting Cusco Cathedral, the Koricancha (Qorikancha), Sacsayhuaman and Tambomachay, giving you a deep insight into the city and its history. Walking through the city centre, you can see the incredible mix of Inca and colonial architecture, watch the merging of indigenous and Spanish influences, and feel the history flowing through every cobblestone street.

First, go to the wonderful Koricancha, located next to the Church of Santo Domingo. According to chroniclers, the Koricancha was the most sacred and important temple of the Inca Empire during the period immediately after the Spanish conquest. Its walls were covered in gold, and life-size statues of plants and animals, all pure gold and silver, decorated its rooms and corridors. Unfortunately, this wealth was stripped away by the Spanish conquistadors.

Afterwards, visit the Cathedral of Cusco in the Plaza de Armas (Main Square). Built between 1560 and 1654 on the foundations of an existing Inca temple, this spectacular cathedral houses many works of art from the Cusco school of painters, and its high altar and pulpit are covered in gold and silver reliefs. The next stop is the imposing Inca fortress of Sacsayhuaman (3,700 metres above sea level), which stands on a hill above Cusco. Here, you will see some of the best examples of Inca stonework and construction, including huge rocks carefully cut and fitted perfectly to form the walls. Then, visit the Qenqo Archaeological Complex (3580 metres above sea level), considered an Inca labyrinth with an altar with ritual motifs. Then head to Tambomachay (3,765 metres above sea level). The exact purpose of this site is unknown, but it may have functioned, at least in part, as an Inca spa. After a morning of exploring, have the remainder of the day at your own leisure.

*Please note: Cusco is located in the Peruvian Andes at 3,399 metres above sea level, high altitude environments are classified as above 2,500 metres above sea level. Please consult a medical professional if*

Optional Activity: Maras & Moray

Embark on a captivating half-day tour of Maras and Moray, beginning with a pickup from your Cusco hotel at approximately 09:00.

The journey to Moray takes about 1.5 hours, offering breathtaking views of the Andean landscape along the way. Pass golden wheat fields, charming traditional villages, and majestic snow-capped mountains. Upon arrival at Moray, explore its fascinating amphitheatre-like terraced structures. These circular terraces, believed to have been an agricultural laboratory for the Incas, showcase their innovative techniques for optimising crop growth. It's a truly awe-inspiring site that highlights the ingenuity of the Inca Empire.

Next, visit Maras, located just 3 kilometres from Moray. Marvel at the ancient salt evaporation ponds carved into the mountainside. More than 3,000 pools collect salty spring water that evaporates

to leave behind the renowned sal de Maras, a prized pink salt still harvested today. The view of these glistening ponds, resembling a blanket of snow or ice, is unforgettable. After exploring Maras, you'll return to Cusco, with drop-off at your hotel included.

Optional Activity: Rainbow Mountain Trek

Set off before sunrise on a breathtaking full-day adventure to Rainbow Mountain (Vinicunca), one of Peru's most extraordinary natural wonders. Your day begins with a 05:00 hotel pick up from Cusco, followed by a 2.5-hour drive southeast through the stunning Andean highlands to the village of Pitumarca. Continue to the Quesiuno trailhead, perched at an impressive 4,326 metres above sea level.

The hike covers approximately 3.6 kilometres on a round-trip (1.8 kilometres each way) along a gentle path, making it one of the more accessible routes to Rainbow Mountain. As you walk, take in sweeping vistas of snow-capped peaks, traditional Andean villages, and herds of alpacas and llamas grazing across the high plains. After around 1 hour and 20 minutes of walking, arrive at the summit of Rainbow Mountain, standing at 5,036 metres. You'll have time to admire the incredible mineral-rich stripes that create the mountain's vibrant colours and enjoy panoramic views of the surrounding peaks.

#### **Day 6 Sacred Valley**

After breakfast, depart the hotel and journey into the Sacred Valley of the Incas. Passing the impressive ruins of Saqsaywaman, cross the mountains before descending 450 metres to the fertile valley floor, where the Urubamba River winds its way past picturesque villages.

The first stop is Pisac, famous for its lively traditional market. Here, browse colourful stalls filled with local handicrafts, textiles and souvenirs. Continue to the Pisac ruins, perched high above the valley. During a guided tour, explore terraces, temples, tunnels and ceremonial altars, including the remarkable Intihuatana—the “hitching post of the sun.”

Continue to Urubamba for lunch, before driving on to Ollantaytambo, one of the most important Inca sites. Once the royal estate of Emperor Pachacuti, Ollantaytambo is both a living town and an archaeological wonder. Explore the Temple of the Sun, admire the colossal stone blocks shaped with astonishing precision, and learn about the Inca's advanced agricultural terraces and sophisticated water systems.

