Track lions, leopards and other active nocturnal animals as dusk falls on a sunset game drive through South Luangwa National Park. Finally, cross the border to Zambia's capital, Lusaka, then proceed to Livingstone and witness the thundering cascades of Victoria Falls, one of the world's most awe-inspiring natural wonders.

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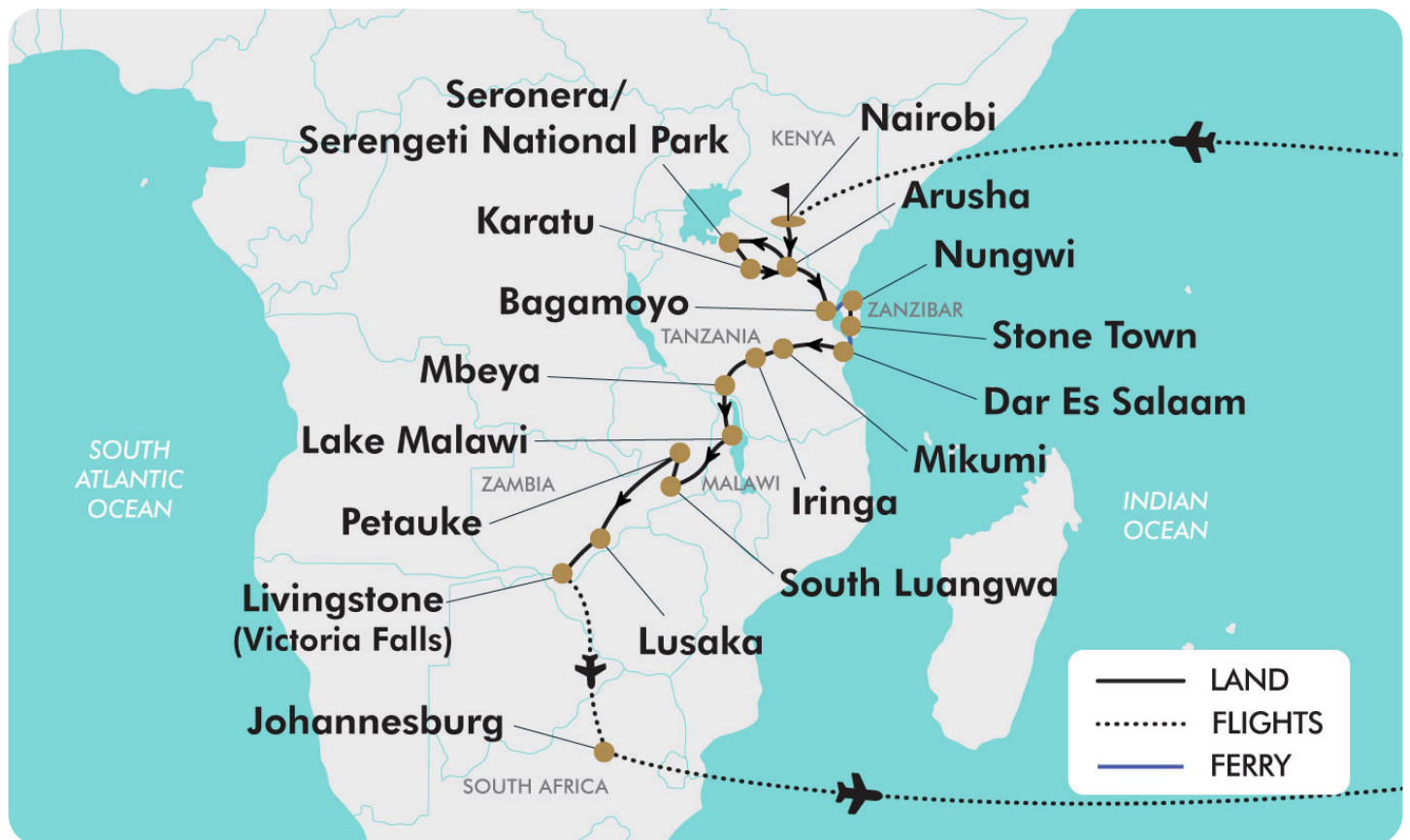

Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Nairobi, Kenya

Today, depart Australia (or New Zealand) for Nairobi, Kenya.

