Day 1 Australia (or New Zealand) – Beijing, China

Today, depart for Beijing, China. Upon arrival, a tour representative will meet you at the airport and transfer you to the hotel.

Day 2 Tiananmen Square & Forbidden City (or Temple of Heaven)

After breakfast, visit Tiananmen Square, one of the largest public squares in the world. Then head to the Imperial Palace in the Forbidden City, known officially as the Imperial Palace Museum. This was originally constructed by Emperor Yong Le, the third Emperor of the Ming Dynasty. The palace was built between 1406 and 1420 but has been renovated countless times. This means that most of the architecture you see today dates from the 1700's and onwards.

In the event that tickets can not be secured, you'll visit The Temple of Heaven instead. The Temple of Heaven, founded in the first half of the 15th century, is a dignified complex of fine cult buildings set in gardens and surrounded by historic pine woods. In its overall layout and that of its individual buildings, it

symbolises the relationship between earth and heaven (the human world and God's world). It stands at the heart of Chinese cosmogony and the special role played by the emperors within that relationship.

Optional Tour: Summer Palace and Beijing Zoo with Dinner

Take a trip to the majestic Summer Palace, a beautiful UNESCO World Heritage site and a masterpiece of Chinese landscape garden design. The natural landscape of hills and open water is combined with artificial features such as pavilions, halls, palaces, temples and bridges to form a harmonious ensemble of outstanding aesthetic value.

Then head to the Panda House, the crown jewel of Beijing Zoo. Since the successful captive breeding of the first giant panda in 1963, and the world's first successful artificial insemination in 1978, the zoo has been at the forefront of panda conservation.

Finish with a delicious dinner experience that will allow you to savour authentic regional flavours.

Day 3 Great Wall of China

After breakfast, head to a Jade Museum to learn about this precious gemstone. In Chinese, jade is pronounced as “Yu” and has a history of at least four thousand years in China. Observe skilled artisans at work as they create their intricate designs.

Afterwards, enjoy a scenic drive through the countryside and mountains to reach China’s most renowned monument, the Great Wall. Along the way, you’ll stop for a delicious Peking duck lunch, one of Beijing’s most famous dishes (vegetarian options will be available also). On arrival at the Great Wall, you will visit the less-busy and more original Juyong Pass, avoiding other sections that are the most accessible and consequently most crowded. The Great Wall meanders through China’s northern mountain ranges from the Yellow Sea to the Gobi Desert, a distance of more than 5,600 kilometres.

Optional Activity: Hutong Pedicab Tour & Dinner

In the afternoon, take the opportunity to join an optional tour of Beijing’s 700-year-old Hutongs (narrow lanes) area by old-fashioned pedicab. You will also visit a local family living in a courtyard-style home to experience the local customs, including a delicious home-cooked dinner. Suzhou has a history dating back to 514 BC and is often referred to as 'Venice of the East'. Here you'll visit the famous UNESCO-listed Lingering Garden before stopping by a silk spinning factory as China is renowned for its exquisite silk.

In the afternoon, drive approximately 40 kilometres to Wuxi and visit Lihu Park, a serene oasis nestled along the picturesque shores of Lake Lihu. Here you'll find lush greenery, scenic walking paths and charming bridges, take time to admire the peaceful views as you spot locals cycling around the lake, fishing and boating along the water.

Optional Activity: Grand Canal Cruise

Take the opportunity to cruise along the Grand Canal to view life along China's ancient waterway. This activity is not included and must be paid on tour. Please see current pricing in Important Information.

This is a chance to enjoy the natural environment and beautiful village scenery while learning more about their special tea culture. At the Tea House, learn how to make Longjing Tea including picking, frying and tasting the tea leaves.

Maizuru serves as an excellent, less-crowded gateway for excursions to one of Japan's most famous natural sights: Amanohashidate, the "Bridge to the Heavens," a stunning pine-covered sandbar considered one of the Three Views of Japan.

