Day 1 Meet us in London, England

Meet us in London after making your own way to the hotel. If it is too early for check-in, then luggage can be stored at the hotel while you explore this magnificent historic city.

Overnight: St Giles London Hotel or similar, London

Day 2 London City Tour

Today, enjoy a panoramic tour of London, a city steeped in history, bursting with culture and home to some of the world's most iconic landmarks.

On this immersive sightseeing journey, you'll pass by a stunning array of famous sites, including the Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square, Nelson's Column, Marble Arch, and many more. No trip to London is complete without experiencing the Changing of the Guard at Buckingham Palace, a quintessential British tradition full of pomp and pageantry.

Watch as the Queen's Guard, dressed in their signature red tunics and bearskin hats, are relieved by the New Guard from Wellington Barracks in a 45-minute ceremony accompanied by stirring military music and precise marching formations. This unforgettable spectacle draws visitors from around the world.

Please note: The Changing of the Guard typically takes place on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays. If it does not coincide with your visit, we will substitute it with a visit to one of London's world-renowned museums or galleries, such as the British Museum, the National Gallery, or the Tate Modern.

Day 3 London - Bath - Bristol

This morning, depart London and begin the journey to Bristol, stopping en route in the historic city of Bath, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its elegant Georgian architecture and rich Roman heritage.

On arrival in Bath, enjoy a visit to the world-famous Roman Baths, among the best-preserved Roman remains anywhere in the world. Built in AD 70 over natural hot springs, this remarkable site still receives over a million litres of steaming spring water daily from the 12,000-year-old King's Spring below.

Wander through the ancient bathing complex just as the Romans did over two millennia ago. Interact with engaging exhibits and meet costumed characters who bring history to life. For the curious, there's even the chance to sample the mineral-rich spa water, famed for its healing properties, if not its taste! Or simply relax with refreshments at the elegant Pump Room restaurant and cafe.

After your visit, enjoy free time to explore Bath at your own pace. You might stroll along the beautiful Royal Crescent, browse charming boutiques, or sip tea in one of the city's quaint cafes. In the afternoon, travel onward to Bristol and check in to your hotel.

Day 4 Bristol - The Cotswolds - Stratford-upon-Avon

This morning, leave Bristol behind and journey towards Stratford-upon-Avon, travelling through the heart of the Cotswolds, one of England's most treasured landscapes and a designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Enjoy a scenic drive through this idyllic region, known for its rolling green hills, historic market towns and iconic honey-coloured limestone cottages. Along the way, stop to explore one of the Cotswolds' picture-perfect villages, perhaps Castle Combe, Broadway, or Chipping Campden, where you'll find welcoming cafes, quaint shops, traditional pubs, and charming market squares.

Arriving in Stratford-upon-Avon, step into the world of William Shakespeare with a visit to his birthplace, a beautifully preserved 16th-century half-timbered house where the legendary playwright was born and spent his early years. Discover fascinating exhibitions featuring Shakespearean artefacts and personal memorabilia, including the only known portrait of the Bard. Tour the house, then enjoy time in the lovely gardens, browse the gift shop, or relax in the on-site cafe.

Today, you'll travel approximately 140 kilometres.

Day 5 Stratford-upon-Avon - York

This morning, depart Stratford-upon-Avon and journey north to York, one of England's most historically rich and atmospheric cities.

Upon arrival, enjoy a guided walking tour that brings over 2,000 years of history to life. Founded by the Romans in AD 71, York has served as a Roman fortress, a Viking stronghold, and a thriving medieval city, and traces of each era can still be seen throughout its streets today. Stroll along the city's medieval walls, visit the hauntingly beautiful ruins of 11th-century Saint Mary's Abbey, and admire the striking exterior of York Minster, one of the largest and most magnificent Gothic cathedrals in Northern Europe.

As you explore, weave through the narrow, cobbled lanes of the city centre, including the famous Shambles, lined with timber-framed buildings that lean so closely together they almost touch. Discover whimsically named streets like Whip-Ma-Whop-Ma-Gate and hear captivating tales of York's turbulent past, from plagues and civil wars to invasions by Roman, Viking, Norman, and Scottish forces. After your walking tour, enjoy free time to soak in the city's unique charm. You can stroll through the tranquil York Museum Gardens, nestled beside the ruins of Saint Mary's Abbey, or relax along the peaceful banks of the River Ouse.

