Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) – Seattle, USA

Today depart from Australia to Seattle, USA. Upon arrival, please make your own way to the hotel and check-in.

Please note: Some departures may occur on day 0 due to flight scheduling and availability. Affected customers must be at the airport the night before. Flight times will be indicated on your final documentation which you will receive prior to departure.

Day 2 Seattle – Wallace

This morning depart Seattle for the rolling wheat fields and wine country of Eastern Washington State. Today is a big day of driving, but we will break up the journey with a couple of stops along the way.

During this drive, you will pass by the Columbia Gorge, partially tracing the historic route of Lewis and Clark. Locals of this area boast they are surrounded by dozens of lakes left behind by glaciers of the ice age. Arrive in Wallace, Idaho, where you will check in for an evening at leisure.

Distance travelled: Approximately 570 kilometres.

Overnight: Stardust Motel or similar, Wallace

Meals included: None

Day 3 Wallace – Yellowstone National Park - Yellowstone Area, Montana

Put on your boots; you are riding through cowboy country today on your way to Yellowstone National Park! This scenic drive is filled with American history; meandering rivers once brimming with gold and abundant wildlife attracting rugged mountain men, gold miners, and pioneers of the Frontier Days in American history. Sparsely inhabited, one can picture the romantic American West as it was and remains today.

It's onward to Yellowstone, established in 1872 as the world's first national park. There are so many wonders to discover in Yellowstone! Experience the spouting geysers, bubbling mud pots, turquoise hot springs and prismatic pools while learning about the geothermal dynamics of this amazing wonderland. The routing and areas visited within Yellowstone are subject to favourable weather and/or road conditions. When conditions are unfavourable, routing may be adjusted accordingly. Finish the day in Gardiner or West Yellowstone, Montana, where you will have an evening at leisure.

Distance travelled: Approximately 680 kilometres.

Overnight: Big Rock Inn or similar, Gardiner/West Yellowstone

Day 4 Yellowstone National Park

Day 5 Yellowstone National Park – Great Falls

Today leave Yellowstone National Park behind and drive through scenic mountains and National Forests with some sightseeing along the way before arriving in Great Falls, Montana and checking into your accommodation for an evening at leisure.

Distance travelled: Approximately 380 kilometres.

Overnight: The Great Falls Inn or similar, Montana

Day 6 Great Falls, USA – Banff, Canada – Canmore

This morning, cross the border from the USA into Canada. Continue north to Banff and enjoy a sightseeing drive of the towns, including Bow Falls, featured in 1953 Marilyn Monroe's film *River of No Return*, and the historical Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel. Continue onwards to the nearby town of Canmore for an evening at leisure.

Distance travelled: Approximately 650 kilometres.

Day 7 Canmore – Icefields Parkway – Columbia Icefield – Lake Louise – Canmore

This morning head for the Icefields Parkway in Banff and Jasper National Parks, considered one of the most beautiful drive in the world. The jaw-dropping scenery is highlighted by more than 100 ancient glaciers, waterfalls cascading from dramatic rock spires and turquoise lakes set in sweeping valleys.

Today's drive will be approximately 420 kilometres. Views of Crowfoot Glacier, Bow Summit, and Mistaya Canyon are sure to please all who journey to this amazing part of the world.

Optional activity: Icefield Explorer - See important information section for pricing

Take up the opportunity to ride on the specially designed "Ice Explorer" onto the surface of the stunning Columbia Glacier.

This afternoon, enjoy a short walk along the shore of Lake Louise and soak in the area's tranquil beauty, history and geography before returning to Canmore.

Please note that Icefield Snowcoach is subject to favourable weather conditions. If it's closed, you will have free time to explore Banff and take a chance to enjoy the famous Banff Gondola (not included).

Day 12 Juneau, Alaska

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart 21:00

Cruise to Juneau, Alaska and visit the most remote, most beautiful and strangest state capital in the United States. Surrounded by water, forest and mountain sights, visitors seeking things to do in Juneau indoors and outdoors can hike a glacier, eat fresh-caught fish on a seaside patio and tour a grand capitol building all in one day.

Juneau is known for its outdoor recreation, fresh seafood and fine dining. The city itself is pleasant, but the real highlight of a visit to Juneau is tracking down some wildlife. You can hike up Mount Roberts to chance upon wild deer and bald eagles. Most sightseeing and whale-watching tours head north to Auke Bay - bring a good pair of binoculars to get the best view of these majestic and surprisingly graceful creatures. If you prefer land mammals, catch a floatplane to a nearby wildlife reserve such as Chichagof or Admiralty Island to spy some bears lolling around on an Alaska cruise excursion.

The sleepy, misty city of around 32,000 - mostly fishermen and small-business owners - has a frontier town vibe, but welcomes more than a million visitors each summer to its natural attractions, cementing Juneau as Alaska's number-one tourist destination. Experience this breathtaking city on an Alaska cruise.

