The cruise continues to St Anthony, the Arctic gateway famous for "Iceberg Alley," before the North Atlantic crossing towards the spectacular wilderness of Greenland. Delve into the UNESCO-listed Kujataa region, with stops at

Narsarsuaq and Qassiarsuk, home to Erik the Red's 10th-century Viking estate, alongside the colonial charm of Qaqortoq.

A stop in Reykjavik, Iceland, allows for exploration of this diminutive but dramatic capital before the second phenomenal voyage begins. The ship sails to the majestic Dynjandi Waterfall and the bustling fishing town of Isafjordur. A visit to Griimsey Island provides the thrill of stepping into the Arctic Circle, complemented by the wildlife of Hrisey Island and the whale-watching hub of Husavik.

The final leg journeys to the breathtaking landscapes of Norway. Explore Bodo, known for its Sami heritage, witness the sheer power of the Svartisen Glacier. Discover the stunning Lofoten islands, where red fishermen's cabins are nestled amid dramatic granite peaks in Vaeroy and Reine. A spectacular scenic cruise through the narrow Trollfjorden precedes arrival in the Arctic gateway of Tromso for a final overnight before the journey home.



Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) - Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada

Today make your own way to the airport for your flight to Halifax, Nova Scotia. Upon arrival a transfer is arranged for your two night city stay. Once checked in, the remainder of your day is at leisure.

Enjoy a day at leisure in Halifax!

Founded as a naval base in 1749, Halifax's seafaring history is well-grounded with the Canadian Museum of Immigration, where one million Europeans landed up until 1971, and the Noon Gun that has fired from the Citadel fortress since 1857. When the Titanic struck the iceberg at 11:40 pm, April 14, 1912, ships set sail from here. Many victims are buried at Fairview Lawn Cemetery, while the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic displays rescued artefacts.

Day 5 Saint-Pierre, Saint Pierre & Miguelon

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 14:00

Saint Pierre and Miquelon, a French archipelago south of Newfoundland, offers diverse landscapes and rich biodiversity. The main island, Saint Pierre, serves as the capital and includes a cathedral and the Musee Heritage offering a glimpse into the region's past. Marked trails traverse bogs, subarctic meadows, undergrowth, and coastal paths with chances to spot seals, dolphins, whales and rorquals. Over 300 bird species inhabit the archipelago.

Day 6 St John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 15:00

St. John's, North America's easternmost city and capital of Newfoundland and Labrador, traces its history to John Cabot's 1497 voyage. Thriving in the 18th and 19th centuries with the cod fishing industry, the town's architecture, like the row houses on George Street, echoes its maritime past. Water Street, once a bustling port, now hosts shops and galleries in converted warehouses. Signal Hill provides views of the city's colourful houses.

Day 7 St Anthony, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada

Arrive: 14:00 - Depart: 19:00

Newfoundland's former fishing village of St. Anthony, dating back to the 16th-century, brims with excitement despite its sleepy facade. This Arctic gateway comes alive in April to June, offering front-row views to a dazzling natural wonder, the flowing Iceberg Alley, where towering frozen giants glide past. With free time you could marvel at these glacial spectacles from Fishing Point. The Grenfell Museum chronicles the life of British Dr. Grenfell's medical missions.

Day 10 Narsarsuag & Qassiarsuk, Greenland

Narsarsuag

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 12:00

Narsarsuaq is a small settlement in southern Greenland, known for its striking natural beauty and historical significance. Located at the head of the Tunulliarfik Fjord, it was originally established as a U.S. airbase during World War II. Today, it serves as a gateway to South Greenland, with an airport that connects the remote region to the rest of the country. Surrounded by dramatic landscapes, glaciers, and Norse ruins, Narsarsuaq is a popular starting point for hiking and exploring Greenland's rich Viking history.

Qassiarsuk

Arrive: 14:00 - Depart: 19:00

Qassiarsuk's Norse ruins of Brattahlíð, founded by Viking explorer Erik the Red, draw visitors to this Greenlandic village on Tunulliarfik Fjord. Erik's 10th-century estate grew into a 5,000-person Viking settlement, once Greenland's largest. Traces of Norse relics dot the landscape, accompanied by a statue of Erik. Qassiarsuk's subarctic mix of Norse and Greenlandic farming on the Edge of the Ice Cap is part of UNESCO-listed Kujataa Greenland.

Day 11 Qaqortoq, Greenland

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 14:00

Qaqortoq is the largest city in South Greenland and the perfect base to explore the Norse (Viking) ruins encompassed by the extensive UNESCO-listed Kujataa World Heritage Site, a subarctic farming landscape. The town is home to 18th-century colonial buildings and the oldest fountain in Greenland; completed in 1932, it depicts whales spouting water out of their blowholes. Qaqortoq Museum in the town's oldest building focuses on early settlers.

Day 14 Disembark Reykjavik, Iceland - Embark SH 'Vega' Disembark: 08:00 - Depart: 18:00

After breakfast this morning please disembark and enjoy the day at leisure in Reykjavik before returning at the appropriate time to re-embark your second voyage through to Tromso.

