Day 5 Kobe, Japan

Arrives: 07:00 - Departs: 22:00

Once the busiest port in Japan, this attractive city was devastated by an earthquake in 1995, and even after rebuilding, it never regained its maritime dominance. Nevertheless, its ultra-modern Harborland, crowned by the Kobe Port Tower, offers a warm welcome to the Kansai district of Japan. Kansai is ruled by a trio of Japan's most important cities: Kobe, Osaka and Kyoto. One of the first cities in Japan opened to trade, Kobe has a cosmopolitan air that includes a venerable Chinatown and a section of 19th-century Western-style buildings in the Kitano neighbourhood. The city's history began in the 3rd century with the construction of the Ikuta Shrine. Many visitors ascend looming Mt. Rokko via the Shinkobe Ropeway for panoramic views over the city and the glass-domed Nunobiki Herb Garden on the slopes.

The Arima Onsen hot springs right in Kobe is one of Japan, most famous spas. Massive Osaka is the largest of the trio of cities, with over 2.5 million people and attractions of its own, including a reconstructed castle, the impressive Kaikuyan Aquarium and the oddball Momofuku Ando Instant Ramen Museum commemorating the man who invented the ubiquitous cup-of-noodles. The richest repository of Japanese culture, however, is centred in Kyoto, where a UNESCO World Heritage Site encompasses no fewer than 17 structures as the Historic Monuments of Ancient Kyoto. Castles, gardens, temples and other treasures abound, and make a compelling reason for visitors to make the pilgrimage from Kobe for the day.

Day 7 Kagoshima, Japan

Arrives: 08:00 - Departs: 18:00

Tucked into a deep-cut bay at the southern end of Kyushu Island, this port has been compared to Naples in Italy because it is also dominated by views of an active stratovolcano, Sakurajima. Enjoy its magnificence from the Shiroyama Observatory, or from the tranquil Edo-period Senganen Japanese Garden. Ishibashi Park has three Edo-era stone bridges, of five originally built at the end of the 19th century. Near the port is the impressive Kagoshima Aquarium, with seven floors of displays including the massive Kuroshio Tank, maintaining a current that sustains large specimens, including a whale shark.

Day 8 Nagasaki, Japan (overnight)

Arrives: 09:00 - Overnight

Nagasaki's fine natural harbour on Kyushu island was mostly of local interest until Portuguese explorers landed there in 1543. It quickly flourished as a trading centre for European and Asian merchants, which continued throughout its history. It also developed into an important industrial centre. Because of its open status, the city harboured a significant Christian community, as well as a bustling Chinatown. During World War II, Nagasaki's concentration of military and industrial sites made it a target of repeated Allied bombing raids, culminating in a nuclear bombing on August 9, 1945, the second, and to date, the last use of a nuclear weapon in war.

As in Hiroshima a few days before, the devastation from the aerial explosion of the "Fat Man" plutonium bomb was horrific. An area of over 6.4 square kilometres was flattened, and about 80,000 people were killed directly, with an equal number suffering injuries. Now rebuilt, and with a thriving industrial and shipbuilding economy, Nagasaki still attracts visitors with the relics of its history, up to and including the atomic bombing.

Shimonoseki

Scenic cruising Kanmon Strait:

Kanmon Straits is a narrow channel of water that separates Honshu and Kyushu, two of Japan's main islands, while connecting the Sea of Japan with the Inland Sea. The strait has long played an important role in Japanese maritime history; the Shimonoseki Campaign — a series of military engagements with the U.S. and other navies that took place here in the 1860s — ended Japanese feudal rule over the region, thus opening Japan to the West and transforming it into an international trading hub.

Twin 19th-century lighthouses mark the port cities that face each other across the channel: Moji, Kyushu and Shimonoseki on Honshu, where you can still see cannons used during the naval campaign. Some 700 ships pass through Kanmon Straits on a daily basis; underground tunnels allow both cars and pedestrians to walk between the two ports. Japan's largest fireworks display takes place over the strait every August, drawing more than a million sky gazers to watch the spectacular.

Day 12 Hiroshima, Japan

Arrives: 09:00 - Departs: 22:00

Hiroshima means “wide island” in Japanese. The city was established in the 16th Century on Japan’s largest island, Honshu, and grew into an important shipping centre and prefecture capital, boasting a fine castle. Although it was an important city in Japan throughout the imperial period, its reputation in the greater world was burned into history when it became a target of the first atomic bombing of a civilian target in August of 1945. The United States aeroplane Enola Gay dropped a nuclear device nicknamed “Little Boy” on the city that morning, obliterating everything within a two-kilometre radius and directly killing 80,000 people. Approximately 70% of Hiroshima’s buildings were destroyed. Within a year, injury and radiation illness had killed an additional 90,000 to 116,000 citizens.