Day 13 Skagway, Alaska

Arrive: 07:00 - Depart: 20:30

Skagway was the gateway to the gold fields for the thousands who flocked to Alaska and the Yukon with the hope of striking it rich. Skagway may have boasted the shortest route to the Klondike, but it wasn't the easiest. Over 100 years ago, the White Pass route through the Coast Mountains and the shorter but steeper Chilkoot Trail were used by countless stampedes. Many a would-be miner perished on the treacherous Chilkoot Trail. The gold rush was a boon so by 1898, Skagway was Alaska's largest town with a population of about 10,000 with hotels, saloons, dance halls and gambling houses prospering. When the gold yield dwindled in 1900, so did the population as miners quickly shifted to new finds in Nome. Today, Skagway has approximately 1,000 residents and still retains the flavour of the gold rush era.

Cruising from 06:00 to 15:00

Just west of Juneau, this breathtaking national park boasts some of the world's most spectacular tidewater glaciers, such as Margerie Glacier, which often drops colossal chunks of ice into the sea. Not surprisingly, Glacier Bay National Park and its epic ice giants are part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site comprising Alaska's magnificent park system.

Day 15 College Fjord (Scenic Cruising) **Cruising from 18:00 to 20:30**

Discovered in the northwest corner of Prince William Sound during an 1899 research expedition, spectacular College Fjord and its glaciers were named after prestigious East Coast schools by the college professors who first laid eyes upon their majesty. Stretching for miles, these massive rivers of ice tumble down from mountains and through valleys, dipping into the pristine waters of the fjord. There you'll have a chance to watch the awe-inspiring process of glaciers calving, or dropping enormous pillars of ice into the sea, as they crack and land with a thunderous splash – a once-in-a-lifetime experience not to be missed!

College Fjord not only boasts the world's largest collection of tidewater glaciers, but it also features magnificent snowcapped mountains as far as the eyes can see. Plus, during the summer, it's not unheard of to catch a glimpse of one of the area's 40-ton humpback whales feeding in the waters of the fjord.

It's a magical wonderland of epic proportions, so breathtaking you won't want to blink!

Day 16 Anchorage (Whittier), Alaska **Arrive: 12.30 - Depart: 20.30**

Whittier, approximately 65 miles southeast of Anchorage, lies nestled at the base of the Chugach Mountains bordering Passage Canal. Established as a World War II port for cargo and troops of the Alaska Command, Whittier remained activated until 1960. Today, Whittier's economy and its 290 residents rely largely on the fishing industry, the port and, increasingly, on tourism.

Once accessible only by boat or via a war-era railway tunnel, The Anton Anderson Memorial Tunnel was recently enhanced to accommodate highway traffic as well, making it the longest highway/rail tunnel in North America at 2.5 miles.

Named for the poet John Greenleaf Whittier, the community is also the gateway to spectacular Prince William Sound, with its magnificent tidewater glaciers and abundant marine life.

Day 17 Hubbard Glacier (Scenic Cruising)

Cruising from 15:00 to 20:00

Nicknamed the "Galloping Glacier," this east Alaskan glacier is rapidly advancing toward the Gulf of Alaska into a pristine area known as Disenchantment Bay. In fact, its movement temporarily formed a natural dam that twice closed off nearby Russell Fjord from the bay, but the intense water pressure building within the fjord-turned-lake has thus far been enough to explode through the wall of ice.

The largest tidewater glacier in North America, Hubbard Glacier measures 76 miles long and plunges 1,200 feet into the depths of the bay. Its immense beauty and phenomenal blue hues are enchanting, even from afar. But it's when your cruise ship draws closer that its towering surface really impresses, dwarfing even the uppermost deck on your ship at a whopping 40 stories high. There, with the snowcapped mountains serving as a glorious backdrop, you'll have a prime viewing spot from which to witness the glacier calving, as it often expels icebergs the size of 10-story buildings—imagine the splash!

The area around Hubbard Glacier is also renowned for its wildlife, where whales, harbour seals and otters swim, brown bears, moose and black-tailed deer roam ashore, and a wide variety of seabirds soar gracefully across the sky.

Nearby Alaska's largest Tlingit village exists a uniquely Alaskan place - Icy Strait Point.

Hoonah, meaning "village by the cliff," is home to the Huna Tlingit who have occupied this area for thousands of years. Local legend tells how they were forced from their ancestral home in Glacier Bay by advancing glaciers, resulting in their relocation to and settlement of Hoonah.

In 1912, the Hoonah Packing Co. built a large cannery one mile north of town. After only five years of operation, the cannery at Icy Strait Point turned out 152,505 cases of one-pound cans of salmon, the largest pack ever achieved in Alaska.

Today, Hoonah is home to nearly 750 residents. Visitors will be intrigued by its rich Native heritage, opportunities to see wildlife and the vast wilderness that surrounds this unique village. Icy Strait's waters have yielded record-breaking halibut and salmon catches and provide summer-long access to all five species of salmon. Chichagof Island, on which Icy Strait Point is located, supports one of the largest concentrations of brown bears in the world and sightings are common.

A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

It is valid for up to five years or until the passport expires, whichever comes first. If you get a new passport, you need to get a new eTA.

United States

If travelling on an Australian passport, an ESTA (Visa Waiver) for the USA is a strict requirement when travelling to or flying through the USA. Once a USA ESTA Visa Waiver is issued it is valid for 2 years or until your passport expires (whichever is sooner) and will allow multiple entries into the USA.
