You'll then make a delightful detour to the charming town

### CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

#### Mexico City

Mexico City has a subtropical highland climate, characterized by mild to warm temperatures throughout the year. However, due to its high elevation of around 2,240 meters above sea level, the city experiences cooler temperatures compared to other cities at similar latitudes. The climate in Mexico City can be divided into two distinct seasons: the dry season and the rainy season. The dry season typically spans from November to April, while the rainy season lasts from May to October. During the dry season, Mexico City enjoys mild temperatures with average highs ranging from 20°C to 25°C and cooler nights with temperatures dropping to around 10°C. In contrast, the rainy season brings increased precipitation to the city. The temperatures during this season remain relatively mild, with average highs ranging from 22°C to 24°C. Regardless of the season, Mexico City experiences relatively high humidity due to its location in a valley surrounded by mountains. The humidity levels are often higher during the rainy season.

#### Oaxaca

Oaxaca has a tropical savannah climate, closely bordering on a humid subtropical

climate, due to its high altitude. During the dry season, temperatures during the day remain warm with an average high of 27°C in the coolest month, December, and an average high of 33°C (in April, just before the beginning of the wet season.) Although daytime temperatures are warm, nighttime temperatures are cool with an average low of 9°C in January. Due to its altitude of 1,555m the climate of Oaxaca is cooler than lowland areas at the same latitude.

## Mérida

Mérida features a tropical wet and dry climate. The city lies in the trade wind belt close to the Tropic of Cancer, with the prevailing wind from the east. Mérida's climate is hot and its humidity is moderate to high, depending on the time of year. The average annual high temperature is 33°C, ranging from 28°C in January to 36°C in May, but temperatures often rise above 38°C in the afternoon during this time. Low temperatures range between 18°C in January to 23°C in May and June. It is most often a few degrees hotter in Mérida than in coastal areas due to its inland location and low elevation.

### FLIGHTS

#### Seat Selection & Frequent Flyer Points

We do not arrange seat selection. It is essential to highlight that some airlines do not allow pre-selected seats. We strongly suggest you contact the airline directly with seating allocation requirements and/or arrive at the airport earlier to arrange your seating. ## Visas

### Mexico

If you visit for 180 days or less as a tourist on an Australian Passport, you can get a visa on arrival. Be aware of the date that's stamped in your passport on arrival, as you may not receive the full 180 days. Your visa will expire on the entry stamp date. This is usually for the amount of time you indicate to the immigration officer that you are staying in Mexico.

To avoid being detained or deported, you'll need to:

- Fill in an online Multiple Immigration Form (FMM) and obtain a QR code.
- Make sure your passport is stamped by immigration officials on arrival.
- You can complete the FMM online before you arrive or on arrival.
- If you're entering by road, make sure you get the stamp on your passport at the immigration office (Instituto Nacional de Migración: Spanish). These are usually located near, but not directly at a border crossing.
- Present your completed FMM for inspection at immigration if entering by air. You'll need to show it when you leave Mexico.

### United States (Transiting)

If travelling on an Australian passport, an ESTA (visa waiver) for the USA is a strict requirement when travelling to or flying through the USA. Once a USA ESTA visa waiver is issued it is valid for 2 years or until your passport expires (whichever is sooner) and will allow multiple entries into the USA.