Niigata, also known as the "Land of Rice and Sake," a historic port city on the Sea of Japan celebrated for its world-class Koshihikari rice, top-tier sake breweries, and exceptional seafood. Within the city centre, you can easily access key attractions such as the Befco Bakauke Observatory at Toki Messe for free, 360-degree panoramic view of the city and the Shinano River, or walk the historic Bandai Bridge, which connects the old Furumachi district to the modern Bandai City. A must-do is a visit to Ponshukan inside Niigata Station, where you can famously sample over 100 varieties of local sake from vending machines, followed by tasting the city's celebrated Kiwami Sushi platter (not included), which showcases the freshest local catches and premium rice.

For a deeper cultural dive, consider exploring the city's rich history through its beautiful architecture and arts; you can tour the sprawling, aristocratic former residence now known as the Northern Culture Museum to see the wealth of the region's historic farming families, or stroll the atmospheric Nuttari Terrace Street and the old Furumachi District, which is one of the remaining districts in Japan to preserve the tradition of Geigi (Geisha) dance performances. The port area also conveniently

features Pia Bandai, a lively direct-sales market where you can shop for fresh seafood, local produce, and unique regional snacks, perfectly representing Niigata's proud culinary heritage.

The two main attractions are the magnificent Mount Hakodate, renowned globally for its Michelin three-star panoramic view of the city nestled between two bays (accessible via a quick 3-minute ropeway ride from the lower station), and the historic Goryokaku Park, a massive, star-shaped, Western-style fortress that is breathtaking when viewed from the top of the Goryokaku Tower (charges apply).

Hakodate's port area is exceptionally accessible, often offering free shuttle buses to the downtown core near JR Hakodate Station, which is the perfect starting point for your day. Steps away from the station lies the vibrant Hakodate Morning Market (Asa-ichi), a must-visit culinary hub where you can sample fresh-caught squid (the city's mascot), sea urchin, and other Hokkaido specialties, or even try the unique experience of fishing for your own squid.