Make sure there is sufficient time to explore this diminutive but dramatic capital city. Despite its small size, you won't be short of things to see and do. To get your bearings, take the elevator to the top of Hallgrimskirkja. This church, designed by famed Icelandic architect Gudjon Samuelsson is one of the most distinctive buildings in town. You could also visit the city's other renowned building, the Harpa Concert Hall, located at the heart of Reykjavík's regenerated harbour – also the home of the Maritime Museum. Speaking of cultural spaces, you could visit the National Museum to learn the story of Iceland from past to present. The Reykjavík Art Museum houses an impressive contemporary collection including eye-catching pieces by Erro. And, of course, just 50 kilometres outside the city lies Thingvellir National Park, the site of Iceland's original Viking parliament.

Once back on board, settle in for your next cruise on board the SH Vega.

Day 15 Dynjandi Waterfall, Iceland

Arrive: 12:00 - Depart: 23:00

Considered one of Iceland's most impressive falls, the thunderous Dynjandi waterfall in the Westfjords region gives the impression of a bridal veil as it spreads down ever-growing cascades. The walk takes 15 minutes passing five smaller waterfalls.

Surrounded by fjords in the Westfjords region, Isafjorour is a bustling fishing town and cultural centre in northwest Iceland with cafés, restaurants and museums. The Heritage Museum, also known as the Maritime Museum, houses some of the country's oldest buildings and explores the region's fishing heritage through compelling exhibits. Nearby, Osvor is a replica of a 19th-century Icelandic fishing station.

Grimsey Island

Grimsey is a remote island located 40 kilometres off Iceland's north coast. Many people travel here for the purpose of setting foot in the Arctic Circle, the only place in Iceland where you can. The island is also home to fewer than 100 people, but over one million seabirds. Birdlife thrives here thanks to the lack of egg predation and the well-stocked surrounding seas. Grimsey has one of Iceland's largest tern nesting sites and largest puffin colonies.

Hrisey Island

Arrive: 16:30 - Depart: 23:59

Hrisey Island is a small island in the Eyjafjordur fjord in northern Iceland. It is home to various wildlife, including various birdlife, seals and whales. Hriseyjarfjall is the highest point and offers views of the surrounding landscape and the vast expanse of Eyjafjorour fjord. Despite its size, Hrisey Island possesses a rich cultural heritage. Traditional Icelandic crafts, such as hand-knitting and woodworking, preserve the island's identity.

Day 18 Husavik, Iceland

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 18:00

Husavik, overlooking Skjalfandi Bay, is famed for whale watching, especially the endangered blue whale. The town's Whale Museum and Exploration Museum focus on Viking history and Apollo astronaut training, taking place nearby. The town also marks Iceland's first house from 860 AD. Husavik is on the Arctic Coast Way and the start of the Diamond Circle route. Nearby, Kaldbakur pond is a popular geothermal swimming spot oddly populated with goldfish.

Day 21 Bodo, Norway

Arrive: 12:00 - Depart: 23:00

Bodo highlights its Sami heritage and connects the arts to its Arctic setting. Rebuilt after the 1940 bombing in modernist "reconstruction" style, Bodo's architectural commitment endures with the 2014-built Stormen concert hall and Molobyen, a new waterfront cultural hub. Surrounded by natural landscapes, Bodo lies near the world-famous maelstrom of Saltstraumen, a powerful whirlpool on the Saltsfjorden strongest when the tides change daily.

Day 22 Svartisen Glacier, Norway

Arrive: 08:00 - Depart: 18:00

The mighty Svartisen glacier, Norway's second biggest, pours down the mountain almost to Svartisvatnet lake. The glacier visitor centre is a fascinating place with access to hikes along the edge of the ice flow, up to 200 metres thick. Glorious Holandsfjord is just the other end of a short channel from the lake and the ship has stirring views. The little village of Holandsvika sits across the fjord, with an 18-kilometre lakeside path and boat trips.

Day 23 Vaeroy & Reine, Lofoten, Norway

Vaeroy

Arrive: 07:00 - Depart: 12:30

Remote Vaeroy island packs Lofoten's essence into one spectacular destination. Sorland serves as the island centre with shops, restaurants and handicrafts. This fishing village produces famous stockfish traded with Venice. Notable sites include the steep Haheia mountain, which offers panoramic views of Vestfjord, the abandoned village of Mastad (home of the rare Puffin dog), Lofoten's oldest church, and ancient caves once used for eagle trapping.

Reine

Arrive: 15:00 - Depart: 23:59

With red fishermen's cabins nestled on the shores of Reinefjord amid dramatic granite peaks, Reine is celebrated as one of the world's most beautiful places. The village serves as a starting point for hikes like the Reinebringen trail, offering panoramic views of the vertical granite Lofoten Islands rising from the Arctic Sea. Nearby, the fishing village of Å houses the Norwegian Fishing Village Museum.