Back in the town itself, see Inca-built water channels still flowing through the streets, as well as storage houses clinging to the mountainsides above. With its cobbled lanes and locals often dressed in traditional clothing, Ollantaytambo offers a rare glimpse of Andean life little changed over the centuries.

In the late afternoon, be transferred to the hotel in Urubamba, where the evening is at leisure.

*Please note: You will need to prepare a smaller backpack (maximum 8 Kg) to take with you to Aguas Calientes (luggage cannot be taken on the train). Larger suitcases will be transferred to the hotel in Cusco for your return.*

#### Day 7 Peru Expedition Train to Aguas Calientes

Today, transfer to the train station in Ollantaytambo and board the Peru Expedition Train for a spectacular journey to Aguas Calientes, the gateway to Machu Picchu. As the train winds its way along the Urubamba River, be treated to breathtaking views of the Sacred Valley, with steep mountains rising dramatically on either side. The scenery shifts from fertile agricultural terraces and quaint Andean villages to lush cloud forest, where cascading waterfalls and dense greenery signal your approach to the edge of the Amazon.

Nestled at the base of the mountains leading to Machu Picchu, Aguas Calientes blends traditional Andean life with a vibrant tourist scene. The largely pedestrianised town is filled with colourful markets, souvenir shops, cafes and restaurants, making

it a lively place to explore on foot. Framed by jungle-clad cliffs and with the Urubamba River rushing past, the setting is both dramatic and enchanting.

The town is also famous for its natural hot springs, where you'll have time to unwind in the steaming pools after your journey (not included). You can also stroll through the bustling streets, browse local handicrafts, and soak up the atmosphere of this unique settlement. An early evening is recommended to rest and prepare for an early start tomorrow - a sunrise visit to the iconic Machu Picchu.

#### Optional Activity: Express Inca Trail Trek

Physical ability: Active (please refer to the Other Important Information section for a description).

You will be picked up early (approximately 06:00). Board the train for a 1.5-hour scenic ride to a point known as Kilometre 104 to start your short Inca Trail trek. From here, you will hike for approximately four hours to the Inca site of Wiñay Wayna ("Forever Young"), approximately 2,680 metres above sea level. Built on a steep hillside overlooking the Urubamba River, this archaeological site has ten baths and numerous Inca buildings displaying high levels of Inca masonry. Wiñay Wayna was discovered almost 30 years after the entire world knew about Machu Picchu and 40 years after Machu Picchu was first discovered. Little is known about what Wiñay Wayna was originally built for, however there are theories that it was built as a spiritual destination or resting place before reaching Machu Picchu, where elders and royalty would cleanse themselves in the baths. Others believe that the site functioned as a kind of

administrative centre to keep track of the amount of produce stored on-site. After exploring Wiñay Wayna, you will continue your walk to Inti Punku (the Puerta del Sol, or The Sun's Gate). From here, you will have your first spectacular view of Machu Picchu. This site was believed to have once been the main entrance to Machu Picchu and was dedicated to Inti, the Inca Sun God. You'll then head to Aguas Calientes where your afternoon will be spent at leisure. Current pricing details can be found on the Important Information section.

*Please note: Due to the nature and duration of this tour, a moderate to active fitness level is required for participation in this supplementary trek. The route includes uneven surfaces, steep ascents and descents, a mix of stairs and dirt trails, and high-altitude conditions. Pass through the gates into the Machu Picchu archaeological site and be guided on a two-hour tour to the most famous and spectacular parts of the extensive archaeological complex. These include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza and other key locations (depending on the circuit determined by the Ministry of Culture). As you walk around, you'll have spectacular views across the agricultural terraces of Machu Picchu and across the surrounding mountains and plunging gorges.

Once you've finished your tour of Machu Picchu, you'll take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes where you can relax and have lunch (not included) before boarding the train back to Poroy and Cusco. Upon arrival at the station, a tour representative will be waiting for you to take you back to your hotel in Cusco.

Cusco School. Continue to the Raqchi Archaeological Complex, home to the remarkable Temple of Wiracocha, the supreme Inca deity. Explore the site's impressive stone and adobe structures, including one of the largest collections of Inca storehouses (colcas).

Next, pause for a buffet lunch at a local restaurant, featuring a wide selection of national and regional dishes, fresh vegetables, local desserts and traditional hot drinks such as coca tea.

Journey onwards to La Raya Pass (4,335 metres above sea level), the highest point on the route and the natural border between Cusco and Puno. From here, admire the snow-capped Chimboya Mountain, birthplace of the Amazon River.

The final stop is the Pukara Lithic Museum, showcasing ceramics and stone sculptures from the ancient Pukara culture (1600 BC–400 AD), including the striking Hatun Ñaqac, or "Supreme Executioner."