Please note: Due to flight scheduling and availability, some customers may be required to depart on Day 2 and will arrive on Day 2.

Meals included: In-Flight

Day 2 Welcome to Nairobi, Kenya!

Upon arrival in Nairobi, be transferred to the hotel by a tour representative. If it is too early for check-in then luggage can be stored at the hotel until the room is ready. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Day 3 Nairobi - Arusha, Tanzania

Today, be met by a tour representative and journey south to the Tanzanian border. After clearing immigration, continue to the bustling town of Arusha for the night. This region of northern Tanzania is a gateway to some of Africa's most iconic destinations. Nestled at the base of Mount Meru, the vibrant city of Arusha is widely regarded as the safari capital of northern Tanzania. With its temperate climate and lush surroundings, Arusha is also a perfect place to relax and recharge.

Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Day 4 Arusha - Seronera, Serengeti National Park

This morning, be met by the safari-style vehicles and set off early from Arusha, travelling directly to Serengeti National Park. In the afternoon, arrive at the camp nestled in the Seronera region, surrounded by striking landscapes and teeming with wildlife. As evening falls, relax with a refreshing drink in hand, taking in the unforgettable sights and sounds of the Serengeti, right from the comfort of the Meru-style tents.

Located in the heart of the Serengeti, the Seronera region lies directly along the path of the Great Migration, offering prime viewing of one of nature's most awe-inspiring spectacles. Each year, vast herds of wildebeest sweep across these plains in search of fresh grazing, creating unforgettable wildlife encounters. While the migration is seasonal, Seronera remains a year-round haven for wildlife, home to the iconic Big Five and a rich variety of other species.

