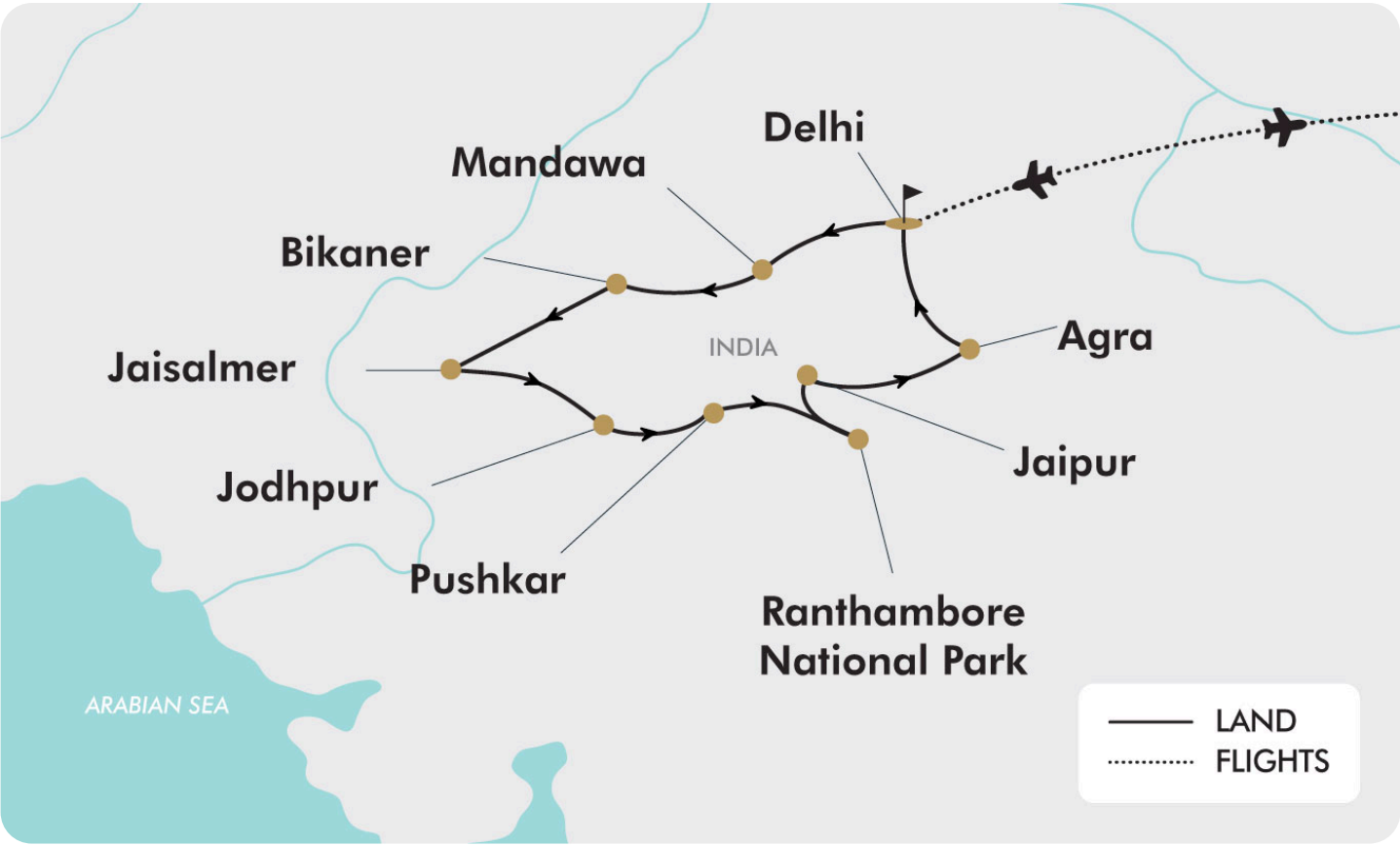

Itinerary 1 - Royal Rajasthan

Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Delhi, India

Today depart from Australia (or New Zealand) for Delhi, India! Upon arrival, meet the tour representative and be transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Day 2 Delhi City Tour

After breakfast, enjoy a city tour of Old and New Delhi. Drive past the Red Fort (made famous by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan) and Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India, which has three great gateways, four angle towers and two minarets constructed of alternating vertical strips of red sandstone and white marble. Continue onwards to Chandni Chowk, the main street of Old Delhi in the colourful shopping bazaar, and soak up the colourful market.

Next, travel to Laxminarayan Temple, a site dedicated to Lakshmi, the goddess of prosperity and good fortune. You'll also witness the India Gate, a 42-metre high war memorial and stone of triumph. The tour continues with a visit to Rashtrapati Bhavan, the palace-like building home to the President of India.

This afternoon enjoy the capital city at leisure or choose from optional activities before enjoying a welcome dinner where you can get to know your fellow travellers better.