Settle back for the last stretch of the journey – about five hours of scenic highland landscapes – before arriving to the lakeside city of Puno (3,830 metres above sea level) around 17:00.

#### Optional Train Upgrade: Cusco - Puno

An optional train upgrade is available as an alternative to travelling by bus.

Trade the highway for a front-row seat to the Andes on this iconic full-day rail journey from Cusco to the mystical Lake Titicaca. Departing at 07:50 and arriving in Puno at 18:08, you will traverse the expansive altiplano while being immersed in vibrant local culture through traditional music and dance

performances that bring the Andean spirit to life right in your carriage. Continue to the surreal "Sol de Mañana" geysers, an extraordinary one-square-kilometre geothermal field of bubbling fumaroles and volcanic craters, showcasing the earth's raw volcanic energy.

The journey continues to the shimmering Green Lagoon, a vast emerald pool set against the dramatic backdrop of Licancabur Volcano. Its luminous green hue is due to the high magnesium content in the water—truly an unforgettable sight. #### Day 16 Atacama Desert, El Tatio Geysers

Depart early in the morning from your hotel for an unforgettable journey to the El Tatio geothermal field, located approximately 70 kilometres from San Pedro de Atacama. El Tatio, meaning "the grandfather who cries" in the Kunza language, is one of the world's highest-altitude geothermal fields, sitting at an impressive 4,320 metres above sea level. Arriving before dawn, you'll witness the striking contrast between the first rays of sunlight and the billowing steam rising from the earth's surface, creating a surreal and breathtaking landscape.

After taking in the mesmerising geothermal activity, begin the return journey with a stop at the remote village of Machuca, perched at over 4,000 metres above sea level. Once home to a thriving community, the village experienced a significant decline due to migration to larger towns. However, in recent years, some families have returned to revive traditional agricultural and pastoral practices, including the production of artisanal goat cheese. Machuca is also a haven for wildlife, as its small wetland attracts an array of bird species, including elegant flamingos, ducks, and Andean seagulls. Enjoy the peaceful surroundings and soak in the rich cultural heritage before making your way back to your hotel.

Go to the Vinapu sector, an archaeological site characterised by its large basalt slabs, carefully crafted to fit, similar to the Inca constructions of Cusco. Also, visit the Rano Kau Volcano, a beautiful place with a lagoon with small cattail islands and

abundant vegetation and microfauna. Next, visit the ceremonial village of Orongo, where the "bird man" ceremony was held, which designated the spiritual and political chief to serve alongside the king for one year. This sacred character, with the body of a shrunken man and a large bird-like beak, is sculpted on a large number of engraved stones.

Difficulty level: Easy Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen and comfortable clothes.

#### Optional Activity: Ahu Akivi Half-Day Tour

This half-day excursion takes you to explore a site featuring three Tahai ceremonial platforms, all meticulously restored in 1974. Among them is Ko Te Riku, notable for being the only Moai with restored eyes, along with Tahai and Vai Ure. Here, remnants of a houseboat, a stone house, and a jetty constructed from rocks can also be observed.

Then journey to Ahu Akivi, a significant archaeological site showcasing a row of seven meticulously restored statues. According to legend, these statues represent the first explorers who arrived in Rapa Nui, sent by King Hotu Matua. Concluding the tour, you'll visit Puna Pau Quarry, the exclusive source of the red stone utilised in crafting the Pukau, or topknots, of the Moai sculptures.

Difficulty level: Easy Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen and comfortable clothes.

Then, on to the Ahu Tongariki platform, the largest ceremonial structure built on Easter Island and one of the most surprising. It is one of the most famous postcards on the island, with its 15 enormous moai.

Next, Ahu Te Pito Kura showcases the largest Moai ever erected—standing 10 meters tall and weighing 85 tons—alongside a spherical stone known as Te Pito o Te Henua, or "the navel of the world," believed to have been brought by King Hotu Matua.

Finally, arrive at Anakena beach, with its white sands, pristine water and tropical palm trees. In this area, there are important archaeological remains due to their state of conservation, such as the Ahu Nau Nau platform. At that beautiful beach, there will be time to enjoy and relax before returning to the hotel.

Difficulty level: Easy, except for the Rano Raraku volcano, medium difficulty. Recommendations: Waterproof jacket (winter), comfortable shoes for walking, sunscreen, and comfortable clothes. ## Tour Leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides at each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

*Please note: Tour leaders/guides are not a standard inclusion in all travel offers. Tour leaders/guides will only be made available when required to enhance the experience of the destination featured.*

## CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

### Lima, Peru

Lima has a mild, warm climate year-round with almost no rain, making it one of the driest capitals. Temperatures range from 18°C to 28°C.