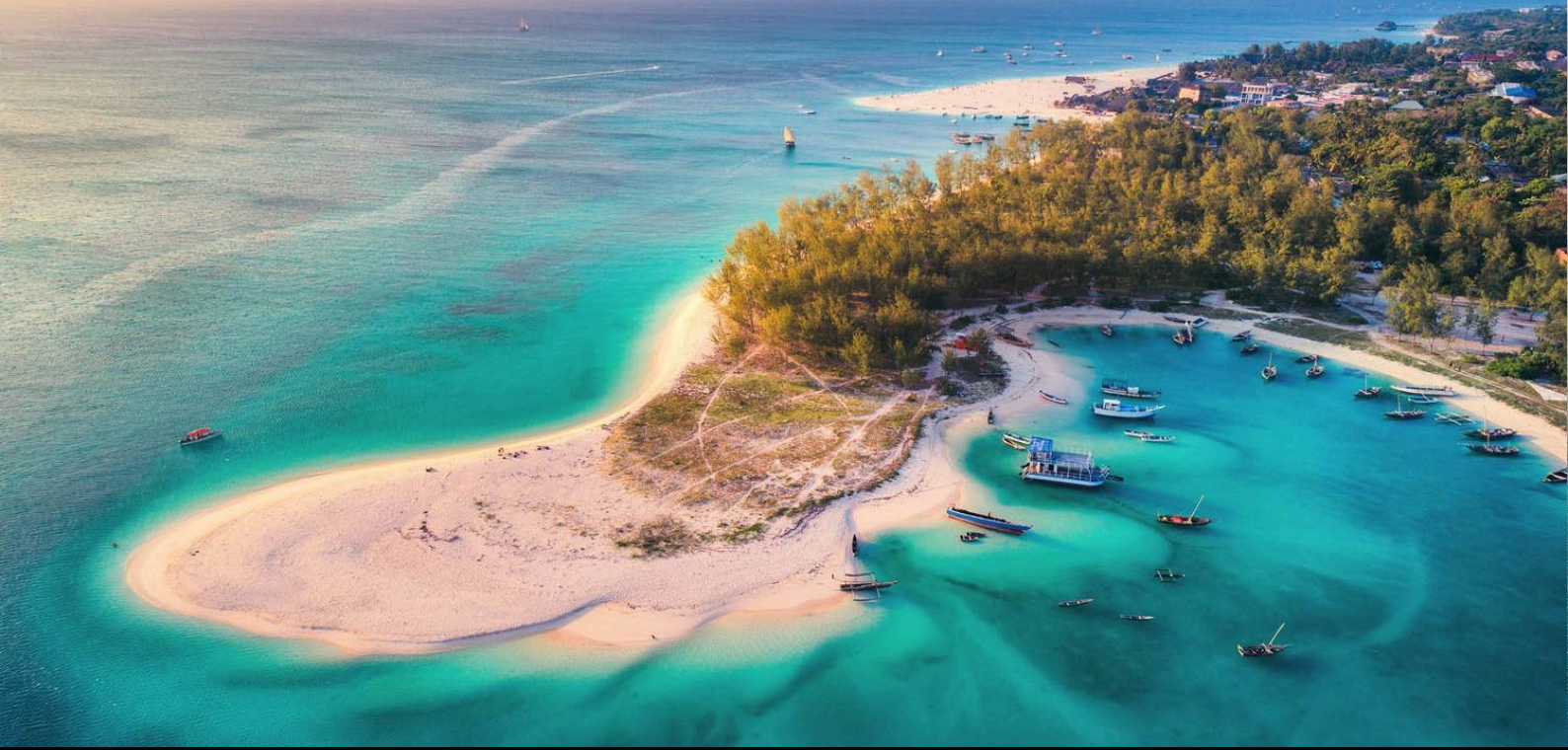

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Day 5 Serengeti National Park - Full Day Game Drive

Today, rise early this morning for a full-day game drive through the legendary Serengeti National Park. Renowned for its extraordinary concentration of wildlife, the Serengeti offers countless opportunities to spot a wide array of animals in their natural habitat. We'll spend the day traversing the vast plains in search of iconic species that call this incredible ecosystem home.

The Serengeti forms one of the most celebrated wildlife regions in Africa. Spanning the breathtaking landscapes of northern Tanzania, this vital ecosystem supports the spectacular annual migration, the largest movement of land mammals on Earth. Each year, over 1.5 million white-bearded wildebeest and more than 250,000 zebras follow the rains in a dramatic journey across the plains.

The Serengeti is also home to thriving populations of lions, elephants, giraffes, gazelles, eland, and countless other species. Its sweeping grasslands, dotted with surreal-looking acacia trees, create a classic African backdrop for unforgettable wildlife encounters.

Day 6 Seronera - Ngorongoro Crater - Karatu

This morning, travel towards the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, where you descend on a game drive into the world-famous Ngorongoro Crater for a thrilling wildlife experience. As we explore the crater floor, be on the lookout for the many animals that inhabit this extraordinary natural wonder.

Located in northern Tanzania, the Ngorongoro Crater is celebrated for its dramatic scenery and exceptional wildlife viewing, making it one of Africa's most iconic safari destinations. Encircled by verdant highlands, this UNESCO World Heritage Site is believed to be the world's largest intact volcanic caldera. Its rich ecosystem supports a staggering diversity of wildlife, including the famed Big Five, as well as vast herds of wildebeest, zebra, and antelope.

After the game drive, ascend the crater rim and make the short journey to Karatu, nestled in the lush green hills of northern Tanzania's highlands. Overlooked by the imposing Ol Deani Volcano, this charming and vibrant town has become a popular overnight stop for those exploring the region's renowned game parks.

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Day 7 Karatu - Arusha

Shortly after departing from Karatu, make a stop at the lively Mto Wa Mbu Market, located in the vibrant village of the same name. Nestled along the main road linking Serengeti National Park and the Ngorongoro Conservation Area with Arusha, Mto wa Mbu is known for its rich agricultural lands, particularly rice and its unique red bananas. The market offers an authentic glimpse into local life, with colourful stalls brimming with fresh produce, handmade crafts, and regional delicacies. Surrounded by two wildlife corridors, the area is frequented by various animals such as giraffes, elephants, hippos, wildebeest, baboons, zebras, and monkeys.