Today, you'll travel approximately 245 kilometres.

Don't miss the on-site museum, home to the remarkable Corbridge Hoard: a buried Roman chest filled with exceptionally well-preserved armour, weapons and tools. This extraordinary discovery is often described as a "Roman time capsule," capturing a moment in history with astonishing clarity.

Next, stop in the charming market town of Alnwick. Take some time to explore the town or admire its famous Alnwick Castle, an architectural gem known to many as Hogwarts in the Harry Potter films.

After your visit, continue your journey into Scotland and arrive in Edinburgh, a city steeped in history, elegance, and cultural flair.

Your first stop is the magnificent Stirling Castle, one of Scotland's grandest and most historically significant castles. Perched high on a volcanic crag, it dominates the landscape and overlooks legendary battlefields such as Stirling Bridge – where William Wallace triumphed in 1297 – and Bannockburn, where Robert the Bruce secured a crucial victory in 1314. Steeped in drama and history, Stirling Castle has been home to generations of Scottish monarchs, including Mary, Queen of Scots. Its powerful position and architectural splendour make it a proud symbol of Scottish independence and national pride.

Next, experience the natural beauty of Loch Lomond, the largest freshwater lake in mainland Britain. Set against a backdrop of rugged mountains to the north and dotted with charming islands to the south, Loch Lomond is best appreciated from the water. Relax on a scenic cruise as you take in views of tranquil villages, ancient oak woodlands and the serene beauty of this beloved Scottish loch.

Upon arrival in Glasgow, enjoy a short panoramic tour of this dynamic city. Discover its fascinating contrasts – from the medieval grandeur of St Mungo's Cathedral to the civic beauty of Glasgow Green and the People's Palace. Admire the Victorian architecture of the bustling city centre, then continue to the leafy West End, home to the stunning Kelvingrove Park and the striking buildings of Glasgow University. Explore the city that gave the world Charles Rennie Mackintosh, one of Scotland's most celebrated architects, whose legacy is felt throughout the streets of this creative and energetic metropolis.

Day 9 Glasgow - Belfast, Northern Ireland

This morning, depart Glasgow and travel south to Cairnryan (approximately 120 kilometres), where you'll disembark the coach with your luggage and board a ferry as foot passengers for the scenic crossing to Northern Ireland.

Upon arrival in Belfast, begin your exploration of this vibrant and historic city. Your first stop is the award-winning Titanic Belfast, an unmissable attraction located in the heart of the city's Titanic Quarter. Rising from the very spot where the RMS Titanic was designed, built, and launched, this striking six-storey structure tells the full story of the world's most famous ocean liner.

Inside, embark on a self-guided journey through nine interactive galleries that bring the Titanic's tale to life, from her conception and construction in early 20th-century Belfast to her ill-fated maiden voyage and enduring legacy. Walk through full-scale reconstructions, view fascinating exhibits, and immerse yourself in the sights, sounds, and stories of a bygone era. The experience offers a powerful insight into Belfast's shipbuilding heritage and the people whose lives were forever shaped by the Titanic.

Day 10 Belfast & The Causeway Coast

This morning, set out on a panoramic guided tour to discover the highlights of Belfast, Northern Ireland's dynamic capital.

Your tour takes in some of the city's most iconic landmarks, including the leaning Albert Memorial Clock, often dubbed Ireland's answer to the Tower of Pisa and the beautifully restored Grand Opera House. Pass by the elegant City Hall, the famous Crown Liquor Saloon (dating back to 1885), and Queen's University with its impressive architecture. Stroll through the Botanic Gardens, a tranquil green space in the heart of the city.

For a deeper understanding of Belfast's complex past, the tour may also include a visit to the Harland & Wolff Shipyard, where the RMS Titanic was built, and the politically significant Shankill and Falls Roads, which provide insight into the city's history during the Troubles through powerful murals and storytelling. In the afternoon, leave the city behind as you journey along the stunning Causeway Coast to one of Northern Ireland's most extraordinary natural wonders: the Giant's Causeway.