### Cusco, Peru

Cusco has a subtropical highland climate due to its 3,500m elevation. The dry season (May–August) is sunny with occasional frosts, while the wet season (December–March) is milder. Temperatures vary from 0.2°C to 20.9°C.

### Puno, Peru

Puno's high altitude keeps it cool year-round. The dry season (May–October) has sunny days (15°C–18°C) and freezing nights. The wet season (November–April) brings warmer days (16°C–20°C) and milder nights. Layered clothing is recommended.

### La Paz, Bolivia

At 3,650 metres, La Paz has a cool subtropical highland climate (6°C–16°C). The rainy season lasts from November to March, while the dry season (May–August) has sunny days and freezing nights.

### Uyuni, Bolivia

Uyuni's high-altitude desert climate is dry year-round, with mild days and cold nights. November–March averages 13°C, while June–July sees freezing temperatures. Strong winds make winters feel colder.

### Santiago, Chile

Santiago has a Mediterranean climate with hot, dry summers (up to 35°C) and mild, wet winters (around 14°C). Most rain falls from May to August.

### Easter Island, Chile

Easter Island has a subtropical climate with warm summers (up to 28°C), mild winters (15°C), and year-round humidity. Rainfall is spread throughout the year, peaking in April–June.

### Seat Selection & Frequent Flyer Points

## Rainbow Mountain Trek (Optional Activity): Active

The Rainbow Mountain Trek is a challenging yet rewarding adventure, suitable for those with a good fitness level who exercise regularly. This trek involves hiking at high altitudes, navigating uneven terrain for several hours. Participants should be prepared for steep ascents and the effects of altitude. Recommended for active travellers with prior trekking experience and a reasonable level of endurance, this trek offers breathtaking views of the vibrant Rainbow Mountain and its surrounding landscapes

## Express Inca Trail Trek (Optional Activity): Active

Active/demanding are more strenuous activities, suitable for a good fitness level and for guests who exercise regularly. More fast-paced activities and walking on uneven surfaces. A high fitness level is required to undertake activities, which include high-altitude trekking for anywhere between four to seven hours per day for an extended number of days. Recommended for active travellers with some previous trekking experience.

## High Altitude Illness

Altitude illness occurs when there is a lack of oxygen in the air at high altitudes. Altitude illness will affect some travellers, with no apparent regard to age, gender or physical condition. If you have any concerns, please consult your healthcare provider prior to purchase/travel.

### Please note:

## Visas

### New Zealand (Transiting)

If you do not hold an Australian passport you may be required to obtain a transit visa. Some flight routes make a stop in New Zealand and you may be required to obtain a transit visa to board your flight. It is the passengers' sole responsibility to seek advice on the correct visa and take appropriate action to ensure they have the correct visa prior to departure. Failure to do so may result in denied boarding and or refusal of entry to the country by the local authorities and immigration department. We strongly advise you to carefully review your flight tickets and then contact your respective consulate or a visa agency to confirm the necessary visa regulations and acceptable forms of personal identification for your transit.

### Peru

Tourists who hold an Australian or New Zealand passport don't need a visa for tourism or short-term visits. You can get a permit to stay for up to 3 months when you arrive. You may need a valid yellow fever vaccination certificate to enter Peru. Some airlines may want to see one when you leave. If you've visited Peru in the previous 6 days, you'll need a valid certificate to enter Australia. Find out about returning to Australia after exposure to yellow fever.

### Bolivia

You don't need a visa to visit Bolivia for tourism. The length of stay permitted upon entry is 30 days. You can request an extension of your stay at an immigration office in Bolivia. The maximum visa-free stay length is 90 days during one calendar year. You may need to show proof of onward travel on entry to Bolivia (a plane or bus ticket). Ensure you get an entry stamp when you arrive in Bolivia. Otherwise, you'll have to pay a fine when you leave. You should also make sure to

get an exit stamp, especially when you are crossing a land border. Entry and exit conditions can change at short notice.

## Chile

As of 17th September 2025 tourist visas for Chile are not required if travelling on an Australian Passport. You can stay in Chile for up to 90 days without a visa. If you're unsure whether you need a visa, contact the nearest [embassy or consulate of Chile](#).

## United States (Transiting)

If travelling on an Australian or New Zealand passport, an ESTA (visa waiver) for the USA is a strict requirement when travelling to or flying through the USA. Once a USA ESTA visa waiver is issued, it is valid for 2 years or until your passport expires (whichever is sooner) and will allow multiple entries into the USA. For information on ESTA eligibility or to apply, please visit <https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov/esta/>

*Please note: Due to recent changes to USA immigration policies, TripADeal recommends all travellers visit US Customs & Border Protection.*

### Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