After the visit, continue the journey back to Arusha, where you'll spend the night.

Day 8 Arusha - Bagamoyo

Today, depart early and begin the journey south towards Bagamoyo. Travelling by road through Africa offers its own adventure, passing through lively markets, rural villages, and ever-changing landscapes that offer a glimpse into the everyday life and beauty of the Tanzanian countryside.

Just a short distance from the idyllic island of Zanzibar lies the historic coastal town of Bagamoyo, located within the UNESCO-listed Bagamoyo District. Once a thriving trading port, it served

as the capital of German East Africa and a key stopover for slave and ivory caravans journeying from Lake Tanganyika to Zanzibar. Today, Bagamoyo is known for its rich cultural heritage, traditional dhow-building craftsmanship, and vibrant arts scene.

Upon arrival, enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure. Possibly wander through the town, visitors can admire colonial-era buildings, many of which line its narrow, unpaved streets and echo the stories of a bygone era. With its unique blend of history, culture, and coastal charm, Bagamoyo makes for a rewarding day or weekend escape from nearby Dar es Salaam.

Day 9 Bagamoyo - Nungwi, Zanzibar

Today, leave Bagamoyo behind and board a ferry to the enchanting island of Zanzibar. Upon arrival, be transferred to the island's eastern shores and settle in at a beautiful beachfront resort. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure, take a dip in the infinity pool, relax on the palm-fringed beach, or hop on a bicycle to explore the peaceful local surroundings.

Once a modest fishing village, Nungwi has grown into one of Zanzibar's most popular beach destinations and the second-largest village on Unguja Island after Stone Town. Located on the island's northernmost tip, Nungwi is famed for its stunning white-sand beaches and turquoise waters.



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While the village retains some of its rustic charm, it's also known for its vibrant social scene. A lively collection of beach bars, restaurants, shops, and hotels create a festive atmosphere, especially after sunset when bonfires light the shore and music drifts through the warm ocean air. Days here are delightfully simple, sunbathe, swim and as evening falls, join the party scene with a cocktail in hand as the night comes alive.

Day 11 Nungwi - Stone Town, Zanzibar

This morning, we travel by road toward Stone Town. En route, stop to enjoy a guided spice tour through the lush villages and fragrant plantations that define Zanzibar's "Spice Island" heritage. Watch as skilled workers climb trees to harvest cloves, cinnamon, vanilla, and other spices, and take the opportunity to purchase fresh, locally sourced products straight from the farm.

Then, continue to the bustling port town of Stone Town to embark on a guided walking tour through the old city to explore its most iconic landmarks, including the birthplace of Queen's legendary frontman Freddie Mercury and soak in the unique rhythm of this storied coastal gem. Perched on the western coast of Zanzibar's Unguja Island, UNESCO-listed Stone Town is the historic heart and cultural soul of Zanzibar City. A captivating blend of Arab, Persian, Indian, and European influences, the town is a labyrinth of narrow alleys flanked by centuries-old buildings, vibrant bazaars, and architectural treasures. Highlights include the majestic Sultan's Palace and the iconic House of Wonders so named for being the first building in East Africa to feature electricity and running water when it was constructed in 1883.