The attacks on Hiroshima and nearby Nagasaki quickly led to the surrender of Japan and effectively precipitated the end of World War II in Asia. Within a few years, Hiroshima had begun to rebuild, and the city became the focus of an international movement to eliminate nuclear weapons from future wars. Relics of its past, such as the impressive Hiroshima Castle and the tranquil Shukkeien Garden, were rebuilt, and the city undertook the construction of a Memorial Peace Park, which today attracts visitors from around the world. The park, which holds a museum and a memorial, “Atomic Dome”, constructed on the closest remaining building to the site, is a moving and impactful place of pilgrimage in this reborn City of Peace. One notable feature is

a colourful memorial to Sadako Sasaki, a young woman whose dying wishes for world peace were recounted in the story A Thousand Paper Cranes.

Located on Mount Godaisan, it also features an adjacent botanical garden. The town is most famous for its castle, originally built in the early 17th century, but largely rebuilt following a fire in the mid-18th century. It is one of only 12 existing feudal-period castles in Japan. South of the town, Katsurahama beach is a popular destination, although swimming is not allowed due to strong currents. A picturesque shrine located on a high point overlooking the sea is the perfect postcard image of rural Japan. The beach is also a good spot to enjoy Katsuo no Tataki, the traditional local dish of lightly grilled and seasoned bonito tuna.



Although it was an important city in Japan throughout the imperial period, its reputation in the greater world was burned into history when it became a target of the first atomic bombing of a civilian target in August of 1945. The United States aeroplane Enola Gay dropped a nuclear device nicknamed "Little Boy" on the city that morning, obliterating everything within a two-kilometre radius and directly killing 80,000 people. Approximately 70% of Hiroshima's buildings were destroyed. Within a year, injury and radiation illness had killed an additional 90,000 to 116,000 citizens.

The attacks on Hiroshima and nearby Nagasaki quickly led to the surrender of Japan and effectively precipitated the end of World War II in Asia. Within a few years, Hiroshima had begun to rebuild, and the city became the focus of an international movement to eliminate nuclear weapons from future wars. Relics of its past, such as the impressive Hiroshima Castle and the tranquil Shukkeien Garden, were rebuilt, and the city undertook the construction of a Memorial Peace Park, which today attracts visitors from around the world. The park, which holds a museum and a memorial, "Atomic Dome", constructed on the closest remaining building to the site, is a moving and impactful place of pilgrimage in this reborn City of Peace. One notable feature is a colourful memorial to Sadako Sasaki, a young woman whose dying wishes for world peace were recounted in the story A Thousand Paper Cranes.

Scenic cruising the Kanmon Strait

Kanmon Straits is a narrow channel of water that separates Honshu and Kyushu, two of Japan's main islands, while connecting the Sea of Japan with the Inland Sea. The strait has long played an important role in Japanese maritime history; the Shimonoseki Campaign — a series of military engagements with the U.S. and other navies that took place here in the 1860s —

ended Japanese feudal rule over the region, thus opening Japan to the West and transforming it into an international trading hub. Twin 19th-century lighthouses mark the port cities that face each other across the channel: Moji, Kyushu and Shimoneseki on Honshu, where you can still see cannons used during the naval campaign. Some 700 ships pass through the Kanmon Straits on a daily basis; underground tunnels allow both cars and pedestrians to walk between the two ports. Japan's largest fireworks display takes place over the strait every August, drawing more than a million sky gazers to watch the spectacular.

Fukuoka (Hakata)

Located on the northern tip of Japan's Kyushu Island, Hakata harbour's location close to the Asian mainland made it an important port from very ancient times, serving the early administrative centre at Dazaifu nearby. In the 13th century, the Mongol Kublai Khan tried twice to subdue the city, but his attacks were both foiled by typhoons, which earned the one the name Kamikaze, meaning "Divine Wind." In the late 19th century, Hakata and the nearby samurai city of Fukuoka were merged. Today, Fukuoka is a large, modern and eminently liveable city that still benefits from its proximity to Korea and other "Asian Tiger" economies. Attractions for visitors include a park surrounding the ruins of the samurai Fukuoka Castle; the Shokufuji Temple, Japan's first Zen temple; and the Japanese Garden and Gokoku Shrine in Ohori Park. The Genko Historical Museum holds displays of Japanese and Mongol armour from the period of the Mongol invasions. Modern highlights include the shopping and entertainment complex of Canal City and the waterfront Momochi Seaside Park development. Nearby, the old 7th-century

city of Dazaifu offers the Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine with 6,000 flowering plum trees, the tranquil Komyozenji Temple with a lovely Zen garden, and the impressive, modern Kyushu National Museum.