Optional Activity: Lodhi Colony Street Art, Lodhi Gardens & India Habitat Centre Tour

Head out to discover India's first art district created by renowned artists from across the globe. Colourful murals were painted across the walls of one of the housing estates built by the British and the funky art shares an important message on issues such as climate and marginalised communities. Continue on foot to India Habitat Centre and admire the architecture of this unique building with its covered walkways and changing exhibits. Stroll a little further to Lodhi Gardens, one of the city's green spaces, filled with 15th century monuments and tombs from the Lodhi Dynasty and a favourite place for politicians and Delhiites to come and relax or exercise. Day 3 Delhi - Mandawa

Journey west from Delhi to the small rural village and hidden gem of Mandawa, in the Shekhawati region of Rajasthan. Famous for their collection of painted havelis and merchant houses, these crumbling mansions tell the story of a time when the community was prosperous and the owners travelled to distant lands.

In the afternoon, explore some of the palatial mansions, admire their intricately painted murals comprising everything from scenes of Maharajas to locomotive trains and aeroplanes, and hear stories of how their wealth was gained and what influenced the painting's designs. Of the havelis, the most important are the



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Chokhani, Ladia, Binsidhar Newatia, and Gulab Rai Ladia Haveli. Another haveli, the Binsidhar Newatia Haveli, is known for its curious paintings. There is a painting of a boy holding a telephone and a European woman in a transport driven by a chauffeur. The Gulab Rai Ladia Haveli is famous for its erotic images, now mostly defaced.

As well as the havelis, visit the Fort Palace - the structure of the palace reminds us of the cultural and social importance of this region in the past.

Finish the day at your hotel for an evening at leisure.

Day 4 Mandawa - Bikaner

After breakfast, depart for Bikaner, and upon arrival, check into your hotel.

Bikaner was founded in 1488 by Rao Bhikaji, a descendant of the founder of Jodhpur. The city has seen several ups and downs in its eventful history. Bikaner is also called the camel country, renowned for the best-riding camels in the world. It is also the birthplace of the world-famous Bikaneri bhujia and nankeen (a salted snack made of lentils).

This afternoon, enjoy an afternoon city tour, visiting the Majestic Fort of Bikaner, the Karni Mata Temple, where rats are considered sacred and worshipped, and a camel breeding farm.

Today's driving time/distance is approximately 4 hours/190km.

Overnight: Bikaner (Standard or Premium Option)

Day 5 Bikaner - Jaisalmer

After breakfast, depart to Jaisalmer. Upon arrival, enjoy a short orientation tour before checking in at your hotel.

The city of Jaisalmer rises from the heart of the Thar Desert like a golden mirage. With all its extraordinary splendour, a commanding fort etched in yellow sandstone dominates the amber-hued city. Located at the heart of the great Thar Desert, it offers visitors an enchanting world of fable, colour, and history. Moreover, the magnificent wood- and stone-carved mansions and buildings display Rajputs' love and interest in the fine arts.

Today's driving time/distance is approximately 7 hours/340km.

Overnight: Jaisalmer (Standard or Premium Option)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 6 Jaisalmer - Lodurva - Jaisalmer

After breakfast, begin a city tour visiting the massive Jaisalmer Fort, the second oldest fort in Rajasthan after Chittorgarh. Visit Patwon ki Haveli, the grandest haveli of Jaisalmer, followed by the Desert Culture Centre, which gives you an insight into this small town's past. The Jain temples hold space for the followers of Jainism, whilst the Salim Singh ki haveli and Nathmal-ki-haveli give you more idea of the haveli architecture of the town. After, visit the Gadsisar Lake, which is also an exciting spot in this desert city.





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This afternoon, enjoy an excursion to Lodurva. Approximately 15km from Jaisalmer is the ancient capital of Lodurva, an important pilgrim spot of the Jain community with some magnificent Jain temples. The 'Toran', or the ornate arches at the main entrance, and splendid carvings are impressive. The main attraction of the temple is a 'Kalpataru', or a divine tree within. Later, return to your hotel for an evening at leisure. Today's driving time/distance is approximately 1 hour/20km.

Optional Activity: Sam Sand Dunes & Camel Ride Evening Excursion

Head out on an excursion and visit Sam Sand Dunes in the desert, where you will enjoy a camel safari and a magnificent sunset over the dunes. Here you will be welcomed with a traditional welcome of Tikka followed by high tea and snacks. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

Day 7 Jaisalmer - Jodhpur

After breakfast, drive to Jodhpur, known as the Blue City of India. Set at the edge of the Thar Desert, the imperial city of Jodhpur echoes tales of antiquity in the emptiness of the desert. The graceful palaces, forts, and temples of the city bring the historic grandeur to life, while exquisite handicrafts, folk dances, music, and brightly attired people lend a romantic aura to the city.

Upon arrival, check into the hotel. This afternoon, explore the many sights of Jodhpur, including Jaswant Thada, a cluster of royal cenotaphs built in memory of Maharaja Jaswant Singh II,

and Umaid Bhawan Palace, the only 20th-century palace built under the famine relief project that provided employment to the famine-stricken population. It was completed in 14 years.