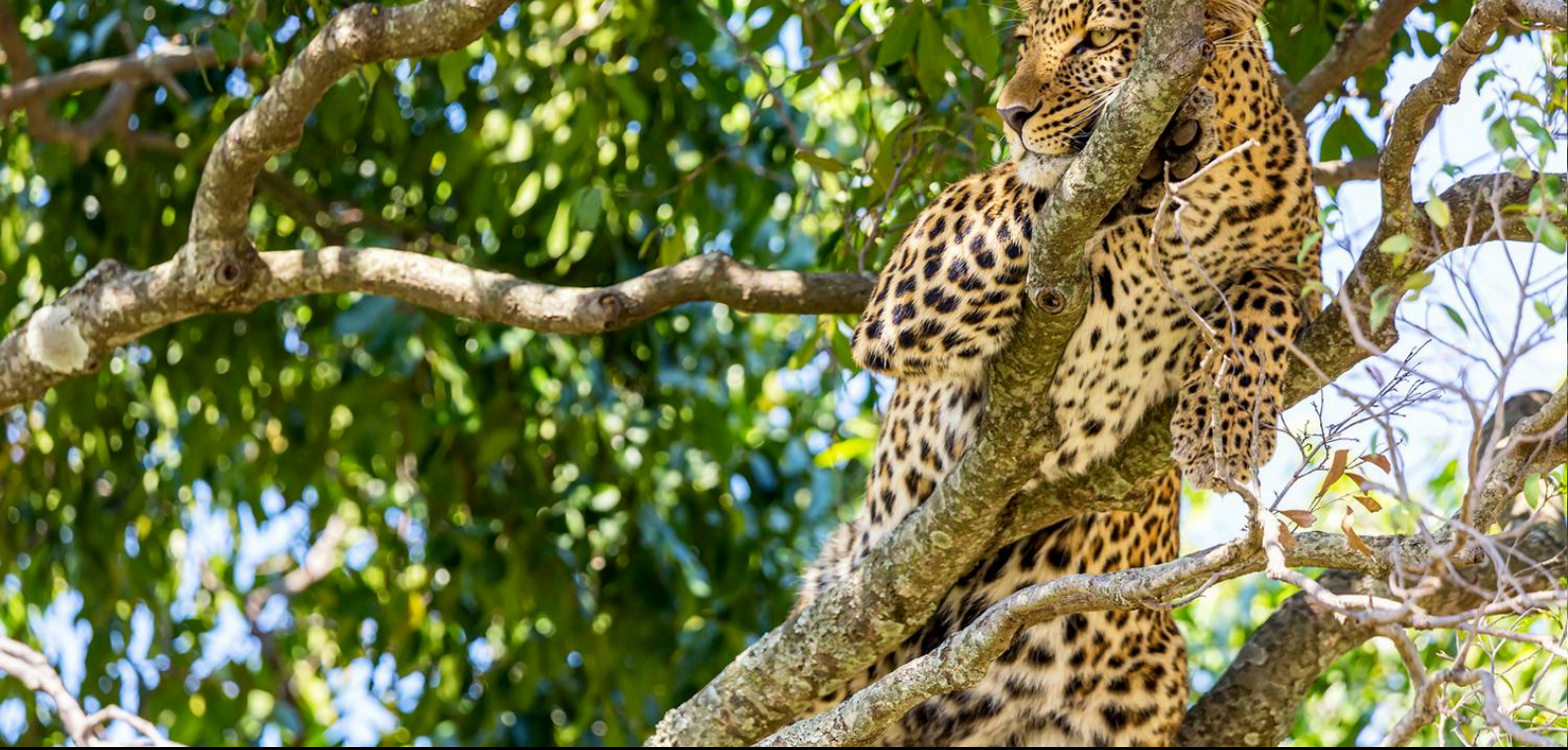

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Day 12 Stone Town - Dar es Salaam

Today, bid farewell to the enchanting island of Zanzibar and return to the Tanzanian mainland. Upon arrival in Dar es Salaam, settle in for the night, taking time to rest or explore a bit more of this dynamic city before the journey concludes.

Dar es Salaam, Tanzania's former capital and largest city, is a bustling port and vibrant economic hub. Rich in history and culture, the city reflects a blend of African, German, and British influences visible in its architecture, lively neighbourhoods, and colourful markets. Strategically located along one of the world's key sea routes, Dar es Salaam plays a vital role in the nation's commerce, transportation, and cultural life.

Beyond its urban energy, the city is a gateway to a wealth of nearby attractions, including the islands of Unguja, Pemba, and Mbudya, as well as several national parks and serene, sun-drenched beaches.