Located on the northern tip of Japan's Kyushu Island, Hakata Harbour's location close to the Asian mainland made it an important port from very ancient times, serving the early administrative centre at Dazaifu nearby. In the 13th century, the Mongol Kublai Khan tried twice to subdue the city, but his attacks were both foiled by typhoons, which earned the last one the name Kamikaze, meaning "Divine Wind." In the late 19th century, Hakata and the nearby samurai city of Fukuoka were merged. Modern highlights include the shopping and entertainment complex of Canal City and the waterfront Momochi Seaside Park development. Nearby, the old 7th-century city of Dazaifu offers the Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine with 6,000 flowering plum trees, the tranquil Komyozenji Temple with a lovely Zen garden, and the impressive, modern Kyushu National Museum.

Scenic Cruising Kanmon Strait Kanmon Straits is a narrow channel of water that separates Honshu and Kyushu, two of Japan's main islands, while connecting the Sea of Japan with the Inland Sea. The strait has long played an important role in

Japanese maritime history; the Shimonoseki Campaign – a series of military engagements with the U.S. and other navies that took place here in the 1860s – ended Japanese feudal rule over the region, thus opening Japan to the West and transforming it into an international trading hub. Twin 19th-century lighthouses mark the port cities that face each other across the channel: Moji, Kyushu and Shimonoseki on Honshu, where you can still see cannons used during the naval campaign. Some 700 ships pass through Kanmon Straits on a daily basis; underground tunnels allow both cars and pedestrians to walk between the two ports. Japan's largest fireworks display takes place over the strait every August, drawing more than a million sky gazers to watch the spectacular.

Day 11 Hiroshima, Japan

Hiroshima means “wide island” in Japanese. The city was established in the 16th Century on Japan’s largest island, Honshu, and grew into an important shipping centre and prefecture capital, boasting a fine castle. Although it was an important city in Japan throughout the imperial period, its reputation in the greater world was burned into history when it became the target of the first atomic bombing of a civilian target in August of 1945. The United States aeroplane Enola Gay dropped a nuclear device nicknamed “Little Boy” on the city that morning, obliterating everything within a two-kilometre radius and directly killing 80,000 people. Approximately 70 percent of Hiroshima’s buildings were destroyed. Within a year, injury and radiation illness had killed an additional 90,000 to 116,000 citizens. The attacks on Hiroshima and nearby Nagasaki quickly led to the surrender of Japan and effectively precipitated the end of World War II in Asia. Within a few years, Hiroshima had begun to rebuild, and the city became the focus of an international movement to eliminate nuclear weapons from future wars.

Relics of its past such as the impressive Hiroshima Castle and the tranquil Shukkeien Garden were rebuilt, and the city undertook the construction of a Memorial Peace Park, which today attracts visitors from around the world. The park, which holds a museum and a memorial “Atomic Dome” constructed on the closest remaining building to the b site, is a moving and impactful place of pilgrimage in this re-born City of Peace. One notable feature is

a colourful memorial to Sadako Sasaki, a young woman whose dying wishes for world peace were recounted in the story A Thousand Paper Cranes.



CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Japan

In March and April, Japan experiences the transition from winter to spring, bringing increasingly mild and pleasant weather across the country. In March, average daytime temperatures range from around 5°C to 13°C, depending on the region—cooler in the north (e.g., Hokkaido) and milder in the south (e.g., Kyushu and Okinawa). By April, temperatures typically rise to between 10°C and 20°C, with southern and central areas like Tokyo, Kyoto, and Osaka enjoying warm, comfortable days and cooler nights. This period also marks the famous cherry blossom season, especially in late March to early April in many central regions, with clear skies and low rainfall making it an ideal time for outdoor exploration and

sightseeing.

Busan, South Korea

In Busan, South Korea, March and April bring a welcome shift from winter to spring, with gradually warming temperatures and increasing sunshine. In March, average daytime temperatures range from about 5°C to 13°C, still a little brisk, especially in the mornings and evenings. By April, the weather becomes noticeably milder and more comfortable, with temperatures typically ranging between 10°C and 19°C. Rainfall is relatively low during this time, and cherry blossoms usually bloom in early April, making it a beautiful season for sightseeing, coastal walks, and enjoying Busan's beaches and parks before the summer crowds arrive.

Visas

Japan

Australian passport holders are visa-exempt for a stay of up to 90 days when travelling as a tourist.

South Korea

Australian passport holders can visit South Korea as tourists for stays of up to 90 days without applying for a K-ETA (or visa waiver) until 31 December 2026. Previously approved K-ETA applications will remain valid up to the granted expiry date. Australian passport holders travelling from 1 January 2027 may be required to apply for a K-ETA. Visit the official K-ETA website for more information.

Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
- *Visa rules are subject to change. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination/s you are visiting once you receive your travel documentation to ensure you have the most up to date information.*
- *It is your responsibility to be travel-ready and ensure that you are aware and comply with any destination or travel requirements, including the validity of all required travel documents.*
- *Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.*
- *It is also important to note that some areas of employment, such as journalism, government authorities and charity organisations, may have additional restrictions in applying for visas. This may, in turn, affect the type of application required.*