According to legend, the giant Finn McCool built this remarkable landscape of 40,000 interlocking basalt columns to create a path to Scotland.

In reality, the Causeway was formed by intense volcanic activity some 60 million years ago – but the myths remain part of its enduring magic. Your visit includes entry to the Giant's Causeway Visitor Centre, a state-of-the-art facility where interactive exhibits, video presentations, and an awe-inspiring volcanic eruption projection help bring the geology and folklore of the site to life. Take a self-guided walk down to the stones themselves. There's also time to browse the craft and souvenir shop or relax in the on-site café before returning to Belfast (approximately 180km return).

Day 11 Belfast, Northern Ireland - Dublin, Republic of Ireland

This morning, depart Belfast and travel south to the vibrant capital of the Republic of Ireland, Dublin.

Upon arrival, enjoy a panoramic city tour showcasing the highlights of both the north and south sides of the River Liffey. On the north side, discover striking landmarks such as the General Post Office on O'Connell Street and the grand Custom House lining the quays. You'll also pass through Phoenix Park, one of Europe's largest enclosed urban parks.

Crossing to the south side, admire the elegant Georgian architecture, particularly around Merrion Square – once home to Oscar Wilde and now owned by an American college. Take in the charm of colourful Georgian doors, the bustling shopping haven of Grafton Street, and nearby St. Stephen's Green. Just off Kildare Street, you'll spot the former residence of Bram Stoker, famed author of Dracula. This quarter is also home to Trinity College, which houses the renowned Book of Kells within its historic library.

The tour continues into the medieval heart of Dublin, where you'll see Dublin Castle and the city's two impressive Anglican cathedrals. Conclude your Dublin experience with a visit to the world-famous Guinness Storehouse. Located at the Guinness Brewery, the largest stout-producing facility in Europe, the Storehouse offers an engaging and interactive journey through the story of Ireland's iconic beer. Learn about the ingredients, brewing process, and the craftsmanship behind every pint.

TOUR GUIDE VS. TOUR LEADER

Tour Guide:

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on the history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction where they are

guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves it at the end of the tour; they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader:

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides at each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village and offer information on the place visited on the bus. However, they are not required to have specific art, architecture, or historical knowledge. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and, if caught doing so, can be fined.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

United Kingdom & Ireland

Both May and June are very pleasant times to visit the UK and Ireland when the weather is mild and the flowers are blooming. At this time of year, the average temperature is 16°C, which is considerably warmer than the previous months.

July and August are when the summer season is coming to a close. During these months, the average temperature is 18°C. As August progresses, the daily temperatures slowly decrease as summer blends into autumn.

The weather starts to cool down in September and October when the autumn season is setting in. During this time of year, the average temperature is 10°C.

Visas

United Kingdom

The UK Government has announced the next phase in the rollout of Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs). As of 8th January 2025, all Australian and New Zealand passport holders will require an ETA to enter the UK. An ETA gives visitors permission to travel to the UK. Visitors who do not currently need a visa may need to apply for an electronic travel authorisation (ETA) to travel to the UK, please refer to the UK Government website for further information.

Ireland

A tourist visa of up to 90 days will be issued on arrival when travelling on an Australian passport.

Important:

- *Please start arranging your visa three weeks before departure to account for any delays due to consulate operating hours.*
- *Visa rules are subject to change. Please check with the nearest embassy, consulate or immigration department of the destination/s you are visiting once you receive your travel documentation to ensure you have the most up to date information.*
- *It is your responsibility to be travel-ready and ensure that you are aware and comply with any destination or travel requirements, including the validity of all required travel documents.*
- *Passengers who are not Australian citizens must also check with the respective consulate or visa agency to determine what their visa requirements are and what personal identification is required.*
- *It is also important to note that some areas of employment, such as journalism, government authorities and charity organisations, may have additional restrictions in applying for visas. This may, in turn, affect the type of application required.*