Day 13 Dar es Salaam - Mikumi

Leaving the coast behind, journey inland to Mikumi National Park, where you will spend the next two nights immersed in the wilderness. Mikumi forms part of a vast 75,000-square-kilometre ecosystem linked to the iconic Selous Game Reserve, Africa's largest protected wildlife area. This is a prime opportunity to encounter Tanzania's rich biodiversity in a spectacular and less-crowded setting. Set against a backdrop of mountain ranges, the park's landscape is defined by open floodplains and low-lying wetlands that attract a remarkable variety of wildlife. Covering an area of 3,230 square kilometres, Mikumi is home to lions, buffalo, antelope, civets, crocodiles, snakes, lizards, hippos, zebras, and even the elusive African wild dog, a rare sight in much of the continent. The park is also a haven for bird enthusiasts, with over 400 species recorded, ranging from vibrant resident birds to seasonal migratory visitors.

Day 15 Mikumi - Iringa

Today, travel inland toward the highlands and make your way to Iringa. Along the journey, pause at the awe-inspiring Baobab Valley, an otherworldly landscape dotted with centuries-old, towering baobab trees. These majestic giants, cast dramatic silhouettes across the savannah, offer a perfect photo opportunity and a quiet moment to soak in the grandeur of the African wilderness.

Upon arrival in Iringa, explore the town's German colonial-era buildings and vibrant marketplace. Those interested in history may visit the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery, which honours the memory of soldiers who fought and died in the region during World Wars I and II. This blend of natural beauty and cultural depth makes Iringa a compelling chapter in your Tanzanian journey.

Day 16 Iringa - Mbeya

This afternoon, stop at a local coffee plantation nestled in the verdant hills of the highlands. Here, learn about the fascinating process of cultivating and harvesting coffee, from bean to brew. Enjoy the aromas and flavours of freshly roasted Tanzanian coffee as we sample the rich, bold taste that this region is renowned for. It's a perfect moment to relax and savour the slower pace of life in the Southern Highlands.

The Southern Highlands of Tanzania, comprising the provinces of Iringa, Mbeya, Rukwa, and Ruvuma, offer a serene and captivating escape into the heart of rural East Africa. This diverse and fertile region is characterised by volcanic mountain ranges, sweeping grasslands, rolling hills, and an abundance of natural and cultural treasures.

Continue to Mbeya where you will spend the night.

Day 17 Mbeya, Tanzania - Lake Malawi, Malawi

Today, bid farewell to Tanzania as you descend into the Great Rift Valley and cross into Malawi, fondly known as the "Warm Heart of Africa." The journey takes you to the shores of the stunning Lake Malawi. The northern reaches of the lake are a tranquil paradise, and this evening offers a chance to relax or explore the local surroundings.



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Nestled on the northern shores of Lake Malawi, just two hours drive from the Tanzanian border, the small town of Chitimba offers a peaceful lakeside escape. Golden sand beaches stretch along the lakefront, fringed with swaying palms and papaya trees, while the dramatic backdrop of towering mountains completes the picture-perfect setting. Strolling along the lakeshore, you'll encounter traditional fishing villages and a wealth of birdlife. For the more adventurous, hiking trails lead to the scenic Manchewe Falls or up into the Livingstonia Mountains, offering panoramic views over the lake and surrounding countryside. These optional activities can be booked from the accommodation while on tour.

Day 18 Lake Malawi - Free Day

This morning, continue the journey south along the lake's edge. Our destination is another scenic stretch of Lake Malawi's shoreline, where you'll spend the night immersed in its natural splendour. Settle in by the water, take time to explore the tranquil surroundings, swim in the crystal-clear waters, or simply relax and take in one of Africa's most enchanting natural wonders.

Lake Malawi is the crown jewel of this stunning country, a vast, shimmering expanse that ranks among the world's largest, longest, and deepest freshwater lakes. Stretching 590 kilometres in length and 85 kilometres in width, it covers nearly one-fifth of

Malawi's total area and plunges to depths of over 700 meters, with its lowest point lying more than 200 meters below sea level. Often referred to as 'The Lake of Stars', its clear waters and golden beaches draw travellers from across the globe. While numerous fishing villages are dotted along its shores, much of the lake remains wild and unspoiled. Lake Malawi is a biodiversity hotspot, containing more species of freshwater fish than any other lake on Earth, over 600 species in Lake Malawi National Park alone. Visitors may encounter hippos, crocodiles, fish eagles, and a dazzling array of over 1,000 species of brightly coloured cichlid fish, many of which are found nowhere else in the world.