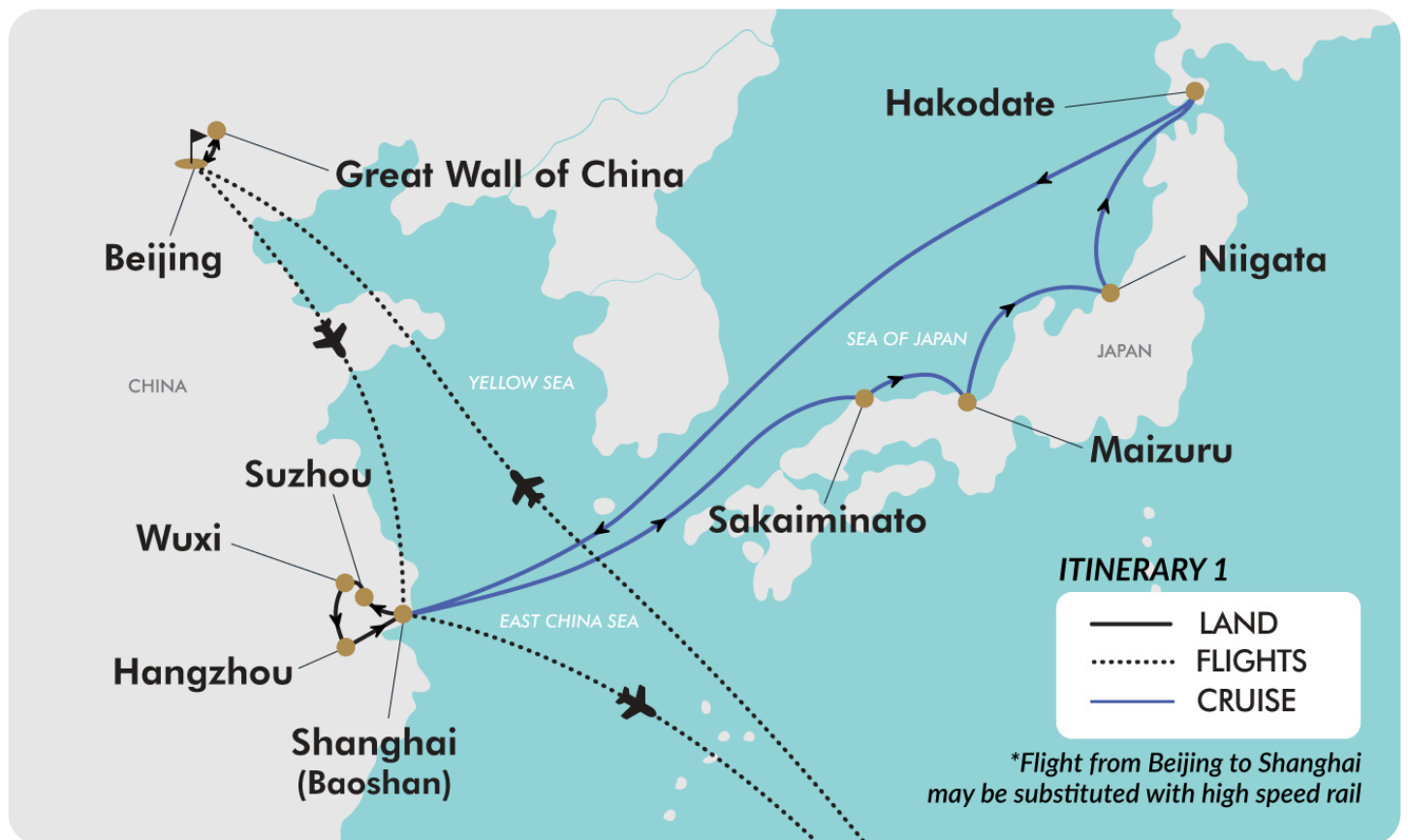

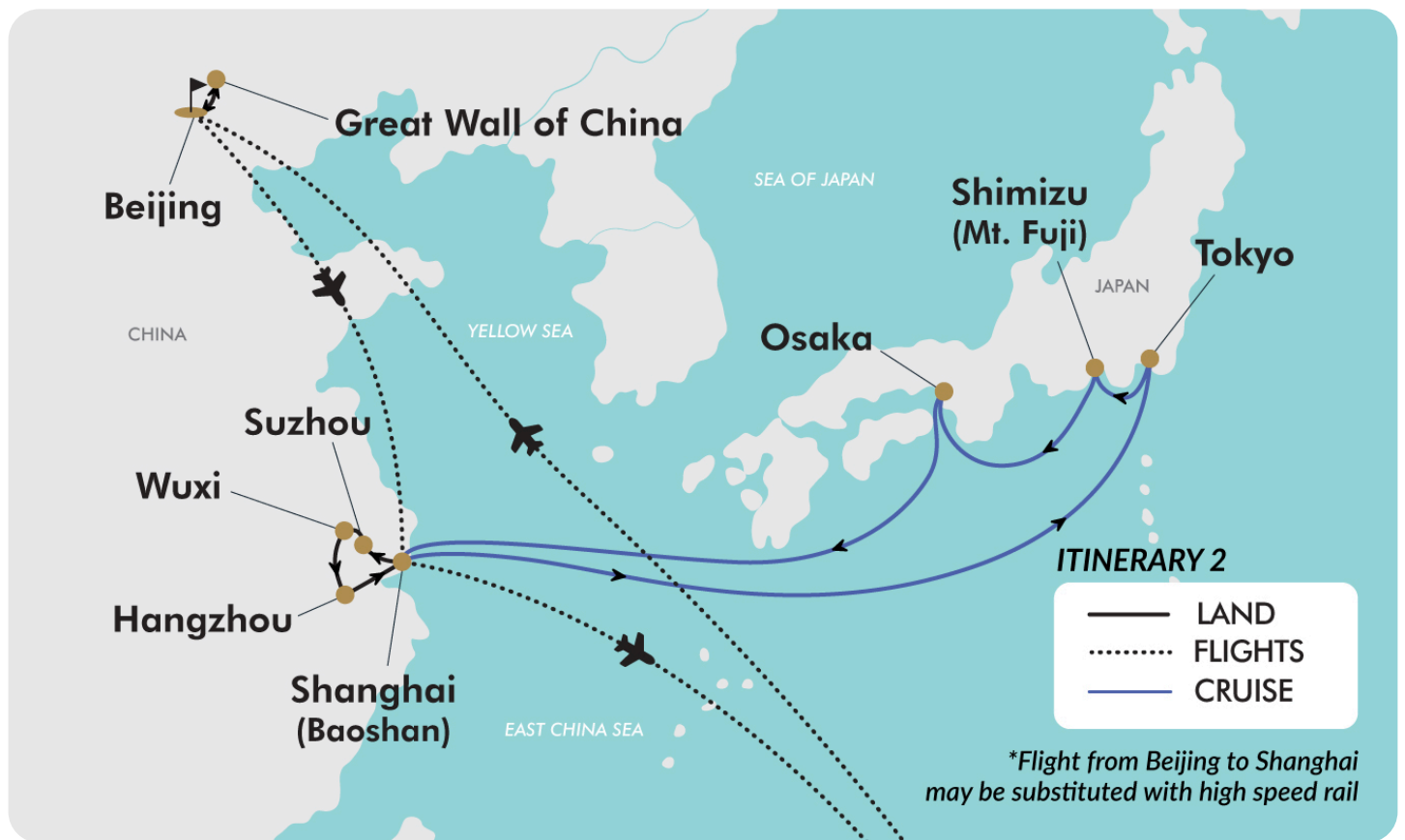

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Beijing, China

Beijing has a temperate and continental monsoon climate, with four distinct seasons and big differences in temperature between day and night. The seasons: Summer in Beijing is hot and humid, while winter is cold and dry. Spring and autumn are short and cool. The coldest month is January at an average of -4 °C, and the hottest month is July at an average of 26 °C.

Shanghai, China

Shanghai's weather is generally mild and moist, with four distinctive seasons - a pleasant warm spring, a hot rainy summer, a comfortable cool autumn, and an overcast cold winter. The weather in Shanghai in July and August is the hottest, with more than 10 days of high temperatures above 35°C. The coldest period is from late January to early February. Springtime from March to May is recommended as the best time to visit, while October to November, with a pleasant autumn climate, is also a wise choice.

Japan

Japan has four distinct seasons with a climate ranging from subarctic in the north to subtropical in the south. Conditions are different between the Pacific side and the Sea of Japan side. Northern Japan has warm summers and very cold winters with heavy snow on the Sea of Japan's side and in mountainous areas. Eastern Japan has hot and humid summers and cold winters with very heavy snow on the Sea of Japan side and in mountainous areas. Western Japan has very hot and humid summers (with temperatures sometimes reaching 35°C or above) and moderately cold winters. Okinawa and Amami have a

subtropical oceanic climate. These areas have hot and humid summers (with temperatures rarely reaching 35°C or above) and mild winters.

Weather

We always suggest referring to an online source for the most up-to-date weather information for your destination/s.

FLIGHTS

Seat Selection & Frequent Flyer Points:

We do not arrange seat selection. It is essential to highlight that some airlines do not allow pre-selected seats. Visas

China

Australian and New Zealand citizens qualify for Visa-free travel to China for stays up to 30 days. The visa exemption is set to expire on the 31st December 2026. Eligibility criteria will apply. Please consult Smart Traveller and your nearest Chinese consulate for up-to-date eligibility criteria and information.

Chinese Citizens

All Chinese passport holders are required to provide a clear copy or scan of their Chinese Resident Identity Card at least 4 weeks prior to departure. Additionally, you must carry your physical Resident Identity Card with you during your travels, in addition to your passport. It is important to note that certain major sites, such as The Forbidden City, strictly require a Chinese Resident Identity Card for all Chinese citizens in order to book tickets. Please be aware that if this ID is not provided in time, you may be unable to participate in these activities.

Japan

A tourist visa is not required for Australian or New Zealand citizens visiting Japan for stays of up to 90 days for tourism, business, visiting friends or relatives, etc. that does not include remunerative activities.

Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
- *Visa rules are subject to change. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination/s you are visiting once you receive your travel documentation to ensure you have the most up to date information.*

- *It is your responsibility to be travel-ready and ensure that you are aware and comply with any destination or travel requirements, including the validity of all required travel documents.*
- *Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.*
- *It is also important to note that some areas of employment, such as journalism, government authorities and charity organisations, may have additional restrictions in applying for visas. This may, in turn, affect the type of application required.*