Day 24 Svolvaer, Lofoten, Norway - Trollfjorden, Norway (Scenic Cruising)

Svolvaer

Svolvaer is a classic Norwegian fishing port, tucked away on Austvagoya in the Lofoten Islands. Surrounded by peaks and beaches, bays and craggy inlets, it's an age-old picture, a jumble of white and red clapboard houses, the clear water filled with

little, bobbing boats. Popular with mountain climbers, the town's mountain Floya commands a spectacular viewpoint across the harbour and Vestfjord.

Trollfjorden (Scenic Cruising):

Trollfjorden is unbelievable. A 100 metre-wide entrance to a narrow fjord with near-vertical mountainous sides up to 1,100 metres high, the passage slices through Austvagoya, on the edge of the Lofoten Islands. As the ship enters the fjord, the silence is only broken by the gentle sound of the ship's engines and the occasional cry of a white-tailed eagle soaring overhead. At the end of the fjord, the ship slowly spins, offering a final captivating view.

Day 25 Tromso, Norway (Overnight)

Arrive: 09:00

The Arctic gateway, Tromso at 69 degrees north, is renowned for the midnight sun in summer and the Northern Lights in winter. The Arctic Cathedral, with stained-glass windows, hosts midnight concerts. The Fjellheisen cable car offers panoramic views from Mount Storsteinen, while the historic centre features old wooden houses. The Polar Museum chronicles early polar explorations, and the thriving Alpine Botanic Garden adds to Tromso's charm.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Halifax, Canada

In May, Halifax typically experiences mild and pleasant weather. Average daytime temperatures range from 8°C to 15°C, while nighttime temperatures can drop to around 3°C to 8°C. You can expect a mix of sunny days and occasional rain, as May marks the transition from spring to early summer.

Newfoundland, Canada

In May, Newfoundland experiences cool and variable weather as it transitions from spring to early summer. Average daytime temperatures range from 5°C to 12°C, while nighttime temperatures can drop to around 0°C to 5°C. Rain is common, and there may still be some snow in more northern or inland areas. Coastal areas may also experience fog, especially in the mornings.

Greenland

In May, Greenland generally has cold weather, with average daytime temperatures ranging from -2°C to 5°C, depending on the region. Coastal areas may experience slightly milder temperatures, while inland or more northern areas tend to remain colder. Snowfall is still possible, and conditions can be windy, especially in open or higheraltitude areas. As the month progresses, daylight hours increase significantly, marking the beginning of the Arctic summer season.

Iceland

In June, Iceland experiences mild and relatively pleasant weather, with average

daytime temperatures ranging from 8°C to 15°C. Coastal areas, such as Reykjavik, typically have temperatures around 10°C to 13°C, while the interior and higher elevations may be cooler. June is one of the driest months in Iceland, but rain is still possible, and the weather can be quite changeable, with a mix of sunshine, clouds, and occasional showers. This is also the time of the midnight sun, providing nearly 24 hours of daylight, making it ideal for outdoor activities and exploration.

Lofoten, Norway

In June, daytime temperatures are mild, ranging from 9°C to 15°C, with nights remaining cool at around 7°C to 10°C. The weather can be unpredictable, offering a mix of sunny days, cloud, and rain showers, though it is one of the drier months.

Visas

Canada

Australian and New Zealand passport holders must apply for an electronic travel authorisation (eTA) before travelling to Canada by air. An Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) is an entry requirement for visa-exempt foreign nationals travelling to Canada by air. An eTA is electronically linked to a traveller's passport. It is valid for up to five years or until the passport expires, whichever comes first. If you get a new passport, you need to get a new eTA.

United States

If travelling on an Australian passport, an ESTA (Visa Waiver) for the USA is a strict requirement when travelling to or flying through the USA. Once a USA ESTA Visa Waiver is issued it is valid for 2 years or until your passport expires (whichever is sooner) and will allow multiple entries into the USA.

Greenland

A tourist visa is not required for Greenland for stays up to 90 days if travelling on an Australian passport.

Schengen Area (Including Iceland & Norway)

Australian passport holders are visa exempt for an accumulative total stay of 90 days per 180 calendar days. The traveller must hold a passport valid at least six months on entry with two blank visa pages.

Eu Entry/exit System (ees)

From October 12, 2025, a new European Entry System (EES) replaces the current manual passport-stamping process for non-EU travelers. Upon arrival in the Schengen area, Australian and New Zealand passport holders will have their fingerprints recorded and a photograph taken. Their entry and exit dates will be electronically registered. No previous action is required, but please be aware of longer wait times at border entry. From 10 April 2026, the EES will be fully operational at all external border crossing points of all the European countries (Schengen area) using the system.

European Travel Information & Authorisation System (ETIAS)

As an extension of the EES implementation introduced from 2025, ETIAS travel authorisation is a mandatory entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals travelling to any of these 30 European countries, including Australian and New Zealand citizens, that will be introduced in 2026. We advise you to monitor smartraveller.com.au closer to your departure to ensure you are up to date on the requirements at the time of entry.

Important:

 Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.



- Visa rules are subject to change. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination/s you are visiting once you receive your travel documentation to ensure you have the most up to date information.
- It is your responsibility to be travel-ready and ensure that you are aware and comply with any destination or travel requirements, including the validity of all required travel documents.