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Day 20 Lake Malawi - South Luangwa, Zambia

This morning, savour a final sunrise on the tranquil shores of Lake Malawi before embarking on the journey to Zambia and South Luangwa National Park. After crossing the border, pause briefly in Chipata before continuing to the camp nestled on the banks of the Luangwa River. From witnessing the morning sun rise over Lake Malawi to enjoying an equally breathtaking sunset by the Luangwa River, today promises unforgettable moments in nature's embrace.

Travelling Distance: Approximately 500 kilometres.

Overnight: Wildlife Camp or similar, South Luangwa

Day 21 South Luangwa National Park - Afternoon Game Drive

Bordering the Luangwa River, both Northern and Southern Luangwa National Parks offer some of the most untouched and awe-inspiring wilderness in Africa. Thanks to effective anti-poaching efforts, this region has flourished into a globally celebrated haven for wildlife. South Luangwa, in particular, is famed for its encounters with elephants, hippos, and even lions.

In the morning, guests can opt for a traditional game drive or, during the dry season (April to December), experience one of the park's iconic walking safaris—an exhilarating way to encounter wildlife up close, guided by expert armed rangers [not included - to be booked on tour].

In the afternoon, embark on a scenic Sunset Drive, complete with a refreshing sundowner stop. As dusk falls, continue into the evening for a rare opportunity to witness the park's nocturnal residents, elusive creatures that are seldom seen in daylight.

Along the way, stop at Mulberry Mongoose, a unique local enterprise where talented women from the South Luangwa region craft striking jewellery and curios using organic materials sourced directly from the African bush. The nearby Chipata area, a major cotton producer, offers a vibrant glimpse into local creativity and craftsmanship, a perfect way to experience the richness of Zambian culture before settling in for the night.

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Day 23 Petauke - Lusaka

Today, journey west towards Lusaka via the Great East Road, an important artery linking Zambia to neighbouring Malawi. The route winds through rural Zambia, offering an intimate look into daily life with subsistence farms, scattered villages, and vast open landscapes unfolding along the way. Cross the Luangwa River, one of Zambia's key waterways, before reaching Lusaka, a city that stands in striking contrast to the peaceful, undeveloped countryside that precedes it.

Lusaka, the cosmopolitan capital of Zambia, is a vibrant and fast-growing city set on open plains in the heart of the country. This modern African metropolis serves as Zambia's primary economic and transportation hub, with a skyline increasingly dotted by new buildings, shopping malls, and commercial developments.

Travelling Distance: Approximately 409 kilometres.

Day 24 Lusaka - Livingstone

Today, travel across the southern reaches of Zambia to the adventure capital of Livingstone, nestled on the doorstep of one of the world's most awe-inspiring natural wonders, Victoria Falls. Known locally as Mosi-oa-Tunya, meaning "The Smoke That Thunders", the falls are a breathtaking display of nature's raw power and beauty.

Upon arrival, have the opportunity to catch your first glimpse of the mighty falls, where columns of mist rise into the sky and the thunderous roar of cascading water echoes across the gorge. Whether you're drawn by the natural spectacle or the adrenaline fuelled activities, Livingstone has something for everyone. The town is a hub of adventure and exploration, offering an array of optional activities that can be booked upon arrival, ranging from whitewater rafting and bungee jumping to scenic helicopter flights, sunset cruises on the Zambezi River, and cultural village tours.

Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Day 25 Livingstone - Victoria Falls Tour

Today experience a morning tour to the awe of Victoria Falls from the Zambian side, where you can walk right up to the edge of the thundering cascade (entrance included). After the tour, return to the hotel and enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Camping Option: Room with en-suite bathroom

SLEEPING BAGS FOR THE CAMPING

Important Information

PACKAGE

There are many factors that you should consider when choosing your sleeping bag including, weather conditions, season, and the minimum temperatures at nighttime. Each sleeping bag will have a temperature rating that will indicate either a Risk (weather colder than - 3°C), Transition (2°C - 5°C), or Comfort (6°C - 10°C) rating. A camping mattress is provided, which is 5 cm thick, so you have a comfortable night's sleep. Pillows are also not provided, so if you would like to use one, please make sure you bring one with you.

Camping gives you the freedom to build your own little home every evening. Heavy-duty canvas dome tents and a sleeping mattress will be provided. Tents are approximately 2.5 x 2.5m across the base. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves it at the end of the tour; they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides at each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Zambia

In the area of Victoria Falls, the climate is subtropical, with a mild and dry winter from mid-May to mid-August (during which, however, nights are cold), and a hot, muggy and rainy summer from mid-November to mid-March. The rains occur in the form of downpours or thunderstorms. Between September and

November, before the rainy season, there is a hot period, which is in fact the hottest of the year, with temperatures easily reaching 35°C, and sometimes up to 40°C, even though the humidity is not as high as in summer. October is the hottest month of the year. On the contrary, in winter, when during the day the weather is nice, the temperature at night may approach freezing (0°C).

Kenya

The climate of Kenya varies by location, from mostly cool every day, to always warm/hot. The interior of Kenya has an arid climate, is nearly devoid of rainfall, and temperature swings widely according to the general time of the day/night. For many areas of Kenya, the daytime temperature rises about 12°C almost every day.

Tanzania

From July to August, Tanzania's weather is generally the coolest, the sunniest and the driest. June is a good month almost everywhere, but in the north-east the long rains can linger on until this month. September is also a good month, but at lower elevations the days can be hot. In October, the season of the short rains begins in the north, though in the first half of the month there is usually little rain, however, it can get hot at low altitudes. In November rain tends to fall overnight, this is an ideal month for nature lovers as the land blooms.

Zanzibar

Just south of the equator, Zanzibar's weather pattern follows that of Tanzania very closely although always tends to be a little more humid and occasional rain in the dry season is less uncommon than in the heart of the mainland Tanzania. Generally, the main rainy season, or the 'long rains', last during March, April and May. The humidity is high and daily temperatures reach the low-mid 30°C. The long dry season, when rainfall is fairly unusual, lasts throughout June, July, August, September and October. Temperatures vary hugely with altitude and location, but it's usually

fine, clear sky and sunny weather it's a great time to visit Zanzibar. During November and December there's another rainy season: the 'short rains'. These are much lighter than the main rains and less reliable.

Fitness Level Required

ZANZIBAR MANDATORY INSURANCE FEE

All travellers to Zanzibar must purchase inbound travel insurance for USD \$44.00 per person (to be paid for each adult and child). Coverage is valid for 92 days and only for the time spent in Zanzibar. However, it does remain valid for multiple stays in Zanzibar for up to 92 days. This insurance can only be purchased through the Zanzibar Insurance Corporation and is mandatory, even if travellers have other travel insurance. Travellers will have to provide proof of purchase on arrival. The policy will be sent to travellers by email. Travellers who fail to purchase the insurance policy may be denied entry to Zanzibar. Failure to do so may result in entry denial at immigration checkpoints. For any further inquiries or clarifications, please do not hesitate to contact the

Zambia

Australian and New Zealand passport holders do not need a visa to enter Zambia for tourism or short visits.

Malawi

Australian and New Zealand passport holders do not need a visa to enter Malawi for tourism or short visits.

Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
- *Visa rules are subject to change. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination/s you are visiting once you receive your travel documentation to ensure you have the most up to date information.*
- *It is your responsibility to be travel-ready and ensure that you are aware and comply with any destination or travel requirements, including the validity of all required travel documents.*
- *Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.*
- *It is also important to note that some areas of employment, such as journalism, government authorities and charity organisations, may have additional restrictions in applying for visas. This may, in turn, affect the type of application required.*