Today's driving time/distance is approximately 6 hours/280km.

Day 8 Jodhpur - Pushkar

Today, after breakfast, travel onwards to Pushkar. Characterised by a picturesque valley, mountainous regions, and several important pilgrimage sites, Pushkar is a must-visit for many tourists to India. It is one of the most revered Hindu pilgrimage sites in India and houses the only temple dedicated to Lord Brahma in the world.

Enjoy a tour of Pushkar this afternoon and visit the Brahma Temple, constructed using marble and stone slabs and beautifully painted in shades of blue and red. Also, visit Pushkar Lake, which is surrounded by almost 500 temples. The lake has 52 ghats, steps leading to the water, each of which was once the personal ghats for the 52 Maharajas of Rajasthan who performed sacred rituals here. Walk through the town's narrow lanes to see the bustling street market and crafts.

Finish the day at your hotel, where you may enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Overnight: Pushkar (Standard or Premium Option)

Meals included: Breakfast

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Day 9 Pushkar - Ranthambore

After breakfast, journey to Ranthambore, previously the hunting ground of the Maharaja of Jaipur, before being listed among the reserves protected under Project Tiger. Surrounded by the Vindhya and Aravali hill ranges and located close to the fringes of the Thar Desert, Ranthambore offers you the best desert land and plains for wildlife viewing.

Ranthambore was declared a game sanctuary in 1955. In 1980, it was declared a national park and listed among the reserves protected under Project Tiger. This evening, settle in and watch a short documentary film on Project Tiger and the National Park.

Today's driving time/distance is approximately 6 hours/270km.

Overnight: Ranthambore (Standard or Premium Option)

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 10 Ranthambore National Park

After breakfast, head out on a morning safari (by canter) to search for the elusive tiger. The park authorities monitor and control entry to specific areas within Ranthambore to ensure a limited number of jeeps and canters are allowed in, thereby increasing the chance of wildlife sightings.

This afternoon is yours at leisure, or join an optional activity.

Optional Activity: Afternoon Wildlife Safari

Search for wildlife, including the elusive Bengal tiger, during an afternoon game safari. Sit back and join your naturalist guide, and take the opportunity to see the wildlife and bird species in the national park. The park authorities monitor and control entry to

The town's present name, Abhaneri, is believed to be a mispronunciation of 'Abha Nagri' or the 'city of brightness'. Here you will visit the famous Chand Baori Step Well – opposite a temple called Harshat Mata Temple. It extends approximately 30m into the ground, making it one of India's most profound and largest stepwells.

On arrival in Agra, check into the hotel. This afternoon, enjoy a visit to Agra Fort (Red Fort). A fascinating sight, it showcases a high level of ornamentation, with the Kohinoor diamond reportedly part of the furnishings at some point. The fort's artwork mixes Persian, European, and Indian art, resulting in a unique Shahjahani style rich in form, expression, and colour.

Agra Fort is one of India's building complexes, encapsulating a long period of history, arts, and innovative architectural style, including its garden design, which influenced later buildings and gardens in Delhi. In 1983, it was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Today, enjoy the world-famous city of Agra at



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leisure or choose from optional activities. Later this evening, enjoy dinner with your fellow travellers. Today's driving time/distance is approximately 5 hours/240km.

Optional Activity: Visit Baby Taj & Mehtab Bagh

Jahan promoted the use of white marble inlaid with semi-precious stones. Shah Jahan commissioned the Taj Mahal in 1631 to be built in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. Construction began in 1632, the principal mausoleum was completed in 1643, and the surrounding buildings and garden were finished about five years later.

Surrounded by the Vindhya and Aravali hill ranges and located close to the fringes of the Thar Desert, Ranthambore offers you the best desert land and plains for wildlife viewing.

Ranthambore was declared a game sanctuary in 1955. In 1980, it was declared a national park and listed among the reserves protected under Project Tiger. This evening, settle in and watch a short documentary film on Project Tiger and the National Park.

- Summer: April, May, June. Expect hot temperatures, very low to moderate humidity and low precipitation.
- Autumn: October, November. A pleasant climate characterised by warm days, cool nights, low humidity and low precipitation.
- Winter: December, January. Typically cool to cold temperatures with moderate humidity and low precipitation.

Important Information

- Spring: February, March. Expect a pleasant climate with warm days, cool nights, low to moderate humidity and moderate precipitation.

FLIGHTS

Seat Selection & Frequent Flyer Points

At TripADeal we do not arrange seat selection. It is essential to highlight that some airlines do not allow pre-selected seats. We strongly suggest you contact the airline directly with seating allocation requirements and/or arrive at the airport earlier to arrange your seating. While we do not add frequent flyer member details to bookings, you can do this directly with the airline once you have your flight information.

Passport Validity

Mobility

Visas

India
